GAME DAY VS SMU

USF returns to Raymond James Stadium after its first bye week of the season to face SMU, one of 23 unbeaten teams in FBS and coming off a 41-38 victory at No. 25 TCU. Charlie Strong recruited and coached SMU QB Shane Buechele at Texas prior to both leaving. The Bulls are 4-0 under Strong following a bye week. USF had just one bye week last season, defeating UMass (58-42) following it, after three in Strong's first year. The Bulls have won 21 of their last 27 home games. Strong is 16-8 overall in American Conference competition.

- CONFERENCE OPENER: USF has won its first two conference openers under Strong, both at home, and is 5-1 all-time in American conference openers and 10-6 overall. The Bulls have won three straight conference openers, last falling at home vs. Memphis (24-17) in 2015.
- SET THE EXPECTATION: Coach Strong welcomed Brenda Tracy during fall camp to deliver a powerful address to the team on surviving sexual violence and its devastating impacts on society. Following the presentation the team set Sept. 28 as the team's "Set the Expectation" game to help bring awareness and lead the way in preventing sexual violence and will wear special helmet decals signify their commitment and Tracy will help conduct the coin toss.
- NATIONAL DEFENSIVE LEADERS: Following a USF record setting eight takeaways vs. SC State, the Bulls rank No. 1 nationally with 11 turnovers forced, No. 1 in fumbles recovered (7) and No. 2 in turnover margin (2.00).
- FORD FUSION: Tabbed as "our man beater" by OC Kerwin Bell, Johnny Ford's transition from running back to wide receiver has hit full fusion as he leads the Bulls in receiving despite playing in just two of USF's three games. He exploded for a pair of touchdowns vs. SC State, including a 42-yard touchdown reception and a 32-yard touchdown run, and posted his first career 100-yard receiving game (4 catches, 100 yards, 1 TD).

THE PROGRAM

In its 23rd season and 20th at the FBS level, USF Football has made 10 bowl appearances, including a current string of four straight and every season between 2005-10 (6 straight). USF has won six bowl games and has produced 14 All-America selections, 30 NFL Draft picks and reached the No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press Poll in 2007.

LAST TIME OUT

FRESHMAN MCLOUD LEADS BULLS WITH 5 TD IN FIRST START

USF ended an eight-game losing streak as redshirt freshman Jordan McCloud (a Tampa native) made his first career start under center and accounted for five touchdowns (3 passing, 2 rushing) while leading USF to a 55-16 victory over South Carolina State in Raymond James Stadium.

- The Bulls' D did its part, posting a program record eight takeaways, including a record five fumble recoveries. Eight different players captured a turnover on the day.
- McCloud's five TD accounted for marked the second-most in a freshmen debut in program history. QB Marquel Blackwell accounted for six touchdowns (three rushing, three passing) against Southern Utah in 2001. McCloud accounted for 273 yards, 217 passing.
- The Bulls' 39-point margin of victory (55-16) is their largest since a 41-point win (44-3) at UCF in 2015.
- Senior Mitchell Wilcox set the new USF tight end career touchdown receptions record (8) after a 20-yard scoring catch in the second guarter and a 10-yarder in the third.
- WR/RB Johnny Ford posted a pair of touchdowns (42-yard scoring reception & 32-yard rushing touchdown. He had a career long 52-yard reception and finished with four catches for 100 yards in his first career 100-yard receiving game.

USF NUMBERS TO KNOW

46,704 - Home crowd for USF's season opener vs. Wisconsin, including 9,000 USF students, was near a lower bowl sellout (48,007) in Raymond James Stadium.

9,264 — Distance that **Trent Schneider**, a 29-year-old, left-footed punter from Sydney, Australia, is from home. He set a USF game record averaging 51.6 ypp on seven punts at Georgia Tech & ranks -- th nationally (-- ypp).

1,121 — Rushing yards for SR RB **Jordan Cronkrite**, in 2018, the 9th 1,000-yard season in program history. His five staight 100-yard games to equaled the USF record.

523.9/52.0 — OC **Kerwin Bell** led Valdosta State to the Div. II national title in 2018 as his offense averaged 523.9 ypg and 52.0 ppg.

411 – SR QB Blake Barnett passed for 411 yards vs. Illinois in 2018, the second-best total in USF history.

302 — USF and American Conference record rushing yards posted by SR RB **Jordan Cronkrite** in 2018 at UMass.

273 & 5 — FR QB **Jordan McCloud** totaled 273 yards and 5 TD (3 passing & 2 rushing) in his debut start vs. SC State on Sept. 14. He became the 17th starting QB in program history and the 10th to win their debut.

150 – In 2018, USF became the fastest collegiate program in state of Florida history to reach 150 wins.

100 – SO WR **Johnny Ford** posted his first career 100-yard receiving game (4 rec./100 yards) vs. SC State.

100 — SO WR Randall St. Felix posted four 100-yard receiving games in 2018, including a USF bowl record 165 yards & two TD in the Gasparilla Bowl.

98 & 97 - KR Terrence Horne tied an NCAA record in 2018 with two kickoff returns for TDs (98 & 97 yds) vs. Georgia Tech. His 264 kickoff return yards in the game set a USF record. He missed the bulk of the 2018 season after tearing his ACL in practice prior to the ECU game.

89 — SR DE **Greg Reaves** posted a career-best 89 tackles in 2018 as he played the last seven games of the year at linebacker, including posting a career-best 14 tackles in the Gasparilla Bowl.

83.3 — Walk-on JR kicker **Coby Weiss** made 15 of 18 field goals (83.3 %) in 2018 and to ranked 4th in the AAC and 19th nationally. He is 12-of-12 under 30 yards on his

15 - Number of tackles recorded by LB **Patrick Macon** in his USF debut, the most for a Bull since 2013. He leads USF with 7.0 per game, which ranks --- in the conference.

10.0 — Number of tackles for loss recorded by SR DE **Kirk Livingstone** in 2018 to lead USF. He has 22.5 TFL and eight sacks on his career.

15-1 — USF is 15-1 under Charlie Strong when rushing for 200 yards in a game, falling for the first time at Houston, and 15-1 when outrushing an opponent under Strong.

12/9 — USF has 12 players on the roster that transferred from Power 5 schools, nine are in the depth chart.

8 — USF grabbed a program record 8 takeaways vs. SC State to jump into the national lead with 11 on the year. USF collected 21 turnovers in 2018.

5 — USF returns all five starters on the offensive line from the 2018 Gasparilla Bowl. Seniors **Marcus Norman** (RT) and **William Atterbury** (RG) have combined to start 59 games.

OPPONENT PREVIEW: SMU, USF LEADS SERIES 3-1

In its second season under head coach Sonny Dykes, SMU remained one of 23 unbeaten teams in FBS football, improving to 4-0 with a 41-38 victory at No. 25 TCU, posting its best start since 1984. QB Shane Buechele went 23-of-34 passing for 288 yards and two TD while running for another score while Xavier Jones ran for 79 yards and a TD.

