USF will return to action after a long bye week that gave the Bulls two weekends off following a Friday contest vs. Tulsa on Oct. 23. A trip to Memphis, where USF won 49-42 in its last visit in 2016, will mark the Bulls' fifth road game on the year and the first of back-to-back road games that will complete USF's six road trips on the year. USF is 0-4 so far in road games on the year and the Bulls' last road win came just over one year ago at ECU (45-20) on Oct. 26, 2019. The Bulls have lost in their last five road games and are 4-12 on the road in the last three seasons.

■ SCORING & OFFENSE: The winner of the last two meetings has scored at least 42 points, with the average combined point total being 75 points. Memphis has scored at least 42 in each of the last two meetings, falling 49-42 to USF in the Liberty Bowl in 2016. USF enters the game ranked 91st nationally scoring 18 ppg and 87th in total offense (325.5 ypg), while Memphis enters ranked 33rd in scoring (33 ppg) and 11th in total offense (503.2 ypg). USF posted 37 points in its last road game (at Temple), its highest point total on the season, and will look to continue progress on the offensive side of the ball vs. a Memphis defense that stands 101 out of 103 in total defense (556.8 ypg) and 102 out of 103 in passing defense (406.4 ypg). Meanwhile, USF stands 50th in total defense (392.7 ypg), 18th in passing yards allowed (183.8) and 16th in interceptions (7).

FIRST YEAR COACHES: Both USF head coach Jeff Scott and Memphis head coach Ryan Silverfield are leading a pogram for the first time and have had to deal with a virtually non-existent spring and remotely communicating with their team during the offseason as they established their team culture. The two are good friends and speak frequently on the phone as they compare notes on handling the unique situations presented by this season.

THE PROGRAM

In its 24th season and 21st at the FBS level, USF Football has made 10 bowl appearances, including a string of four straight (2015-18) and every season between 2005-10 (6 straight). USF has won six bowl games and has produced 14 All-America selections, 30 NFL Draft picks and reached the No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press Poll in 2007.

LAST TIME OUT

BULLS FALL TO TULSA IN RAY JAY

USF came up short in its attempt at posting the program's 100th home victory as Tulsa totaled three takeaways in a 42-13 win over the Bulls at Raymond James Stadium on Oct. 23.

QB Noah Johnson played in his fifth game this season and threw his first touchdown pass as a Bull in the third quarter. Johnson threw for a season-high 150 yards and also set a season high with 18 completions on 27 attempts.

WR Omarion Dollison reached a new career high in receptions with six for a team-high 54 yards with a long of 22 yards.

DB Daquan Evans had a 31-yard return on his second interception of the season (third of his career) in the first quarter.
 Evans has intercepted a pass in consecutive games and had a 56-yard return the previous week at Temple.
 WR Bryce Miller recorded his first touchdown reception of the season (fifth career) with a 4-yard scoring catch in the

third quarter. Miller matched his career high in receptions with five for 44 yards.

LB Andrew Mims had a season-high seven tackles to lead the Bulls. Mims has posted at least six tackles in two games this season.

STORY LINES

■ Tale of Two Turnovers: An opportunistic USF defense is among the national leaders having collected 10 turnovers (15th) on the year. Meanwhile, the Bulls offense has committed 13 in the last four games and USF stands 97th nationally with 13 turnovers lost.

■ **Backfield Pressure:** The USF defense has struggled to create sacks or tackles for loss, ranking 91st in TFL (4.5 tpg) and 99th in sacks (0.50). Meanwhile, USF allowed 9.5 tackles for loss per game to rank 98th and stands 75th allowing 3.0 sacks per game.

■ **Money Downs:** USF calls third downs "Money Downs" as the opportunity to extend a drive or get the defense off the field. The Bulls have struggled in both aspects, ranking 88th nationally allowing teams to convert 52.6% of third downs and standing 90th converting just 28.8% on offense.

■ Scott Takes Over: Named the Bulls' fifth head coach on Dec. 9, 2019, Florida native Jeff Scott takes on his first head coaching job after 12 very successful seasons at Clemson, the last five as co-offensive coordinator that saw the Tigers post a 70-5 record, claim five ACC championships, make five straight College Football Playoff appearances, four CFP Championship game appearances (2015, 2016, 2018 & 2019 seasons) and win national titles in 2016 and 2018.

■ New Coordinators Have FAU History: New defensive Coordinator Glenn Spencer and offensive coordinator Charlie Weis Jr. both spent last season at FAU as the Owls went 11-3 and won the Conference USA title. Spencer brings three decades of coaching experience to the Bulls, including seven seasons as defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State. Weis Jr. was the youngest coordinator in FBS football when he took over duties at FAU under Lane Kiffin in 2018 at the age of 24. He is now 27 entering his third season as a coordinator after leading the Owls top 15 rankings in total offense and scoring offense.

■ Young & Energetic Staff: At age 39, Jeff Scott is the youngest head coach in The American and the Bulls' coaching staff averages just 36.4 years old as of Sept. 1, making it the youngest in The American and one of the youngest nationally, according to USA Today. Temple is the next closest in The American, averaging nearly a year older. The Bulls have six staff members under 35, nine under 40, and defensive coordinator Glenn Spencer is the oldest at 56, while offensive coordinator Charlie Weis Jr. is the youngest at 27. ■ **Transfer Talent:** Jeff Scott welcomed numerous Division I transfers in his first year with the Bulls and as many as 16 transfers will play significant roles this season and are battling high on the depth chart, including at quarterback, running back, offensive line, wide receiver, defensive back, defensive line and kicker.

■ QB Competition: Three quarterbacks split reps throughout fall camp as Jeff Scott looked to determine the Bulls' starting QB from returning 2019 starter Jordan McCloud (now a sophomore), sophomore UNC transfer Cade Fortin and graduate Alcorn State transfer Noah Johnson. Freshman Katravis Marsh joined the competition in September. With NCAA elligibility waivers for this season, whoever emerges as the starter could potentially hold the position for two to four years.

■ Trio on O-Line Provide Foundation: Three starters on the offensive line - LT Donovan Jennings, LG Demetris Harris and C Brad Cecil – have started alongside each other for the past two seasons and each bring at least 15 starts into 2019. The unit did not take the field together until Game 4 of the 2020 season.

■ Weis Jr. Among Youngest/Most Successful Coordinators: 27-year-old Charlie Weis Jr. takes the reins of the USF offense after two seasons in the same role under Lane Kiffin at FAU, where he produced offenses that ranked among the top 20 nationally in scoring and total yardage. His 2019 offense was 14th nationally, scoring 36.4 ppg.

■ Veteran Spencer Leads Oportunistic Defense: The old man of the staff at all of 56, Glenn Spencer comes to USF after one season leading the FAU defense, seven leading Oklahoma State's defense (10 overall at OSU) and one leading Charlotte's. His Owls squad improved more than 40 spots in 10 national defensive rankings.

■ Impact Freshmen: USF has leaned on several freshman starters in 2020 and many have come up big. Linebacker Mac Harris and safety Chris Townsel both started at Cincinnati and produced interceptions with Harris adding eight tackles and Townsel three. The pair also started vs. ECU. Josh Blanchard and Dustyn Hall have started and played significant minutes on the offensive line. Wide receiver Omarion Dollison has scored on special teams and is among the Bulls leading receivers.

OPPONENT PREVIEW: MEMPHIS

Memphis saw its five-game winning streak against Cincinnati snapped on Saturday at Nippert Stadium as the No. 7 Bearcats defeated the Tigers, 49-10. Memphis quarterback Brady White completed 18 of his 35 passes for 316 yards and a touchdown. With a 27-yard pass to running back Rodrigues Clark in the third quarter, White moved into second all-time at Memphis in career passing yards.

Memphis has won 12 consecutive home games and has not lost at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium since falling 31-30 to UCF on Oct. 13, 2018.

Memphis ranks second in The American and 11th in the NCAA in passing offense with an average of 338.2 yards per game through the air.

Memphis ranks third in The American and 11th in the NCAA in total offense with 503.2 yards per game.

ETPET DOWN

Penalty NET YARDS RUSHING

Memphis quarterback Brady White ranks fourth in the NCAA in passing touchdowns (18) and fifth in the nation in passing yards per game (338.2 ypg).

Memphis ranks last in The American (101st nationally) in total defense, allowing 556.8 yards per game. The Tigers stand last in the conference in pass defense (102nd nationally), surrendering 406.4 yards per game through the air.

Memphis quarterback Brady White needs four more touchdown passes to tie Danny Wimprine as the school's alltime leader with 81 career touchdown passes.

Sophomore defensive back Quindell Johnson leads Memphis and ranks seventh in The American with an average of 7.6 tackles per game.

LAST TIME: VS. MEMPHIS L, 49-10, NOV. 23, 2019

Freshman Kelley Joiner Jr. registered his first career 100-yard rushing game as injury-riddled USF dropped a 49-10 decision to No. 18 Memphis in the Bulls' 2019 home finale at Raymond James Stadium. Joiner shined in his first career start in place of injured senior Jordan Cronkrite (Miami), rushing for 115 yards on 13 carries (8.8 ypc) against the redhot Tigers (10-1, 6-1).

■ USF posted multiple takeaways for the sixth time after getting interceptions from KJ Sails and Daguan Evans.

■ LB Andrew Mims set a career high with a game-high 13 tackles (11 solo) and recorded the first sack of his career in the third quarter.

■ Junior Trent Schneider set a USF single-game record with 464 punting yards on nine attempts (51.6 ypp).

Memphis led 28-10 at the half and held the Bulls scoreless in the second. Memphis ran for 325 yards, including 138 from Kenneth Gainwell and 95 & 3 TD from Patrick Taylor.

Raymond James Stadium is gearing up to host Super Bowl 55 on Feb. 7. It will mark its third Super Bowl and join the hosting of the 2017 CFP Championship game. In recent years, the stadium has undergone major upgrades to enhance its stature among the finest venues in sports:

■ The first venue IN THE WORLD to feature Sportsbeam LED Field Lighting, which allows for 2.1 million color combinations and 100s of lighting effects. (2020)

The addition of 5G network connectivity. (2020)

■ \$10.4 million in COVID-19 mitigation, cleaning and sani-

tization enhancements, including installation of 775 hand sanitizer stations in the stadium and surrounding lots. State of the art, high visibility 9,600-square-foot video displays in both end zones along with the addition of a new 2,300-square-foot video towers in each corner and stadium ribbon board. All together, the video displays cover more than 28,000-square-feet, making Raymond James Stadium the third-largest video displays in the United States.

OD IMPRESSES

True freshman Omarion Dollison (who signed with Jeff Scott & USF without ever making a visit) is making a big impact in his first season as OD's speed and athleticism have shined. In the season opener, he caught a blocked punt for a touchdown, tip-toeing inside the goal line on the rare play. He led USF with 6 receptions for 54 yards vs. Tulsa and stands 5th on the team with 13 catches for 202 yards.

OD's 15.5 yards per catch leads all Bulls receivers with more than one reception on the season.

COLLECTING TURNOVERS

New defensive coordinator Glenn Spencer came to USF with a reputation for defenses that aggressively collect turnovers and the Bulls have followed suit.

■ Spencer's 2019 FAU defense led the nation in total takeaways (33), interceptions (22) and turnover margin (+21).

■ USF ranks 15th in the nation in turnovers gained with 10. The Bulls have forced five fumbles so far on the year and have recovered three (20th in the nation) and have seven interceptions (---th in the nation) by five different players.

■ USF has collected multiple turnovers in three games, including three in the season-opening win vs. The Citadel and four at No. 15 Cincinnati.

ALL THE YOUNG DUDES...

Carry the news (credit, David Bowie), at age 39, Jeff Scott is the youngest head coach in The American and the Bulls coaching staff averages just 36.4 years of age as of Sept. 1, making it the youngest in The American and one of the youngest nationally, according to USA Today.

■ The Bulls have six staff members 35 or under, nine under 40, and defensive coordinator Glenn Spencer is the oldest at 56, while offensive coordinator Charlie Weis Jr. is the youngest at 27.

At age 30, Bulls punter Trent Schneider is older than offensive coordinator Charlie Weis Jr. and the same age as defensive line coach Da'Quan Bowers and safeties coach Wes Neighbors.

At age 39, head coach Jeff Scott is the third oldest member of the staff, eclipsed only by Spencer (56) and assistant head coach/offensive line coach Allen Mogridge (43).

BULLS FASTEST TO REACH TOP 10

■ In 2007, USF became the fastest program in the modern AP Poll Era to go from inception to a Top 10 national ranking as the Bulls were ranked No. 6 in the Week 5 AP Poll in just the program's 11th season. The Bulls would climb all the way to the No. 2 ranking two weeks late in Week 7 to become the fastest to reach a Top 5 ranking.