- SMU ranks 17th nationally in total offense (514 ypg) and 16th in scoring (43.5 ppg). They run for 216.8 ypg and pass for 297.3 ypg. The SMU defense ranks 80th giving up 28.0 ppg and 65th giving up 369.0 ypg.
- Shane Buechele leads the AAC in passing and is 16th nationally with 1,159 yards through the air.
- WR Reggie Roberson ranks 7th nationally with 116.0 receiving yards per game while RB Xavier Jones is second nationally with 8 rushing TD and is posting 92.5 rushing yards per game.
- LB Patrick Nelson ranks fourth nationally with 1.38 sacks per game and SMU stands 9th in FBS posting 3.75 sacks per game while allowing just 1.00 to rank 16th. They are also 19th in turnovers gained with 8.
- SR LB Johnell Brown led SC State with 7 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble vs. Lane.

FRESHMAN MCCLOUD IMPRESSIVE IN STARTING QB DEBUT

A redshirt freshman and Tampa native, Jordan McCloud became the 17th starting quarterback in program history, third from local Hillsborough County, and the 10th to win in their debut, first from Hillsborough, when he led the Bulls to a 55-16 victory over SC State on Sept. 14. The 39-point win was USF's largest since a 44-3 victory at UCF in 2015 and the fourth largest margin of victory in a first career start, largest since Brian Fisher led the Bulls to a 55-7 victory over Charleston Southern in 2003.

- McCloud accounted for five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in the second-best scoring debut by a USF freshman. QB Marquel Blackwell accounted for six touchdowns (three rushing, three passing) against Southern Utah in 2001.
- McCloud accounted for 273 yards (217 passing) and accounted for 5 TD, the most by a USF QB in a debut (bettering Blake Barnett's four). The Bulls did not turn the ball over.
- McCloud is completing 65.7% of his passes and has 4 TD vs 0 INT on the year. He leads USF with 85 yards rushing and two TD on the ground.
- McCloud gained a reputation as "unflappable" during a high school career that saw him play running back and defensive back before moving to quarterback as a junior. He started his senior year and led Plant HS to a 12-2 record and the state semifinals
- At Georgia Tech, McCloud took the field with 1:16 left in the third quarter and on his third play from scrimmage hit Johnny Ford with a 20-yard TD pass to cut the Tech lead to 14-10. On his very next pass on the Bulls' next possession, McCloud hit Mitch Wilcox for a 54-yard gain to the Tech 1-yard line. He finished 4-of-5 for 90 yards and a touchdown while running for 12 yards.

FORD FUSION

Sophomore Johnny Ford has proved explosive in his transition from running back to wide receiver and enters the SMU game as USF's leading receiver with 8 catches for 123 yards and 2 touchdowns.

- Ford has touchdown catches in back-to-back games after his 42-yard scoring reception vs. SMU
- Ford had a career long 52-yard reception vs. SC State and posted his first career 100-yard reciving game (4, 100 yds)
- Ford leads USF in scoring with 3 TD on the year, including a 32-yard rushing touchdown vs. SC State and a 20-yard TD catch at Georgia Tech.
- His four explosive plays over 20 yards (1 rush, 3 receiving) are second only to Jordan McCloud's seven (6 pass, 1 rush).

TAPPING TRANSFER TALENT

USF has had a history of transfers finding success in Tampa. Currently 12 players on the roster entering 2019 transferred to the Bulls from Power 5 schools. Nine of those players are currently in the two deep (5 on Offense, 4 on defense), with the potential for two more could join them soon, and are expected to be significant contributors on the field.








2019 SEASON STORY LINES

- Coaching Staff Changes: Head coach Charlie Strong welcomed five new coaches in the offseason, highlighted by offensive coordinator Kerwin Bell. Offensive line coach Jeremy Darveau also joined the offense and USF added three new defensive coaches: defensive backs coach Steve Ellis, safeties coach Bryan Hill and defensive line coach Paul Spicer.
- OC Bell Set to Score Fast: After leading Valdosta State to a Division II National Championship with the nation's top scoring offense (52.0 ppg), new offensive coordinator Kerwin Bell takes the reins of the USF offense and will begin developing the Bulls scheme this spring with the mantra "play fast, score faster."
- 16 Starters/Senior Leaders Return: USF returns 16 starters, including five seniors on offense and senior leaders Greg Reaves, Kirk Livingstone and Nico Sawtelle on defense.
- Nine Starters Return on Offense: New OC Kerwin Bell will enjoy nine returning starters on offense, including the Bulls' quarterback, top rusher, top receiver, all-conference tight end and four offensive linemen with seven or more starts in 2018.
- **Dynamic Runners:** The Bulls return their top three rushers from 2018, led by dynamic backs Jordan Cronkrite (1,121 yds & 9 TD) and Johnny Ford (787 yds & 8 TD) that ranked fifth (6.09) and third (6.84) in yards per carry in The American.
- Wilcox & Cronkrite Spurn NFL: First team all-conference tight end Mitchell Wilcox and 1,000-yard rusher Jordan Cronkrite elected to forego early entry in the NFL Draft to return for their senior campaigns. Wilcox posted a USF tight end record season with 43 receptions for 540 yards, while Cronkrite logged the sixth-best rushing season in program history.
- Familiar O-Line Provides Foundation: The Bulls' five starters on the offensive line for the Gasparilla Bowl all return in 2018. They all started at least 4 games in 2018.
- D-Line Matures: Young Bulls got a lot of experience on the D-line last year. Now, seniors Greg Reaves and Kirk Livingstone lead a group of four players that have played in 22 or more games and six that have played in eight or more.
- Special Teams Solid: USF returns its kicker (Coby Weiss, 15-18 FG), punter (Trent Schneider, 42.9 ypp), leading kick returner (Bentlee Sanders, 26.8 ypr) and expects the return of dynamic returner Terrence Horne (2 TD returns vs. G-Tech).

POWER SIX

After wins over Georgia Tech and Illinois in 2018, USF has won seven of its last 10 meetings vs. Power Five opponents, including a pair of bowl victories. USF's lone losses in its last nine P5 contests came to No. 13 Florida State (55-35) in 2016 and vs. No. 17 Wisconsin (49-0) in Tampa and at Georgia Tech (14-10) in 2019.

ROLLING AT RAY JAY

■ USF has won 21 of its last 27 home games, with 16 wins coming by two touchdowns or more and an average winning margin of 16.7 ppg.

POLL WATCHING

■ USF returned to the Top 20 in the polls for the 32nd week in program history in Week 9 of the 2018 season. It marked the sixth season USF has reached the Top 20 and the third straight in the Top 25.

TOP USF HEAD COACH STARTS:

Entering his third season at the helm, head coach Charlie Strong had posted the best two-year start by a head coach in program history, including going 10-2 with a Birmingham Bowl victory over Texas Tech in his first campaign.

150 YEARS OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL; BULLS FASTEST TO 150 WINS IN FLORIDA

College football is celebrating its 150th anniversary in 2019. The first game was played on Nov. 6, 1869 as Rutgers beat Princeton, 6-4, in New Brunswick, N.J. USF is playing its 20th season of FBS football and 23rd season overall.