■ The Bull have reached a Top 25 ranking in seven seasons, including three straight (2016-18), and have been ranked a total of 49 weeks, including 12 in the top 15.

Jeff Scott turned 39 on Dec. 28, 2019, just weeks after accepting the USF job. His former position coach and head coach at Clemson, Dabo Swinney, was also 39 when he ascended to the head coaching job at Clemson, leaving his position as wide receivers coach, which he then tabbed Scott, who was a GA on the staff, to fill. Another notable 39-year-old first time head coach was Jim Leavitt, who left Bill Snyder's staff at Kansas State to begin the USF program as its first head coach in 1996 when he was 39.

THE SWINNEY TREE

Jeff Scott is the first true branch of the Dabo Swinney coaching tree and has followed a remarkably similar path. Swinney has led Clemson since 2008 and Scott was with him during the entire rise of the program to national dominance that saw five straight CFP appearances and two national titles in the final five years of Scott's tenure.

■ Wide Receivers Coach Tradition: Dabo Swinney was a walk-on wide receiver at Alabama and was hired by his Alabama position coach, Tommy Bowden, when Bowden got the head coaching job at Clemson. Scott was a three-year letterman wide receiver at Clemson and was coached by Swinney, who promoted him to his first primary FBS coaching position in 2008 to replace Swinney at wide receivers coach after Swinney became the head coach. Scott's first wide receivers coach on his USF staff is Xavier Dye, who played for Scott at Clemson.

HUNTER CONNECTS TAMPA & CLEMSON

Jeff Scott and his wife, Sara, welcomed their first son on Aug. 10, 2020, as he joined sister, Savannah. The couple, who had spent most of the previous two decades in Clemson, S.C., decided to name their son Hunter in honor of standout Clemson wide receiver and now NFL receiver Hunter Renfrow, whom Scott coached at Clemson. The name was chosen as a symbolic connection between Clemson and Tampa. As many will remember, Renfrow caught the gamewinning pass in the Tigers 2016 CFP National Championship win over Alabama in the corner of the end zone at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa. Scott called the game-winning play as co-offensive coordinator at the time and when he first arrived in Tampa upon being named USF head coach, he visited Raymond James Stadium and reenacted that play in the corner of the end zone.





#BAYIVIADE FOCUSED ON CULTIVATING HOMEGROWN TALENT

Jeff Scott has focused USF's recruiting on the state Florida and particularly the Bay area and its seven surrounding counties.

■ USF's priority order for recruiting is: 1) the Bay area (100 mile radius); 2) the state of Florida (10 broken into geographic areas), 3) bordering and nearby states (GA, AL, SC, NC); 4) national.

Within a 100-mile radius of Tampa there are 121 high schools. There are close to 100 Division I players recruited nationally from the area annually.

■ Each USF coach is assigned 12 schools in Area (with Wes Neighbors getting 13) as the Bulls build on the benefit of players being able to have their family involved in the program, see them play regularly, go home regularly and play for their city as well as the benefit of building their brand in a thriving metropolitan economic area of over 4 million people and numerous large businesses and professional opportunities.

■ The 2020 Bulls' roster <u>features 31 players from</u> the Bay area, including <u>11 listed as starters</u> at the top of the depth chart for the opening game.

■ 87 of the players on USF's roster hail from the state of Florida. That represents 81 percent of the roster with Georgia (5 players) being the next closest state in producing current Bulls. The Miami/Ft. Lauderdale area is next closest with 16 Bulls hailing from the area.

■ Among the Bay area standouts on the Bulls' 2020 roster are starting QB Jordan McCloud, wide receivers DeVontres Odoms-Dukes and Bryce Miller, left tackle Donovan Jennings and right guard Michael Wiggs, cornerbacks Mike Hampton and KJ Sails, safeties Mekhi LaPointe and Bentlee Sanders, defensive linemen Darien Grant, Kelvin Pinkney and Blake Green, and placekicker Spencer Shrader. Established an Inclusive Excellence Committee with representation from head coaches, staff, and student-athletes and tasked with evaluation, education of the department in the areas of diversity and inclusion, racial justice, LGBTQ+ and more. and cultivating and retaining a diverse and inclusive department.

■ A Voting Holiday on Nov. 3 Election Day with all teams and staff calendars cleared and encouraged to participate in the electoral process. Voter education webinars and voter registration efforts for student-athletes and staff will continue through the fall, with one of the first a presentation by the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections.

■ All Bulls teams will wear a black "United" patch on their uniforms throughout the 2020-21 season. Additionally, all studentathletes were given the option of receiving an adidas-branded Black Lives Matter shirt to wear in warm-ups if they choose. The football team will also place a "BLM" emblem on the back of its helmets for the season.

Student-athletes from each team have also been given the opportunity to write and appear in a team-specific video produced by the department in which they can voice their message in promoting positive change in social justice.

Earlier this summer, Bulls student-athletes KJ Sails and Jordan McCloud took active roles in the Tampa community, leading a 400-person unity walk in downtown Tampa and organizing post protest cleanup efforts around the USF campus.

FORD FUSION

After seeing playing time in just four games in 2019 and taking a redshirt season, sophomore Johnny Ford has been the Bulls' most explosive and reliable player in 2020.

■ Ford has been the Bulls' leading rusher in three games and leads USF on the year with 285 rushing yards, 3 rushing TD and his 5.2 yards per carry average includes the Bulls' two longest runs of the season – 43 & 42 yards.

■ Leads USF with 731 all-purpose yards (121 ypg). The next nearest Bull is posting 38 ypg.

■ Ford has been very explosive in kickoff returns and currently ranks 17th nationally posting 24.7 yards per return, which includes returns of 70, 46 and 44 yards.

Ford's four total touchdowns (1 receiving) and 24 points lead all USF players.

■ He has added 15 catches for 125 yards to rank second on the team in receptions.

■ The 5-5 miami native had a breakout true freshman seasoon in 2018 as he was second on the team with 787 yards and eight touchdowns rushing and his 6.8 ypc ranked 12th nationally. He posted three 100-yard games on the year, including a 164-yard, three TD day on just seven carreis vs. UConn in which he set a USF record of 23.7 ypc.

WILLIAMS EMPLOYING SPEED

Tennessee transfer Latrell Williams sat out last season, but is now putting his team-leading 4.27 40 speed to use.

The 5-11 junior flashed throughout fall camp, but was slowed by injuries that sidelined him for large chunks of camp and limited his effectiveness in the first three games.
He exploded in Game 4 vs. ECU posting career bests with eight receptions and 93 yards, including a 31-yard long, to lead USF. It marked the most productive receiving

game by a Bull to that point on the year. ■ A Lake City, Fla. native, Williams played in two games at Toppesson after signing with the Vela on a 4 star recruit

at Tennessee after signing with the Vols as a 4-star recruit after 68 receptions for 1,035 yards and nine touchdowns his senior year.

GRIER GONE WILD

Junior Antonio Grier is picking up right where he left off after a productive sophomore campaign that saw him lead USF with 4 sacks, rank fourth with 8.5 TFL and sixth with 58 tackles with six starts.

Grier leads the Bulls in tackles (40), sacks (3) and TFL (4.0) and has twice led the team in tackles (posting 10 vs. ECU and The Citadel).

Grier led the defense with 10 tackles, two TFL and a sack vs. ECU (10.10).

He was ejected for targeting in the second half of the Temple game and missed the first half of the Tulsa game.

MCCLOUD STAKES CLAIM AS BULLS' TRIGGER MAN

USF played at least three quarterbacks in each of the Bulls' first three games before Jordan McCloud started Game 4 vs. ECU and played nearly the entire contest before giving way on the last possession. With just one spring practice to be able to see his new team, head coach Jeff Scott had an open competition for the starting QB job through fall camp and had targeted Game 4 to settle on a starter.

■ Thus far, sophomore Jordan McCloud has started 5 games and freshman Katravis Marsh one (at Cincinnati).

■ He tied a career high with three TD passes at Temple and led touchdown drives of 95, 72, 49, 46 and 35 yards in the Bulls' highest scoring game to date (a 37-39 loss). He also had three costly fumbles, one returned for a TD.

■ McCloud was very efficient vs. ECU posting career bests with 26 pass completions and 298 yards while completing a career-best 74 percent of his passes. It was by far the best passing outing of any USF QB on the season. McCloud has the three best passing outings for USF on the season.

■ Four QBs have seen key game minutes and completed passes with sophomore Cade Fortin and senior Noah Johnson joining McCloud and Marsh.

At No. 15 Cincinnati, USF tied a program record with five interceptions in the game - three from Marsh, two from Mc-

USF FOOTBALL CENTER FUND RAISING OVER \$21 MILLION

In late 2017, USF unveiled plans for a 150,000-square foot plus USF Football Center to be located on campus adjacent to the current home of the Bulls, the Lee Roy Selmon Athletics Center. The USF Football Center, a donor-driven project, will expand upon the Morsani Football Practice Complex and feature an indoor practice facility housing a 100-yard turf field and as well as a state-of-the-art home for all the football program functions.

USF received a \$5 million launch gift from Pam & Les Muma on Nov. 11, 2017 and received several million in gifts in 2019 to bring total funds raised toward the facility to more than \$21 million to date.

Among the highlights in the initial plans by the global design firm HOK:

- A stunning entry lobby and multi-purpose space for recruiting

- Indoor practice facility with a 100-yard turf field
 Football strength and conditioning center
 Nearly 10,000-square foot football locker room
 Players' lounge and adjacent social patio
 Team auditorium with tiered seating

- · Sports medicine and rehabilitation facility
- Team and position meeting spaces, coaches and staff offices
- Equipment room, video operations, laundry and other support operations

Charlie Weis Jr. has been the youngest coordinator in FBS football for the last three seasons since being hired as offensive coordinator at FAU in 2018 at the age of 24. Now 27, Weis is among eight coordinators age 30 or younger and four under 30 in the FBS.

THE MAYOR

A tampa native, senior KJ Sails transferred to USF from North Carolina prior to the 2019 season to be closer to his three-year old son, King, and following the death of his great grandmother and a close friend (both Tampa natives) within weeks of each other.

An outgoing presence and leader for the Bulls since his arrival, King has publicly stated his desire to one day become the mayor of Tampa. "I want to help the people im my community feel good about where you live."

Sails has had several in-person meeting with current Tampa mayor Jane Castor, and, through the Selmon Mentoring Institute in USF Athletics (named after the Buccaneers Hall of Fame legend and former USF Athletic Director Lee Roy Selmon), Castor is currently serving as Sails' mentor and providing guidance and glimpse of what it is like to be mayor and how the former police chief is leading the community.

THE BOYLES EFFECT

Linebacker Dwayne Boyles led USF in tackles (75) and tackles for loss (12.5) in 2019. The junior is the heart of the Bulls defense, making many of the reads and play calls from his linebacker position.

After posting four tackles in the season opener. Boyles missed the next three games (Notre Dame, Cincinnati and ECU) due to being on the unavailable list.

The Miami native returned for the Temple game and promptly led USF with nine tackles and blocked his first career field goal, turning back a Temple attempt just before the half.

THE CALL-UP

Baseball managers often look to the outfield bullpen for the next man up, but Coach Scott took it a step further when he looked to the video tower to find the Bulls' long snapper. With injuries knocking out USF's long snapper depth, Scott asked the staff if they had any options. Video Coordinator Phil Cane did indeed, identifying a newly hired videographer, Bryce Bernard, as being a high school long snapper. At the end of the next practice, Scott gathered the team on the field, pointed to the far video tower and introduced the team to their newest long snapper, who waved to applause from the team. Bernard, who played at Fletcher HS in Neptune Beach, Fla, and started the Cincinnati game (Oct. 3).

RUN GAME ROLLS VS. THE CITADEL

Despite missing the entire veteran left side of the offensive line in game one, as juniors Brad Cecil (center), Demetris Harris (guard) and Donovan Jennings (tackle) were unavailable, USF got off to a great start on the ground.

The Bulls ran for 302 yards vs. The Citadel, averaging 7.7 yards per carry and with four players running for 40 yards or more and six averaging better than 7.0 yards per carry. Kelley Joiner led the way with 87 yards on eight



carries and a TD while posting 10.9 ypc.

■ USF failed to run for more than 175 yards in its last four games of 2019 and ranked 66th nationally at 161 ypg on the year.

DID WE JUST SEE THAT?

In his first game as a Bull, freshman wide receiver Omarion Dollison recorded one of the most unique plays in NCAA history in the Bulls win vs. The Citadel.