- In 2007, USF became the fastest program in the modern AP Poll Era to go from inception to a Top 10 national ranking as the Bulls were ranked No. 6 in the Week 5 AP Poll in just the program's 11th season. The Bulls would climb all the way to the No. 2 ranking two weeks late in Week 7 to become the fastest to reach a Top 5 ranking.
- The Bull have reached a Top 25 ranking in seven seasons, including the last three straight, and have been ranked a total of 49 weeks, including 12 in the top 15.
- USF has played in a bowl game in four straight seasons and in 10 of the last 14. The Bulls have won eight or more games in 10 FBS seasons and eclipsed nine wins five times.
- With a victory over ECU last season, the Bulls became the fastest collegiate program in state of Florida history to reach 150 wins.

DEFENSE SHOWS BIG IMPROVEMENT; AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS

In it's third season under the direction of assistant head coach/defensive coordinator Brian Jean-Mary and with three new position coaches (Steve Ellis, defensive backs; Bryan Hill, safeties and Paul Spicer, defensive line) and coaching position switch (Sean Cronin to outside linebackers), the USF defense has shown improvement in yards allowed, scoring and takeaways and the potential for a very strong season through two games.

- After a program record eight takeaways vs. SC State, USF ranks No. 1 nationally with 11 turnovers gained through three games. The Bulls ranked 44th with 21 during the 2018 season. Nine players have a takaaway on the year, led by CB KJ Sails (3) with one in every game.
- After posting 11 TFL vs. Wisconsin and 13 at Georgia Tech, USF stands second nationally, averaging 11.0 TFL per game. USF ranked 33rd last year with 6.8 per game.
- 16 Bulls have posted a TFL on the year, including 26.5 of USF's 33 from the defensive line and linebackers.
- The Bulls rank 55th giving up 356.7 ypg after standing 104th giving up 446.6 last year, that includes an improvement in rushing defense to rank 83rd (170 ypg) up from 122nd (247.5 ypg) in 2018, despite facing the nation's 9th ranked rusher in Jonathan Taylor. The Bulls gave up 135 yards to Taylor, who ran for 203 vs. Michigan.
- The Bulls gave up just 257 yards to Georgia Tech, an improvement of 345 yards over the 602 the Yellow Jackets gained in Tampa last season. The Bulls D shut out Tech in the second half while limiting them to 116 yards. Tech scored 14 points and posted 294 total yards vs. defending national champion Clemson on the road in Week 1.
- USF gave up 433 yards to No. 17 Wisconsin in game 1. The Badgers, picked by many as a contender for a Big Ten title and the College Football Playoff, put up 599 yards the following week vs Central Michigan and 487 vs. No. 11 Michigan.

WIND IN HIS SAILS

North Carolina transfer cornerback KJ Sails was granted immediate eligibility to play by the NCAA just days prior to the start of the 2019 season. His infectious spirit and excellent play has made an immediate impact.

- Sails has collected a turnover in each of the Bulls first three games and owns an interception and two fumble recoveries on the year.
- Sails ranks 23rd nationally in passes defended (1.3) and leads USF with 3 pass breakups while establishing himself as a lockdown corner that has been targeted infrequently.
- Sails, a Tampa native that attended East Bay HS, moved back to the Bay area to be closer to his 2-year old son, King, following the sudden deaths of his grandmother (who played a large role in raising him) and sister, Takiya Fullwood, just days apart. Takiya was also the sister of former Bulls' standout safety Tajee Fullwood. An 18-year old biology student at FAU with plans to go on to dental school, Takiya was shot and killed at a Tampa house party in February of 2019.
- Sails has said he is cherishing everyday and his goal is to play with a spirit that represents his grandmother and sister. He has been a very vocal, energetic and positive presence on the Bulls roster since his arrival.

MACON NOISE!

Graduate transfer linebacker Patrick Macon (6-3, 245) added terrific size and athleticism to what was a thin unit for the Bulls in 2018. He had a stellar debut at USF.

- Macon currently ranks 16th nationally in tackles for loss (1.7 tpg) and 6th in The American in tackles (7.0 tpg).
- Playing in his first game in two seasons and first-ever FBS game, Macon led USF with 15 tackles (10 solo), 4 TFL, 1 FF and one sack vs. Wisconsin (8/30). Macon started at MLB and recorded the most tackles for a Bull in seven seasons (18, DeDe Lattimore, vs. Rutgers, 2013) and most TFL since 2017 (4, Deadrin Senat vs. Houston, 2017).

- At Georgia Tech he posted five stops, a TFL and tipped a pass that was intercepted on the Tech 25 to set up a touchdown.
- Macon was the 2016 NJCAA Defensive Player of the Year after posting 122 tackles, 27.5 TFL, 9 sacks, nine forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and interception and seven pass breakups in leading Fort Scott CC to an 11-1 record and appearance in the NJCAA title game.

LINE SHIFT

USF returned all five starters on the offensive line from the Gasparilla Bowl, but during fall camp adjusted that lineup by switching senior William Atterbury from right guard to left tackle and sophomore Donovan Jennings from left tackle to right guard.

- Following offensive struggles in the first two games, coaches switched the Atterbury and Jennings back to "their more natural positions." With Atterbury back at right guard and Jennings at left tackle, the Bulls put up 55 points and 459 yards vs. SC State.
- Atterbury has now logged 26 straight starts, 24 of those at right guard next to right tackle Marcus Norman, who has logged 37 straight starts. The pair are the best of friends off the field and the senior leaders combine to bring 67 starts of experience to an offensive line completed by sophomores Jennings (LT), Brad Cecil (C) and Demetris Harris (G).

DEFENSE LOGS 11 TFL VS WISCONSIN; TRANSFERS SHINE

Despite a lopsided score vs. the Badgers, a bigger and stronger USF defense did post some positives

- The Bulls logged 11 tackles for loss and three sacks vs. the Badgers, with seven players getting in on the action. Linebacker Patrick Macon led USF with 4.0 TFL while fellow seniors Greg Reaves and Kirk Livingstone posted two each
- Transfers made an instant impact on the defense with four appearing in the starting lineup and six posting tackles, led by Macon's 15 and safety Devin Studstill's five. Macon (MLB), Studstill (S), KJ Sails (CB) and Darius Slade (DE) all started the game. Macon forced a fumble that was recovered by Sails for the Bulls' lone turnover.
- Transfers combined for 28 tackles, 5.5 TFL, 1 sack, 1 FF & 1 FR vs. Wisconsin.

46.704 TURNOUT FOR 2019 OPENER

USF had an electric crowd of 46,704 for its 2019 season opener vs. No. 17 Wisconsin, which included 10,001 tickets distributed to USF students. The crowd nearly reached a lower bowl sellout of 48,007.

HOMEGROWN TALENT

USF's recruiting has focused on Florida and the Bay Area and its seven surrounding counties.