Playing on special teams punt coverage, Dollison was first upended by his own teammate when rushing the kick, then jumped to his feet. Citadel punter Matt Campbell first fumbled the snap and then attempted to kick the ball from the endline of his own end zone. He muffed that attempt and the ball squirted right. Dollison tracked it down, tiptoeing inside the end zone pylon to record a 0-vard punt return for a touchdown, equaling the shortest such return for a touchdown in NCAA history.

The Bulls went on to also record a fumble recovery on punt coverage in the game, thus recording two turnovers and a touchdown in the special teams debut of new special teams coordinator Daniel Da Prato.

TAMPA TWO - BECOMES FOUR

The well known cover scheme also could have served as a moniker for the Bulls' guarterback situation through the first two games, but the field has expanded to four. Tampa natives Jordan McCloud (Plant HS), the starter in the first two games, and Noah Johnson (Armwood HS), a transfer from Alcorn State, took the majority of snaps in the season-opening win over The Citadel and at Notre Dame. Sophomore North Carolina transfer Cade Fortin was unavailable the first two games but joined the quarterback competition at Cincinnati, as did true freshman Katravis Marsh, who saw action in the first two games, started at Cincinnati and possesses a strong arm.

Sophomore Jordan McCloud made his 15th career start (5th on the year) vs. Tulsa after starting 10 games last year and playing the last half of the season with a thumb injury that limited him. McCloud added about eight pounds of muscle in the offseason. He led the Bulls' opening scoring drive of the season, moving USF 62 yards vs. The Citadel and hitting DeVontres Odoms-Dukes with a 10-yard touchdown pass. Coming off the bench in the second half, McCloud led USF in passing at No. 15 Cincinnati, completing 12-of-21 for 137 yards and led USF's lone scoring drive, which he completed with an 18-yard TD reception on a trick play. He also had two interceptions in the game. He posted the Bulls' most productive passing game of the year vs. ECU with 26 completions for 298 yards and tied a career high with three TD passes at Temple.

Graduate Noah Johnson, the 2018 SWAC Offensive Player of the Year, returns to Tampa as a graduate but

TEAM TAMPA BAY WINNING!

The Bay area is home to four professional sports organizations, including MLB's Rays, NHL's Lightning, NFL's Bucanneers and USL's Rowdies. All have had outstanding 2020 seasons, with three thus far reaching their leagues championship game and one, the Lightning, claiming a title.

■ The **Tampa Bay Lightning** won their second Stanley Cup on Sept. 28 when they downed the Dallas Stars in six games. The Lightning also won the Cup in 2004. They have reached the playoffs 4 of the last 5 seasons and the conference finals three times in that span.

■ The Tampa Bay Rays reached the 2020 World Series, falling to the Los Angeles Dodgers in six games. The Rays also reached the 2008 World Series.

■ The **Tampa Bay Buccaneers** acquired sure Hall of Fame players Tom Brady and Rob Gronkowski in the offseason and stand atop the NFC South with a 5-2 record. The Bucs won a Super Bowl in 2002 and Raymond James Stadium will host the Super Bowl this year.

■ The **Tampa Bay Rowdies** soccer team reached the USL Championship final in 2020.

could have two years of eligibility with the NCAA's COVID-19 waiver. He led two scoring drives vs. The Citadel, moving USF 60 yards and 86 yards for scores. On the first, he carried the ball on the final four plays, accounting for 25 yards, and scored on a 9-yard touchdown run. He had his top throwing day vs. Tulsa, completing 18-of-27 for 150 yards, 1 TD and 1 INT.

Cade Fortin made his first USF appearance at No. 15 Cincinnati (Oct. 3). He completed 2-of-6 passes for 14 yards playing in the first half. He led USF on a scoring drive vs. Tulsa to start the second half as the Bulls went 72 yards in 10 plays with Fortin going 2-2 for 25 yards passing and running for 39 yards, including a 33-yard scramble before getting hurt on his last run and leaving the field before Johnson completed the TD drive. Fortin appeared in four games and made two starts at North Carolina, passing for 388 yards and a touchdown in 2018. He was a four-star prospect out of North Gwinnet HS in Georgia. **Katravis Marsh** made his first career start at No. 15 Cincinnati (Oct. 3), but struggled with three interceptions in the game and was later diagnosed with a concussion that caused him to miss the next three games (ECU, Temple & Tulsa). He led Miami Central HS to a 12-3 record and Class 6A state championship last year. The 6-5, 198-pound freshman is a big, strong presence in the pocket.

BULLS BEGIN SCOTT ERA WITH CONVINCING WIN AGAINST THE CITADEL

All three phases of the game helped make Jeff Scott a big winner in his collegiate head coaching debut, as the Bulls opened the 2020 season with a 27-6 victory over The Citadel at Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls improved to 17-6 all-time in season openers, winning five of the last six.

 USF rushed for 302 yards and averaged 7.7 yards per carry, led by 87 yards (10.9 ypc) and one touchdown from sophomore

Kelley Joiner and 71 yards on nine carries (7.9 ypc) from Johnny Ford. The Citadel's usually potent triple-option offense averaged just 3.7 yards per carry on 54 rushing attempts.

USF finished with three takeaways, had seven tackles for loss, and received 10 tackles and one forced fumble from junior linebacker Antonio Grier Jr. Wofford transfer Thad Mangum added a career-high nine tackles against his former conference foe, while three members of the secondary (Vincent Davis, Bentlee Sanders and Nick Roberts) had seven stops.

 Freshman Omarion Dollison tied the NCAA record for the shortest punt return touchdown in history (0 yards), catching a botched punt attempt off the foot of Matt Campbell in The Citadel end zone in the second quarter.
 In a constant rain, USF did not turn the ball over and

finished +3 in turnover margin.

Sophomore Jordan McCloud started at quarterback and passed for 68 yards and 1 TD.

30-YEAR-OLD AUSSIE PUNTER COLLECT-ING HONORS ON & OFF THE FIELD

30-year-old Australian punter Trent Schneider had a USF record-setting season in 2019 in which he averaged 46.0 ypp.

Enters 2020 on the Ray Guy Award Watch List for the second straight season and on the William V. Campbell Trophy list, otherwise known as the "Academic Heisman."

■ He owns six USF punting records entering his final campaign and is on pace to own every career mark. He posted a season yardage record with 3,266 punting yards in 2019 and broke the single-game punting average record four times on the year, including 52.8 ypp on five punts in a 27-23 victory over BYU...in 2018, he banged a 72-yard punt vs. East Carolina to set the mark for the longest punt in USF history... he holds the first, second, third and fourth spots for single-game punting average in USF history, all set during the 2019 season...he has recorded 42 punts of 50 yards or longer.

■ Named a 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-American (just the second in program history). He graduated in December of 2019 with a degree in communications and a 4.0 GPA and is pursuing a master's degree in entrepreneurship and applied technologies.

■ He worked construction for eight years before becoming a collegiate punter...enjoys carpentry...played in a rugby league during high school...and was a keeper in soccer.

SECONDARY FEATURES EXPERIENCE

The Bulls returned 10 players in the secondary who lettered in 2019, including four starters who made at least eight starts on the season and two others who made at least three career starts entering the season (Mekhi LaPointe & Vincent Davis).

■ Senior cornerbacks Mike Hampton (24 career starts entering 2020) and KJ Sails (12 starts in 2019) are both Tampa products and will give the Bulls a veteran presence on the edges. Both are potential Jim Thorpe Award candidates. Hampton was a 2018 third team all-conference pick by Phil Steele and recorded 18 passes defended to rank ninth nationally and come one shy of the USF season mark. He is the Bulls' most experienced returner with 24 career starts and 36 games played (every game the last two seasons) entering 2020. Sails earned second-team all-conference honors last season, his first since transfering from North Carolina, and led the team with three interceptions and nine passes defended while being a part of six takeaways.

■ Junior **Bentlee Sanders** (10 career starts entering 2020) returnz after playing a major role last year at safety and nickel. Sanders made eight starts last year and posted 40 tackles, an interception and 4.5 TFL.

VETERAN SPENCER LEADS DEFENSE

The old man of the staff at all of 55, Glenn Spencer comes to USF after one season leading the FAU defense, seven leading Oklahoma State's defense (10 overall at OSU) and one leading Charlotte's. His Owls squad improved more than 40 spots in 10 national defensive rankings.

SEEKING OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

The Bulls struggled offensively in 2019, ranking 112th in total (330 ypg) and 115th in scoring (20.8) offense in 2019. USF graduated its leading rusher (Jordan Cronkrite) and leading receiver (Mitch Wilcox) from that team and the Bulls' top returning rusher and receiver each posted less than 370 yards. Quarterback Jordan McCloud passed for 1,429 yards, 12 TD and 8 INT and will be challenged by transfer QB Cade Fortin, who comes from North Carolina, and Noah Johnson, a transfer from Alcorn State who was the 2018 SWAC Offensive Player of the Year.

FORMER BULLS NEMESIS PAT WHITE TO LEAD BULLS RUNNING BACKS

New USF running backs coach Pat White is well known to Bulls fans. The former West Virginia quarterback, and twotime Big EAST Offensive Player of the Year, started four games vs. USF during an illustrious career that saw him garner two top seven finishes in Heisman Trophy voting (2007 & 2008) and finish with 10,531 total yards and 103 TD. He went 2-2 in starts vs. USF.

1) He won his first meeting vs. the Bulls in Raymond James Stadium, leading WVU to a 28-12 victory in 2005 while posting 266 total yards and three TD.

2) No. 7 ranked West Virginia fell to the Bulls, 24-19, in Morgantown in 2006 as USF forced four turnovers, including a strip sack of White by George Selvie that he returned for a TD and 7-6 Bulls lead.

3) White's return to Ray Jay marked one of the most memorable nights in USF history as 67,012 turned out (the second largest home crowd in program history) to see USF post a 21-3 victory over No. 5 WVU in 2007. Ben Moffitt returned an interception of White for a touchdown before White was knocked out of the game in the second quarter. He would later lead WVU to a No. 1 national ranking.

4) In White's final WVU home game of his career, he led the Mountaineers to a 13-7 victory over USF.

JUNIOR LINEBACKERS RISING

Dwayne Boyles and Antonio Grier entered their junior campaigns among the most productive Bulls returners. The pair combined to post 21 TFL and 7.0 sacks last year while ranking among the top six in tackles. Boyles led USF with 75 tackles and 12.5 TFL, while Grier led USF with 4.0 sacks and added 58 tackles and 8.5 TFL. They are two of the Bulls' top three returning tacklers and the top returners in TFL and sacks. Boyles started 10 games and Grier 6 in 2019.

LEFT SIDE RETURNS

The Bulls offensive line will have a familiar and well acquainted cast on the left side as two-year, junior starters Donovan Jennings (LT), Demetris Harris (LG) and Brad Cecil (C) return. The trio has played alongside each other for two seasons, posting a combined 57 starts. Harris is behind only DB Mike Hampton as the Bulls' most experienced returners entering 2020 with 23 career starts. Cecil (19) and Jennings (15) also rank among the top seven most veteran Bulls entering 2020.

EARLY ENROLLEES

The Bulls had four early enrollees join the roster in the spring, two transfers and two high school recruits. Quarterback Cade Fortin (North Carolina) has three years of eligibility as he battles for the starting job. Fortin started two games and played in four as a true freshman at UNC. Darrian Felix (Oregon) joined the Bulls stable of backs after running for nearly 400 yards and three TD in two years as a Duck. Freshman wide receiver Omarion Dollison, who posted 86 receptions for 1,621 yards (18.8 ypr) and 21 touchdowns at Gray Collegiate Academy in South Carolina, and defensive back Chris Townsel, who led Dearfield Beach to three state semifinals, were also on campus this spring.

TOP RETURNERS

USF will look to build around the following significant returners from the 2019 team.

OFFENSE:

Sophomore guarterback Jordan McCloud started 10 games in his first season on the field and passed for 1,429 yards & 12 TD while running for 283 yards and a team-high 4 TD.

Junior wide receiver Randall St. Felix led USF with 679 yards and 4 TD in 2018 as a freshman, averaging 20.6 ypc. He is the Bulls' top returning receiver from 2019, having logged 22 catches for 261 yards and 2 TD while his ypc declined to 11.9. Senior tight end Jacob Mathis emerged in 2019,

logging 13 catches for 202 yards and two touchdowns, as did junior wide receiver Bryce Miller, who posted 21 catches for 232 yards and 4 TD.

Sophomore running back Kelley Joiner Jr. ran for 364 yards in 2019, including 115 vs. Memphis, while sophomore running back Johnny Ford posted 787 yards and 8 TD in 2018 and returns after playing in just four games in 2019 and logging 103 yards and 13 receptions.