- 91 of the 107 players on USF roster heading into the 2019 season hail from the state of Florida. That represents 88 percent of the roster with Georgia (6 players) being the next closest state in producing current Bulls.
- The 2019 Bulls' roster features 29 players from the Bay Area, representing 27 percent of the roster. The Miami/Ft. Lauderdale area is next closest with 19 Bulls hailing from the area.
- Among the Bay Area standouts on the Bulls' roster are 15 players in the depth chart, including Mackey Award candidate Mitchell Wilcox, left tackle William Atterbury, right guard Donovan Jennings, cornerback Mike Hampton, defensive end Greg Reaves, safeties Mekhi LaPointe and Bentlee Sanders, defensive tackles Kelvin Pinkney and Blake Green and cornerback KJ Sails.

USF MOVING TOWARD 160,000-SQUARE FOOT USF FOOTBALL CENTEROn Nov. 9, 2017, USF unveiled plans for a 160,000-square foot USF Football Center to be located on campus adjacent to the Lee Roy Selmon Athletics Center. The USF Football Center, which will be a donor-driven project and will expand upon the Morsani Football Practice Complex and feature an 83,000-square foot indoor practice facility housing a 100-yard turf field. The Center will also feature a more than 80,000-square foot, two-level building providing a state-of-the-art home for the entire football program.

USF received a \$5 million gift toward the facility from Pam & Les Muma on Nov. 11, 2017 and has more than \$20 million in commitments toward the facility to date.

Among the highlights in the initial plans by the global design firm HOK:

- A stunning entry lobby and multi-purpose space for recruiting
- Indoor practice facility with a 100-yard turf field
 More than 12,000-square foot football strength and conditioning center
 Nearly 10,000-square foot football locker room
 Players' lounge and adjacent social patio
 Team auditorium with tiered seating

- · Sports medicine and rehabilitation facility
- More than 12,000 square feet of team and position meeting spaces
- · Coaches and staff offices



BULLS WILL PLAY ANYONE

USF has built a strong nonconference schedule and an opportunity to put its talent on display in the coming years as head coach Charlie Strong is willing to play anyone who will schedule the Bulls.

- USF's 17 scheduled nonconference games vs. Power 6 opponents over the next 10 seasons, 14 of those added since January 2018, are tied for the most among American Athletic Conference teams.
- Six of those opponents can claim a national championship, including 17 for Alabama, and the Bulls will be facing programs during that span that claim a total of 34 national championships.
- Alabama is the Bulls' sixth future nonconference opponent in the next 10 seasons to rank among the top 25 all-time in Associated Press Top 25 Poll appearances.
- USF has added non-conference series vs. Alabama (2023, 2024, 2026) Florida (2021, 2022, 2025), Miami (2025, 2027, 2028), (Louisville (2022, 2024, 2026), and NC State (2021, 2024) under Strong.
- Future nonconference opponents through 2027 also include Texas (2020) Wisconsin (2019), BYU (2019 & 2021) and Boise State (2025, 2027).
- The Bulls defeated Georgia Tech (49-38) in Tampa and Illinois (25-19) in Chicago in 2018. Illinois marked USF's fourth Big Ten road game in the last six seasons.
- USF REGULAR SEASON OPPONENTS SINCE 2013: Florida State (2X), Michigan State, Miami, Fla., Maryland (2X), NC State, Syracuse (2X), Georgia Tech, Illinois (2X).

STRONG ADDS FIVE NEW COACHES

Entering the 2019, head coach Charlie Strong has added five new coaches to the Bulls' staff, headlined by the addition of new offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Kerwin Bell.

- The Bulls added two new coaches on the offensive side of the ball. Offensive coordinator Kerwin Bell brought with him offensive line coach Jeremy Darveau from Valdosta State, where they won the Division II National Championship with the nation's top scoring offense (52.0 ppg) in 2018. The pair worked together for three seasons at Valdosta before coming to USF. Darveau is the sixth offensive line coach in the last seven seasons for the Bulls. Bell also brought along his son, Kade, and Andrew Robustelli from the Valdosta staff. They will serve as offensive analysts at USF.
- On the defensive side of the ball, defensive coordinator Brian Jean-Mary leads the unit for the third season. He is joined by new coaches Paul Spicer (defensive line, previously with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers), Steve Ellis (defensive backs, previously at Middle Tennesse State) and Bryan Hill (safeties, previously a USF analyst).

BULLS BEEF UP

Charlie Strong made it an emphasis at the end of the 2018 season, the Bulls had to get bigger and stronger, particularly along the lines.

TOP RETURNERS FOR 2019 SEASON:

USF will look to build around the following significant returners from the 2018 team.

- Senior quarterback **Blake Barnett** started 10 games and played in 11 in 2018, passing for 2,710 yards (5th on season charts) and completing 61.1% with 12 touchdowns while running for 8 TD.
- Senior tight end Mitchell Wilcox, a first team allconference selection, returns after strong consideration of entering the NFL Draft. He set USF season TE records with 43 receptions for 540 yards in 2018.
- Senior running back **Jordan Cronkrite** ran for 1,121 yards and 9 TD in 2018, while sophomore running back **Johnny Ford** posted 787 yards and 8 TD.

- All five starters on the offensive line from the 2018 Gasparilla Bowl. Right tackle Marcus Norman was a second team all-conference selection in 2017 and has started 34 straight games. Right guard Billy Atterbury has made 23 straight starts.
- Sophomore wide receiver Randall St. Felix led USF with 679 yards and 4 TD in 2018, averaging 20.6 ypc, which ranked ninth nationally.

DEFENSE:

- Senior defensive end **Greg Reaves** posted a careerbest 89 tackles in 2018 while playing the last 7 games at linebacker. He will move back to defensive end, where he led USF with 14.0 TFL in 2017.
- Senior defensive end **Kirk Livingstone** led USF with 10.0 TFL in 2018 and added 56 tackles. He has played in 38 career games and has 21.0 TFL and 8 sacks on
- Junior cornerback **Mike Hampton** posted 18 passes defended (9th nationally (1.4 pdg) while earning honorable mention all-conference honors.
- Senior linebacker **Nico Sawtelle** started 18 straight games and was leading USF with 7.5 TFL and second with 42 tackles before missing the last seven games of 2018 with a neck/shoulder injury. He brings 112 tackles and 12.0 TFL into 2019.
- Sophomore safety **Nick Roberts** led USF with three interceptions and was fourth with 72 tackles in 2018.

■ Wide receiver **Tyre McCants** led USF with 59 receptions and posted 622 yards and 3 TD in 2018. He posted 127 catches, 1,856 yards and 16 TD on his career, all among the top four on USF career charts.

DEFENSE:

- Linebacker Khalid McGee led USF with 111 tackles and added 6.5 TFL in his first season as a starter at linebacker in 2018
- Cornerback **Ronnie Hoggins** was third on the team with 82 tackles and added two interceptions in 2018. He started 41 career games and logged 214 tackles and 8 interceptions. Safety Jaymon Thomas (51 tackles) and cornerback Mazzi Wilkins (48 tackles, 9 pbu) also formed a veteran backbone of the secondary.
- Defensive end **Josh Black** led USF with 5 sacks

and tied for the team lead with 10.0 TFL in his first season as a starter in 2018

2018 TEAM LEANED ON FRESHMEN & FIRST-YEAR STARTERS

- The Bulls' top four rushers were all first-year players for USF, two were freshmen and the other two were transfers.
- First-year starters led the team in rushing, passing, total offense, scoring, all-purpose yards, kick returns punting, field goals, interceptions, tackles for loss, sacks, forced fumbles, fumble recoveries and pass break-ups.
- RS freshman Randall St. Felix led the team in receiving yards; RS freshman Nick Roberts led the team in interceptions; true freshman Johnny Ford was second in rushing; RS freshman Demetris Harris joined true freshmen Brad Cecil and Donovan Jennings on the starting offensive line.
- USF's starting lineup in the second half of the season featured the following:

2018 IMPACT FRESHMEN BRING EXPERIENCE INTO SOPHOMORE SEASON

The Bulls' have recruited strong under Charlie Strong and young talent shined in 2018 with several true and redshirt freshmen figuring into prominent roles.

- Freshman **Johnny Ford** was the Bulls' second leading rusher with 787 yards and 8 TD. He ran for 164 yards and 3 TD vs. UConn, 106 yards and 2 TD at Houston and 77 yards and 2 TD at UMass. His 6.8 ypc led the team.
- Redshirt freshman WR **Randall St. Felix** led the team with 679 receiving yards, **the best freshman season in program history**. He posted **four 100-yard receiving games**, including the best debut by a wide receiver in program history seven receptions for 143 yards and a touchdown vs. Elon.
- Redshirt freshman S **Nick Roberts** was fourth on the team with 72 tackles and led the team with three interceptions.
- Freshman LB **Dwayne Boyles** made his second start at WLB vs. Tulane and led the team with 10 tackles.
- Redshirt freshman S **Mekhi LaPointe** started four games. He led USF with 11 tackles vs. UConn, 9 tackles and 2.0 TFL at Tulsa and had an INT at Houston.
- Freshman **Tyrone Barber** made his first career start vs. ECU and had two sacks on the year.
- Freshman **Donovan Jennings** made his first career start at left tackle at UMass and helped lead USF to 365 yards rushing. He started four games at left tackle.
- Freshman **Brad Cecil** made his first career start at center vs.

A PREEMINENT UNIVERSITY

USF was designated a "Preeminent State Research University" by the Florida board of governors in 2018, placing it in elite company with the University of Florida and Florida State University as the only three state universities to earn the designation.

- The USF System's total enrollment surpassed 50,000 students for the first time in the fall of 2017, now with 50,577 students currently enrolled across the three separately accredited institutions: USF Tampa, USF St. Petersburg and USF Sarasota-Manatee. Serving 43,542 undergraduate and graduate students USF Tampa has seen a rise in the average high school GPA of the 2017-18 first time in college (FTIC) class, from 4.08 to 4.12 this year.
- INNOVATIVE: USF is the nation's fifth leading public university in generating new United States utility patents and ranks 12th among universities worldwide.
- USF is home to students from all 67 Florida counties, all 50 states and more than 145 countries, the USF System continues to admit a very diverse student body.

- The Bulls have had four head coaches in 23 seasons.
- USF was ranked for a program record 20 straight weeks during the 2016 & 2017 seasons.
- The Bulls reached as highly as the No. 2 ranking in 2007.
- USF has played in 10 bowl games and won six.
- USF has claimed victories in Tampa over Louisville, West Virginia, Georgia Tech, Pittsburgh, Kansas and North Carolina among others.
- USF has claimed road or nuetral site wins over Florida State, Auburn, Clemson, Notre Dame, Miami, Louisville, NC State, West Virginia and TCU among others.
- USF has had 30 first-team All-Conference selections, including 1 Offensive Player of the Year, 1 Defensive Player of the Year, 2 Special Teams Players of the Year and 1 Rookie of the Year.
- USF has had five players selected a first-team All-American a total of six times.
- 11 USF players have been part of a Super Bowl team, eight part of the winning team.

- Redshirt freshman OG **Demetris Harris** started all but two games at guard.
- Redshirt freshman S Bentlee Sanders posted 10 tackles and 0.5 TFL in his first career start vs. Elon. He led USF with 455 kickoff return yards (26.8 ypr), had a 62-yarder at Cincinnati and 182 all-purpose yards at Houston.
- Freshman Vincent Davis forced two fumbles on kickoffs at UMass and returned one 12 yards for a touchdown. He started three games at nickel.
- Freshman WR Terrence Horne scored three touchdowns in the win vs. Georgia Tech. tving an NCAA record with two kickoff returns for TDs (98 & 97 yards) and had a three-yard TD catch. He was named the American Conference Special Teams Player of the Week after his 3 TD day and USF and conference record 264 kickoff return vards vs. Georgia Tech.

COMEBACK KINGS

With three cardiac-inducing wins in 2018 the Bulls gained valuable experience winning in pressure situations.

- USF mounted THREE double-digit 4th quarter comebacks in 2018 to post victories over Georgia Tech (-10) and at Illinois (-12) and at Tulsa (-14).
- USF trailed Georgia Tech by 10 (38-28) 45 seconds into the 4th quarter before scoring 21 unanswered points in a 49-38 win.
- USF trailed Illinois by 12 (19-7) entering the 4th guarter before scoring 18 unanswered points in a 25-19 win.
- USF trailed Tulsa by 14 (24-10) before scoring 15 unanswered 4th quarter points and holding Tulsa to 4 yards on nine snaps in the quarter to post a 25-24 win, USF's largest 4th guarter comeback since trailing at Nevada by 15 in 2012 before posting a 32-31 win.
- USF scored 15 points in the final 7:10 vs. Tulsa, including getting the ball with 1:03 to play and no timeouts down 24-22 and moving 52 yards for Coby Weiss' 22-yard, gamewinning field goal with :02 to play.
- QB Blake Barnett was huge in all three comebacks, accounting for 112 total yards (52 rushing) and three TD in the 4th quarter vs. Tech; posting 172 yards passing and 2 TD in the comeback vs. Illinois; and running for two TD's and passing for 117 yards in the 4th quarter at Tulsa while leading drives of 82, 80 and 52 yards.
- In the three comebacks, the Bulls D yielded a total of just 7 points in the 4th quarter while the Bulls hold a 54-7 scoring advantage. The defense has forced six punts, collected two turnovers and yielded an average of 74 yards in the fourth quarter of the three comebacks.

OFFENSE NOTES

WILCOX GOING WILD ON USF TE RECORDS

A three-time Mackey Award candidate, senior tight end Mitchell Wilcox delivered a career year in 2018 as he put together a first team all-conference season. He got evaluated by NFL teams following the season and made the choice to return to school for his final campaign.

- He is just the 14th career 1,000-yard receiver in USF history and is on pace to finish among the top seven in career vardage and receptions all-time at USF.
- He needs 22 catches to be the 11th to post 100 career receptions in USF history. With 229 yards and 26 receptions he would move among the top 10 in receiving yards and receptions in USF history.
- He has set the USF tight end career records recods with 1,077 yards, 78 receptions (setting the receptions mark with a 54-yard catch at Georgia Tech on Sept. 7) and 8 TD.
- Wilcox posted **USF tight end season records** of 43 receptions (2nd on the team) for 540 yards (3rd on team), more than doubling his 17 catches for 185 yards all of 2017.