Offensive line starters Brad Cecil (C, 19 career starts), Donovan Jennings (LT, 15 career starts) & Demetris Harris (LG, 23 career starts) have played alongside each other for two seasons.

DEFENSE:

Junior linebacker Dwayne Boyles Jr. led USF with 75 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss while adding three sacks in his second season of significant action and first as a starter. Fellow junior linebacker Antonio Grier Jr. led the Bulls with 4.0 sacks and added 8.5 TFL and 58 sacks in 2019.

Senior cornerbacks KJ Sails and Mike Hampton give the Bulls a formidable and experienced presence on the corners. Sails led USF with three interceptions and nine passes defended in his first year after transferring from North Carolina. Hampton led the Bulls with 18 passes defended in 2018 to earn honorable mention all-conference. He posted six in 2019 to go with 50 tackles.

■ Junior safety Nick Roberts has made 23 career starts and was fourth on the team with 63 tackles while adding two interceptions and seven passes defended in 2019. He led the Bulls with three inter-

ceptions and added 72 tackles in 2018.

Junior nickelback **Bentlee Sanders** started eight games in 2019 and posted 40 tackles, 4.5 TFL an interception and two forced fumbles. SPECIAL TEAMS:

Punter Trent Schneider is a two-time Ray Guy Award nominee and owns six USF punting records, including setting the mark for season average last year at 46.0 ypp.

SIGNIFICANT LOSSES

USF will look to replace the following significant losses from the 2019 team.

OFFENSE:

■ Quarterback Blake Barnett played in just five games in 2019 after passing for 2,710 yards in his first season with the Bulls in 2018.

Running back Jordan Cronkrite posted a 1,000yard season in his first campaign with the Bulls in 2018. He ran for a team-best 687 yards and 4 TD in 2019, logging three 100-yard games.

■ Tight end Mitchell Wilcox was a three-time allconference honoree and set nearly every tight end record in program history. He led the Bulls with 28 catches for 350 yards and 5 TD in 2019.

■ Offensive linemen William Atterbury (G) and Marcus Norman (T) departed the program with 39 and 46 starts, respectively, having played alongside each other for three seasons.

DEFENSE:

Safety **Devin Studstill** ranked second on the team with 74 tackles and added 4.0 TFL and interception and two fumble recoveries in his first and only season with the Bulls.

Linebacker Patrick Macon was third on the team with 67 tackles and added 8.0 TFL in his first and only season with the Bulls.

Defensive ends Greg Reaves and Kirk Livingstone were stalwarts for the Bulls for the past three seasons on the D-line. Reaves posted 63 tackles, 10.0 TFL and 4.0 sacks to go with an interception and two fumble recoveries in 2019. Livingstone posted 38 tackles, 10.0 TFL and 3.0 sacks and also recorded two fumble recoveries.

Scott helped lead the Clemson to five straight College Football Playoff appearances, four CFP Championship games and national titles in the 2016 and 2018 seasons while coaching in nine CFP games and posting a 6-3 record.

HEAD COACH JEFF SCOTT 1st Season at USF/1st Season Overall Clemson, 2003

Named the fifth head coach in USF football history on Dec. 9, 2019, Jeff Scott was one of the most respected coordinators and recruiters in the nation when he took over the Bulls program.

Having served as the co-offensive coordinator at Clemson since 2015 and as a member of the Tigers' football staff at his alma mater since 2008, Scott was a key part of the rise of one of the most dominant football programs in the nation. He helped lead the Tigers to five straight College Football Playoff appearances, four CFP Championship game appearances (2015, 2016, 2018 & 2019 seasons) and national titles in the 2016 and 2018 seasons while coaching in nine CFP Playoff games and posting a 6-3 record. Scott returns to a home field in Raymond James Stadium where Clemson scored 21 fourth-quarter points to defeat Alabama, 35-31, in the CFP National Championship game on Jan. 9, 2017 to claim the program's first national title in 35 years.

SCOTT NOTABLES CHAMPIONSHIP COORDINATOR

▶ In his five seasons serving as co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach, Clemson posted a 70-5 record and claimed five ACC championships.

 Clemson finished the 2019 season ranked No. 4 nationally in scoring offense (43.9 ppg) and No. 5 in total offense (528.7 ypg).

During his stint as co-offensive coordinator, the Tigers went 70-5 (38-2 in the ACC) with just two regular season losses and posted the four winningest seasons in program history (2018 (15-0), 2019 (14-1), 2015 (14-1), 2016 (14-1)).

Clemson averaged 40 points and 500 yards per game, while Tigers quarterbacks completed better than 66 percent of their passes. Clemson averaged better than 500 yards per game in four seasons and set 138 team and individual records, including marks for total offense (527.2 ypg), scoring offense (44.3 ppg), passing offense (5,009 yards), rushing offense (3,723 yards) and touchdowns (90).

▶ The top three total offense seasons in program history came with Scott as co-offensive coordinator, as did the top three scoring seasons, all with 577 points or better.

FLORIDA & COACHING IN THE BLOOD

▶ Born in Arcadia, Fla., just an hour and a half south (93 miles) of the USF campus.

Scott's father, Brad, a 1979 graduate of USF, coached high school football in the state and spent 11 years as an assistant coach to Bobby Bowden at Florida State, including the last four as offensive coordinator and claiming the 1993 national title.

▶ During his father's tenure at Florida State, Scott attended elementary school across the street from the FSU practice fields and joined his father at practice after school.

AT HOME IN RAY JAY

Scott returns to a home field in Raymond James Stadium where Clemson scored 21 fourth-quarter points to defeat Alabama, 35-31, in the CFP National Championship game on Jan. 9, 2017 to claim the program's first national title in 35 years.

PRODUCING NFL PLAYERS

▶ Eight wide receivers Scott coached were on 2019 NFL rosters, including Bay area products, Ray Ray McCloud, Deon Cain and Artavis Scott.

▶ He coached Fort Myers, Fla., product Sammy Watkins, a two-time All-American who set school season records for receptions (101), receiving yards (1,464) and touchdowns (12) and career marks for receptions (240), receiving yards (3,391) and receiving touchdowns (27) before being selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.

▶ Under Scott, DeAndre Hopkins earned second-team All-America honors before selection in the first round of the NFL Draft and going on to make four Pro Bowls.