- Posted a USF tight end game record with eight receptions for a personal-best 109 yards at Illinois.
- He led all AAC tight ends with 540 receiving yards to set a USF TE record, despite missing two entire games and a half of play in two others due to injury in 2018.

BARNETT RETURNS UNDER SIXTH OFFEN-SIVE COORDINATOR

Senior quarterbak Blake Barnett returns for his senior campaign after posting 2,710 passing yards in 2018 and ranking 27th nationally passing for 245.9 ypg.

- Barnett entered 2019 at 225 pounds, up 10 pounds from his opening weight in 2018 and nearly 20 from his final playing weight at the end of 2018. He added a personal nutrionist in the offseason and did work in the weight room, raising his bench press to 275, up 30 pounds on his max.
- Barnett has been thriving under new offensive coordinator Kerwin Bell during spring and fall practice. Bell represents the sixth offensive coordinator Barnett has played for in college.

- Barnett was on pace to set a USF passing record and post the first 3,000-yard passing season in program history, but missed two of the final four games with injuries. The season passing mark is currently held by Quinton Flowers (2017) and Matt Grothe (2008) at 2,911 yards.
- Barnett posted three 300-yard passing games in 2018. one shy of the USF season record of four set by Quinton Flowers in 2017 and the third-most in The American this
- Barnett has passed for 200-plus yards in 9-of-11 games he played in in 2018, just shy of the USF record for 200-yard passing games set by Marquel Blackwell with 10 in 2001.
- Barnett led three double-digit 4th guarter comebacks in 2018 for the Bulls in victories over Georgia Tech (-10), at Illinois (-12) and at Tulsa (-14).
- Barnett passed for 411 yards vs. Illinois, the second-best total in USF history.
- Barnett is the 15th starting QB in program history.
- Barnett joined the Bulls in the summer of 2018 and won the QB the competition in fall camp.
- A consensus five-star prospect and MVP of the 2014 Elite 11 Quarterback Competition, he had seen action in seven collegiate games prior to USF, completing 14-of-24 passes for 259 yards at previous stops at Alabama and ASU.

CRONKRITE RETURNS AFTER 1,000-YARD SEASON

Senior Jordan Cronkrite returns after posting 1,121 yards in his first season on the field for the Bulls, a mark that ranks as the sixth-best total in program history.

- Jordan Cronkrite posted FIVE 100-yard rushing games in 2018. Cronkrite's 302 yards at UMass were the most by a player in The American and the second-best total nationally on the year as he set a new USF and AAC game record.
- He posted five-straight 100-yard rushing games to equal the longest streak in USF history also accomplished by Quinton Flowers (2016) and Marlon Mack (2015). Mack owns the season record for 100-yard games with nine.
- Cronkrite owns four of the 15 longest TD runs in USF history. His 80-yard, game-winning TD run vs. ECU is tied for the fourth-longest. His 77-yard TD at UMass ranks ninth and his 76-yarder at UMass is 10th.
- His four TD runs of 60-plus yards in 2018 were a USF record, eclipsing Marlon Mack's three in 2014.
- Cronkrite accounted for six plays of 46 yards or longer, including three of 70-plus yards and an 80-yard TD run. He had eight plays of 30-plus yards on the year.

DEFENSE NOTES

REAVES RETURNS TO DE, EARNED SCHOLARSHIP IN 2017

Senior defensive end Greg Reaves, a Bay Area native from Manatee HS in Bradenton, walked onto the team in 2015. He promptly earned the team's "Scout Team Award" on defense that season and then got on the field in 2016 making seven tackles on special teams. He was granted a scholarship prior to the start of the 2017 season.

- He moved to middle linebacker the last seven games of 2018 with Nico Sawtelle sidelined with injury, but returned to his defensive end position in the spring.
- Has posted a career-best 89 tackles on the year to rank second on the team
- The former three-sport HS athlete (football, basketball, track) earned a starting job at defensive end during 2017 fall camp and was awarded a scholarship by Charlie Strong during the last week of camp.
- In 2017, he led the team in TFL (14.0), 6th in tackles (51) and third in sacks (4.0) while starting all 12 games.
- Reaves previously attended Air Force Academy Prep School following his Manatee High graduation in 2014. He played safety and middle linebacker in high school.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SANDERS EXCELS IN RETURN GAME

Sophomore Bentlee Sanders became the Bulls' primary kickoff return man over the last four games of 2018 and has been the Bulls' primary punt returner thus far in 2019.

- Sanders averaged 26.8 ypr on 17 returns in 2018, which ranked second in the AAC and 13th nationally. He earned second team all-conference honors from Phil Steele.
- Sanders had a career-best 62-yard kickoff return to set up a field goal at Cincinnati. He had two returns for 83 yards in the game.
- Sanders posted 141 kickoff return yards on five returns at Houston, an average of 28.2 ypr, and had 182 all-purpose yards in the game.

AUSSIE ADDS RECORD DAY TO GREAT 2019 START

Second-year Bulls punter Trent "Aussie" Schneider has had a great start to the 2019 campaign.

- The 29-year old Australian currently ranks 8th nationally and first in The American with a 47.2 ypp average.
- Schneider set a USF game record averaging 51.6 yards on seven punts at Georgia Tech on Sept. 7, including a 60-yard boot.
- Schneider hit a 72-yard punt at ECU in 2018, which is tied for the longest in school history.

AUSSIE STEPS UP AT PUNTER

Second-year Bulls punter Trent Schneider has been tagged with the nickname "Aussie" by coach Charlie Strong for obvious reasons.

- After a solid first season (42.9 ypp average), Schneider is off to a great start to 2019, currently ranking fifth nationally and first in The American with a 48.5 ypp average.
- Schneider set a USF game record averaging 51.6 yards on seven punts at Georgia Tech on Sept. 7.
- Schneider earned **conference honor roll** recognition after a huge day vs. ECU. He punted nine times for a 49.2 yard average in the game, the third-best in program history, in th 20-13 victory. Schneider also hit a 72-yard punt, which tied for the longest in school history.
- The 29-year-old Schneider hails from Sydney, Australia, 9,264 miles and a 16-hour flight from Tampa. He worked in the construction business for eight years following completion of senior secondary school. He did work in brick laying, tilling, framing, deck building and renovations and had his own company.

- Schneider, a former soccer goalkeeper with a strong leg, launching the ball from his own goal box, posted a video on Facebook that spurred interest from colleges.
- Schneider's parents and two sisters reside in Australia.
- He earned CCCAA All-State Region 4 honors, averaging 38.6 ypp at Santa Barbara City College.
- He handles punting and kickoff duties for the Bulls.
- Charlie Strong has had previous experience with Australian kickers recruiting Michael Dickson, also from Sydney, to Texas. The current Seattle Seahawks punter earned the Ray Guy Award and All-America honors at Texas.

HORNE TIES NCAA RECORD; LOST FOR 2018 SEASON WITH ACL INJURY; SPORTING NEWS MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA

USF freshman WR Terrence Horne was named **Sporting News Midseason All-American** on Oct. 15, 2018.

Horne tied an NCAA record (held by 24 others) and set a new American Conference record with two kickoff returns for touchdowns against Georgia Tech (9.8), part of three TDs he scored in the game.

- Horne tore the ACL in his right knee during practice prior to the Sept. 22, 2018 game at ECU and missed the rest of the season.
- After months of rehab and a strong fall camp, Horne returned to kickoff return duties on Sept. 7, 2019 at Georgia Tech, where he returned one kickoff for 21 yards.
- in 2018, Horne matched the USF season and career records of two kickoff returns for touchdowns set by Lindsey Lamar (two in 2010).
- Horne set a new USF and American Conference game record for kickoff return yardage with 264 yards against Georgia Tech (2018), breaking the mark set by Mike Jenkins in 2007 with 192 against Cincinnati. The 264 yards are the most by an FBS player this season.
- Horne's 98-yard kickoff return for a TD against Georgia Tech as the third-longest in program history. He followed that with a 97-yard kickoff return for a TD, which tied for the fourth-longest kickoff return in program history.
- Horne was the only player in the NCAA in 2018 with two kickoff returns for touchdowns. He led the nation with an average of 47.0 yards per kickoff return prior to his injury.
- Before coming to USF, Horne won the Class 4A state 100-meter title for Miramar (Fla.) High School.

KEY INDICATORS OF SUCCESS

Since the 2013 season, USF has won with overwhelming consistency when reaching the numbers below, with their corresponding win-loss total in the last 5 seasons.



A two-time Big East Coach of the Year while at Louisville, Strong was also a vital part of two national championships as defensive coordinator at the University of Florida. BARNETT RETURNS STRONG AFTER INJURY-HAMPERED END TO 2018

After missing significant practice time and two of the Bulls' last four games of the 2018 season due to injuries, quarterback Blake Barnett returns healthy and having added 30 pounds to his now 275-pound bench press max. He will be participating in his first spring practice at USF after arriving on campus in May last year.

- Prior to injuries causing him to miss the Bulls' game at Cincinnati (Nov. 10), Barnett had started the first nine games and passed for 2,400 yards. He ranked 16th nationally (3rd in AAC) at that point, passing for 267.2 ypg, which was on pace to shatter the USF season passing record (2,911) with more than 3,400 passing yards. He returned to start the next week at Temple (passing for 82 yards), but missed two of the Bulls' final four games and did not start the Gasparilla Bowl, but entered in the first quarter and passed for 212 yards and a TD in the game.
- He tallied just 310 passing yards and one TD in the Bulls' final four games of 2018. Barnett passed for 1,099 yards and 8 TD in the first four games of 2018, including 411 yards and 2 TD at Illinois. He averaged 267.2 ypg passing through nine games. In the final four games of 2018, with Barnett missing two, USF passed for 695 yards (155.2 ypg) and 5 TD.
- Despite the missed time, Barnett's nine 200-yard passing games in 2018 were just one shy of the USF season record of 10 set by Marquel Blackwell in 2001.

NOTABLES

EXPLOSIVE BULLS RETURN

USF's leaders in explosive plays (20-plus yards) in rushing, receiving and passing in 2018 all return.

- Senior **Jordan Cronkrite** led USF with 10 explosive plays rushing last season, including five runs of 60-plus yards, topped by touchdown runs of 80, 77 and 76 yards. Sophomore **Johnny Ford** ranked second with seven explosive runs in 2018, including a 78-yarder, and added three explosive receiving plays.
- Sophomore **Randall St. Felix** led USF with 14 explosive plays receiving, including five in his Gasparilla Bowl record 165-yard receiving day that included TD catches of 38 and 33 yards.
- Senior quarterback **Blake Barnett** accounted for 33 explosive plays passing in 2018, including a 75-yard TD pass to St. Felix.

EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE

USF will return all five offensive line starters and tight end from the Bulls' Gasparilla Bowl appearance. Four players that started at least seven games in 2018 return on the line, led by 2017 second-team all-conference right tackle Marcus Norman (13), guard William Atterbury (13), left guard Demetris Harris (11) and center Brad Cecil (7). It marks the most returning starters on the offensive line since the Bulls returned five in 2014 and the third straight year USF has returned at least three starters. Donovan Jennings, who started at left tackle in the bowl game, made four starts last year.

■ Norman has started 34 straight games at right tackle, while **Atterbury** has started 23 straight at right guard.

DEFENSIVE LINE MATURES

USF had two sophomores and two true freshmen see extensive action on the D-line last season. They will now be part of six defensive linemen that return that played in eight or more games last year and four that have logged 22 or more career games. The group is led by senior defensive ends **Kirk Livingstone** (38 games, 25 starts) and **Greg Reaves** (33 games, 25 starts) who have both tallied **Grey Reaves** (34 games, 11 starts) and **Kelvin Pinkney** (22 games, 4 starts) and sophomores **Tyrone Barber** (11 games, 1 start) and **Rashawn Yates** (8 games, 2 starts) round out the group that will form the base of a Bulls' D-line that looks to enter 2019 bigger and more experienced.

2019 SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

- **Big Opener:** The Bulls' Friday, Aug. 30 season opener vs. Wisconsin in Raymond James Stadium will mark the program's biggest season opener at home since the program's very first game in 1997. Wisconsin has made 17 straight bowl appearances, returns 2018 Doak Walker winner and 2,000-yard rusher Jonathan Taylor, and has appeared in numerous early 2019 season Top 25 polls. It will be the Bulls' biggest season opener since winning on the road at No. 16 Notre Dame (23-20) to open the 2011 campaign.
- **Power 6:** The Bulls will take on two Power 6 opponents, Wisconsin and at Georgia Tech, in the non-conference season. USF has won five of its last six games vs. non-con Power 6 opponents and claimed victory in seven of its nine meetings overall.
- American: USF plays its first four conference games (three on the road) vs. teams that finished in the bottom half of their division in 2018 and posted a combined record of 12-27 (7-25 AAC). The Bulls finish with four conference games against teams that finished in the top half of their division and posted a combined record of 39-13 (26-7 AAC).
- Florida Finish: USF will close out the 2019 regular season with four straight games in the state of Florida in the month of November, all within a bus ride from campus. Three straight home games begin the stretch, which is capped by a trip to UCF for the War on I-4. The Bulls will face 2018 East Division runner-up Temple (8-5, 7-1 AAC) in a Thursday night clash on Nov. 7, followed by East Division third-place team Cincinnati (11-2; 6-2) on Nov. 16 and back-to-back West Division winner Memphis (8-6;5-3) on Nov. 23 at home before traveling to two-time defending East Division winner UCF (12-1; 8-0).

NOTABLES

PLAY FAST, SCORE FASTER

Offensive coordinator **Kerwin Bell** has brought the mantra "play fast, score faster" to the Bulls in his first season leading the offense. The former SEC Player of the Year quarterback (1984) at Florida comes to USF after 12 seasons as a successful head coach, leading programs at Valdosta State (2016-18) and Jacksonville University (2007-15) and a 14-year playing career in professional football.