ELITE RECRUITER

 Scott was Clemson's recruiting coordinator 2008-14, leading the Tigers to top-10 ranked classes in his first season of 2009 and also in 2011 and 2012.

▶ He was named a top-10 recruiter nationally by ESPN.com (2014), a top 25 national recruiter seven times by Rivals.com (2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019) and the ACC Recruiter of the Year in 2015 by Rivals and in 2018 by 247Sports.

TAMPA - All three phases of the game helped make Jeff Scott a big winner in his collegiate head coaching debut, as the Bulls opened the 2020 season with a 27-6 victory over The Citadel on Saturday night in Raymond James Stadium.

Minus three starters on the offensive line, USF's rushing attack motored along with 302 yards (7.7 ypc) and two touchdowns. Kelley Joiner Jr. led the way with eight carries for 87 yards (10.9 ypc) and a touchdown. Johnny Ford added 71 yards on nine attempts (7.9 ypc). USF didn't turn the ball over once while running 64 offensive plays on a rainy night in the Bay.

Grad transfer quarterback Noah Johnson had an impressive USF debut, rushing seven times for 49 yards (7.0 ypc) and a touchdown, completing three of four passes for 24 yards and leading two scoring drives. Starter Jordan McCloud completed 11 of 16 passes for 68 yards and a touchdown in a game that saw USF play three quarterbacks.

New coordinator Glenn Spencer's defense performed well against The Citadel's triple option, shutting the Bulldogs out in the second half and totaling two of USF's three takeaways. Meanwhile on special teams, freshman Omarion Dollison tied the record for the shortest punt return touchdown in NCAA history by hauling in a muffed punt in The Citadel's end zone that helped the Bulls take a 20-6 lead into halftime.

KEY NOTES

- Jeff Scott, the fifth head coach in USF history, became the fourth Bulls head coach to win in his debut with the program.
- USF started its 24th football season and improved to 18-6 all-time in season openers.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. - Underdog USF couldn't rekindle the magic of its 2011 upset win at Notre Dame, falling to the seventh-ranked Irish, 52-0, in the second game of the all-time series on Saturday afternoon.

National title contender Notre Dame scored touchdowns on each of its first four drives and took a 35-0 lead into halftime. The Irish rushed for six touchdowns - one with just 2:15 remaining - in their 20th straight home victory.

Sophomore back Johnny Ford shined once again on a tough day all around for USF, rushing for a team-high 70 yards on six carries (11.7). Two of Ford's runs went for 42 and 22 yards on two of the Bulls' five trips inside Irish territory that didn't result in points. Four of those drives were generated in the second half.

Starting quarterback Jordan McCloud completed 8 of 14 passes for 64 yards and averaged 4.2 yards on five carries. USF played four different quarterbacks and finished with 231 total yards of offense.

KEY NOTES

Saturday marked the second game in the all-time series between USF and Notre Dame. The Bulls posted a 23-20 victory in the schools' first-ever meeting at Notre Dame Stadium in 2011. The new three-game series, which was announced this August, will continue with Notre Dame traveling to Tampa for the first time and USF returning to South Bend on dates still to be determined.

USF headed into Saturday leading the nation with a plus-3 turnover margin. The Bulls forced two fumbles against the Irish but didn't record a takeaway and again didn't turn the ball over of offense.

CINCINNATI - USF's inability to find a spark on offense spoiled a season high four-takeaway effort by the Bulls' shorthanded defense in a 28-7 loss at No. 15 Cincinnati to open American Athletic Conference play on Saturday.

USF staved within one score until the final minute of the first half thanks to interceptions by freshmen Mac Harris and Christopher Townsel, and a fumble recovery by Thad Mangum.

The Bulls were without 12 unavailable players (four starters), including eight on defense in the program's second straight game against a top-15 team. Second-team DB Brock Nichols stepped up in the second half by hauling in USF's third interception of the day.

USF's offense turned the ball over five times after having zero turnovers the first two games. Still trying to find their rhythm, the Bulls didn't get on the scoreboard until Johnny Ford's 2-yard touchdown run in the final minute of the third quarter. Ford produced once again with 150 all-purpose yards, including 95 on kickoffs after a 70-yard return in the first half.

USF played three QBs for the third straight game and Jordan McCloud led the way, completing 12 of 21 passes for 137 yards in the second half and his 18-yard reception on a trick play on fourth-and-14 set up Ford's score.

KEY NOTES

No. 15 Cincinnati marked USF's fourth top-20 ranked opponent in the program's past six games, dating back to last season. The Bulls took on back-to-back top 15-ranked foes on the road for the second time in school history.

Trying to solidify his status as the starter, McCloud set career highs with 26 completions for 298 yards on the night. The Tampa native completed 74 of percent of his 35 attempts and found a productive target often in Latrell Williams, who set career bests with eight receptions for 93 yards to lead all receivers. Sharp McCloud completed 19 of 26 passes for 243 yards in the first half and had four 20-plus yard throws before the break.

Running back Johnny Ford added to his stellar sophomore season with two rushing touchdowns, including an 8-yard score that put the Bulls ahead in the first quarter. Ford's second touchdown with 4:59 left in the first half helped get USF within 10 of ECU, which controlled the momentum the rest of the game.

PHILADELPHIA - Jordan McCloud's third touchdown pass of the day helped the Bulls build an 11-point lead late in the third quarter, but Temple scored 19 unanswered to hand USF a heartbreaking 39-37 loss at Lincoln Financial Field.

Following the scoring surge by Temple that gave the Owls the lead, the Bulls answered back with a 1-yard touchdown run by Leonard Parker with just 1:03 remaining that cut the lead to two. USF was unsuccessful on a potential game-tying two-point conversion attempt and didn't get the ball back until the final play.

McCloud completed 15 of 26 passes for 182 yards and matched his career high with three touchdown tosses. He found Randall St. Felix and DeVontres Odoms-Dukes for scores in a first half that saw the Bulls take a 21-17 lead.

Making his first start of the season, running back Johnny Ford caught a 13-yard touchdown pass from McCloud in the third quarter and finished another impressive performance with 206 all-purpose yards. Ford led the Bulls with 68 rushing yards (4.5 ypc), five catches for 54 yards (10.8 ypc) and returned three kickoffs for 84 yards (28.0 ypr), with a long of 44 yards.

Interceptions by Mekhi LaPointe and Daquan Evans highlighted a gritty defensive effort by USF, which forced multiple turnovers for the third time this season.