- Charlie Strong and Bell were first part of the same program during the 1983-84 seasons at Florida, where Strong was serving in his first coaching position as a graduate assistant and Bell was a walk-on quarterback.
- The 2018 Don Hansen NCAA Division II Co-Coach of the Year, Bell's 2018 offense led the nation in scoring (52.0 ppg) and was fourth in total offense (523.9 ypg). The Blazers scored 728 points, the most in NCAA Division II history, as they posted 7,334 yards (3,676 rushing/3,658 passing) and 7.9 yards per play.

PLAYMAKERS RETURN

The Bulls return their leading passer, top three rushers, and two of their top three receivers (including their yardage leader) from 2018.

- The Bulls return 2,281 rushing yards (90.6% of their 2018 total, 2,710 passing yards (85.4% of 2018) and 1,751 receiving yards (55% of 2018).
- Players that accounted for 25 of the Bulls' 26 rushing TD, 12 of 17 passing TD, and 8 of 17 receiving TD return.

WILCOX AMONG NATION'S TOP TIGHT ENDS

A two-time all-conference selection (1st team in 2018) and Mackey Award candidate, senior **Mitchell Wilcox** is among the best tight ends in the nation and spurned an opportunity to enter the 2019 NFL Draft to add to a stellar career that has him poised to own every USF tight end record. His 43 catches and 540 yards set **USF season receptions** and season yardage for a tight end last year and led The American. He owns the **career yardage** record and **career receptions** for a USF tight end and the **single game receptions** record (8). His six **career TD catches** are tied with Sean Price for the USF tight end record and his career-best 109 yards at Illinois last year are second only to Elkanah Dillion's game mark of 126 yards vs. FAMU in 2015.

REAVES RETURNS TO THE EDGE

Senior Greg Reaves, a former walk-on, started the last seven games of 2018 at middle linebacker due to injuries and depth at linebacker. He excelled, posting 9.4 tackles per game during the stretch to finish second on the team with 89 tackles. For 2019, the 6-2, 248-pounder will return to his edge position as a defensive end/outside linebacker, a position from which he led USF with 14.0 TFL in 2017. He has started the last 25 straight games for the Bulls.

USF enters the 2019 season with 11 members of the roster already having earned their degree, including seven returning starters.

TAMPA - Senior transfer Patrick Macon had a monster USF debut with 15 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss, a sack and forced fumble, but the Bulls fell, 49-0, to No. 19/17 Wisconsin on Friday night.

USF's season-opening crowd of 46,704 at Raymond James Stadium saw the senior middle linebacker from Memphis, Tenn., post the most tackles in a game for the Bulls since DeDe Lattimore's 18 stops against Rutgers in 2013.

Macon, who made 10 solo tackles, was one of four upperclassman transfers who started on defense. Junior cornerback KJ Sails recovered Macon's forced fumble, totaled two tackles and had a 17-yard punt return after becoming eligible this week. Senior Devin Studstill started at strong safety and tied for second on the team with five tackles in his first game with the Bulls since transferring from Notre Dame.

Following a 55-minute lightning delay, Wisconsin Heisman hopeful Jonathan Taylor's three touchdown first half helped power the Badgers to a 28-0 lead by the break. While several dropped passes dashed USF's chances to get its new offense rolling, Taylor's 37-yard TD run got Wisconsin on the board first. The Badgers later stripped Bulls quarterback Blake Barnett and returned the fumble 16 yards for a touchdown and 14-0 lead. Barnett finished 13-of-30 for 109 yards and two interceptions on the night.

KEY NOTES

- A total of 46,704 fans attended the game, which marked the Bulls' 18th-best home attendance total in program history.
- It marked USF's first home loss in a season opener since 2013. Kickoff was delayed 55 minutes due to lightning.

ATLANTA - Led by freshman backup quarterback Jordan McCloud and two straight second-half takeaways by the defense, USF nearly erased a double-digit fourth quarter deficit for the second straight year against Georgia Tech before falling, 14-10, Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

McCloud threw a 20-yard touchdown pass to Johnny Ford to help cut the deficit to 14-10 with 14:53 remaining in the game after junior cornerback KJ Sails' first interception as a Bull on a tipped pass from Patrick Macon.

On the very next drive, senior defensive end Darius Slade recovered a fumble forced by sophomore safety Nick Roberts at the USF 45. McCloud completed 4 of 5 passes for 90 yards in his impressive relief effort, including a 54-yard connection with Mitchell Wilcox that set USF up for the potential go-ahead score at the Tech 1-yard line. Jordan Cronkrite's potential go-ahead touchdown dive from the 2 was ruled short of the goal line on review. His fumble following reaching the ball out resulted in a loss of possession at the goal line with 10:03 to play.

USF looked to have stopped Tech with just over two minutes to play following a tackle by Macon on a third-and-long play, but replay officials observing from the press box called for a review on the play and ruled Macon had made helmet-to-helmet contact. The unsportsmanlike penalty resulted in a 15-yard gain and a first down, which allowed Tech to run out the clock.

KEY NOTES

- USF is now 1-1 all-time against Georgia Tech after erasing a 10-point fourth quarter deficit in a 49-38 victory over the Yellow Jackets last season in Tampa.
- Senior Mitchell Wilcox is now USF's career tight end receptions leader with 76 and set the new record on a career long 54-yard catch in the fourth quarter.

TAMPA - Quarterback Jordan McCloud accounted for five touchdowns in his first career start while the USF defense set program records with eight takeaways and five fumble recoveries in a 55-16 rout of South Carolina State at Raymond James Stadium on Saturday night

Redshirt freshman McCloud completed 16 of 27 passes for 217 yards and three touchdowns. The Tampa native also rushed for two scores and 56 yards (4.7 ypc) in the second-best scoring debut by a USF freshman.

USF scored 42 points off takeaways after forcing five turnovers in its 31-point second half. Five different Bulls recovered fumbles to set the record - seniors Greg Reaves, Kirk Livingstone and Devin Studstill along with juniors KJ Sails and Tyrik Jones. Sophomore safety Nick Roberts had a 62-yard interception return and finished with five tackles.

Sophomore Johnny Ford, who moved from running back to receiver in the spring, recorded his first 100-yard receiving game with 100 yards on just four catches, including a 42-yard touchdown to start USF's scoring and a career long 52-yarder in the fourth quarter. Ford also had a 32-yard touchdown run and gained 37 yards on three carries (12.3 ypc). Senior Mitchell Wilcox set USF's new tight end career touchdown receptions record (8) with scoring catches of 20 and 10 yards during USF's 459-yard performance.

KEY NOTES

- USF set the new program record with eight takeaways (five fumble recoveries, three interceptions). The previous record of seven takeaways was set three different times (last vs. Louisville on Nov. 17, 2007).
- Jordan McCloud accounted for five touchdowns (three passing, two rushing) in the second-best scoring debut by a USF freshman. QB Marquel Blackwell accounted for six touchdowns (three rushing, three passing) against Southern Utah in 2001.
