Florida's Week 1-leading 400 rushing yards in its win over FAU marked the most in a season opener in program history, breaking the previous record of 369 rushing yards vs. Charleston Southern in 2009. The Gators' 400 yards on the ground also represents the team's most in a single game under Dan Mullen (2018-present) and the most overall since 2011.

THE STORYLINE

- Florida faces USF for just the second time in school history on the 11th anniversary of their first-ever meeting.
- The Gators prevailed, 38-14, vs. USF in 2010 thanks to 139 yards and one TD from RB Jeff Demps and a 172-yard, two TD game (18-for-31) by QB John Brantley.
- Florida is 3-0 in road openers under **Dan Mullen** and enters Saturday's matchup having won four-straight road openers.
- The Gators are 13-3 in road openers dating back to 2005 and 15-4 in such games since the end of the Steve Spurrier era (2002 - present).
- Florida is 10-2 in true-road games under Mullen (2018: 4-0 | 2019: 3-1 | 2020: 3-1). Mullen is 34-22 on the road as a HC.
- A win for the Gators against USF would represent Mullen's 100th career win as a head coach.
 - » Florida (2018-21): 30-9 | Mississippi State (2009-17): 69-46
- Florida won its 32nd-consecutive home opener with its Week 1 win over FAU -- the longest such streak in the nation.
- The Gators have opened the season 1-0 in all but one season dating back to 1990 (2017: L, 33-17 vs. Michigan).
 - » Florida is looking to start 2-0 for the third-straight season under Mullen.

GATORS HIT ROAD AFTER HISTORIC RUSHING NIGHT

- In setting a new program record for rushing yards in a season opener with 400 rushing yards in Week 1, Florida posted its most rushing yards in a single game since Sept. 24, 2011 vs. Kentucky and the third-most in a single game dating back to at least 1996.
 - » Florida leads the country with 400 rush YPG and ranks fourth nationally in total rushing yards.
- Florida's 8.7 yards per carry (400 yards on 46 rush attempts) was the team's highest mark in a single game since averaging 9.3 YPC (331 yards on 35 rush attempts) vs. Vanderbilt on 10/13/12. Florida's 8.7 YPC ranks fourth nationally.
- Quarterback **Anthony Richardson** (160 yards on seven carries) and running back **Malik Davis** (104 yards on 14 carries) became Florida's first pair of 100-yard rushers since Nov. 10, 2018 vs. South Carolina (Jordan Scarlett & La'Mical Perine).
 - » Second time in program history the Gators have had two 100-yard rushers with one being a quarterback, with the prior existence being the 2009 National Championship victory vs. Oklahoma (Percy Harvin & Tim Tebow).
 - » Florida is one of eight programs with two 100+ yards rushers in a game this season and one of three SEC schools to do so. Richardson and Davis' 264 combined rush yards is the second most of that group.
- Davis and Richardson both became the first Gators players to rush for over 100 yards in a season opener since Mack Brown in 2013 (24-6 win vs. Toledo on Aug. 31).

MULLEN'S OFFENSE PICKS UP WHERE IT LEFT OFF

- In Week 1, Florida posted its 15th game of 500-plus total yards in Dan Mullen's 39 games as head coach, topping the team's combined total of 14 such games from the 115 games comprising the 2009-17 seasons.
- Florida amassed 400-plus total yards for the 26th time under Mullen, topping the program's total of 25 400-yard outings from the 88 games comprising the 2011-17 seasons.
 - » Florida now has 11-consecutive games of 400-plus total yards for the first time since at least 1981.
 - » The Gators have eclipsed 400 total yards in 24 of their last 30 games.
- The Gators have scored 30+ points 27 times in 39 games under Mullen, including scoring 30+ in 14 of the team's last 15 games.
- Florida's historic 400-yard rushing night vs. FAU marked the program's 30th 100+ yard rushing game and 14th 200+ yard rushing game under Mullen.
 - » The Gators totaled 300+ yards rushing for just the second time under Mullen.
 - » Previous: 367 vs. South Carolina on Nov. 10, 2018
- In addition to being the program's highest mark since 2012, Florida's 8.7 YPC in Week 1 was the program's sixth-highest mark dating back to at least 1996.
- Florida's 35.9 points per game since the start of the 2018 season ranks sixth among Power Five programs and 12th in the FBS. From 2015-17, UF ranked 110th nationally and averaged just 23.1 points per game.
- Under Mullen (2018-present), the Gators have averaged 456.8 yards per game, which ranks 11th in the Power Five and 17th in the FBS.
- Florida's 168 scrimmage touchdowns since the start of the 2018 season ranks third in the SEC, sixth in the Power Five and 11th in the FBS.

ADDITIONAL NOTES ON UF'S WEEK 1 RUSHING ATTACK

- "We've done it before. We are going to do what our guys do well, that's what it is. Honestly, I would love to continue to be balanced. We ran it a bit more that we threw today, 46 runs and 35 passes, but some of those were scrambles too. I think you're able to stay balanced, but our explosive plays came on the ground and so we got to look at that a little bit. Are we taking the shots down the field to be explosive in the pass game as well? We're going to do what we're going to do, if we need to lead the nation in rushing, we'll do that. We are going to do what our guys do well."

- Week 1 marked the first time under Mullen that Florida posted **2.5 times** more rushing yards than passing yards in a single game, with the last such occurrence coming on Oct. 28, 2017 vs. Georgia (L, 42-7).
- Richardson's 73-yard touchdown rush is the longest rush by a Florida quarterback since Trey Burton ripped off an 80-yard run vs. Tennessee in 2012.
 - » Richardson became the third Florida quarterback to rush for 100 yards since 1996 and the first since Jeff Driskel on Oct. 13, 2012 at Vanderbilt.
 - » Tim Tebow accomplished the feat five times and Driskel accomplished it once.

INDIVIDUAL OFFENSIVE NOTES

- After Week 1, Florida's Richardson ranks first among all FBS quarterbacks in both rushing yards and rushing YPG.
 - » Richardson and quarterback **Emory Jones** both rank inside the top-five quarterbacks in the FBS in rushing YPG, as Jones sits at fifth on that list with 74 rushing yards in Week 1.
 - » Richardson ranks 13th nationally among all positions in rushing YPG and 16th in total rushing yards.
- Florida wide receiver **Rick Wells** recorded his first-career touchdown with a 9-yard touchdown reception from Jones in the first quarter vs. FAU.
- Running back **Dameon Pierce** caught a career-high five passes in Week 1 vs. FAU.
- Wide receiver **Ja'Markis Weston** set new career highs in receptions (three), receiving yards (44) and longest reception (36 yards) vs. FAU.
- Running back **Malik Davis** registered the second 100-yard rushing game of his career with the 104-yard game in Week 1.
 - » Davis eclipsed 200 career carries and 1,000 career rushing yards in the game.
- Richardson set new career highs in rushing yards (160) and passing yards (40).



INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE + SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **Mordecai McDaniel** set a new-career high with six tackles in Week 1.
- Eight players recorded their first-career tackles as a Gator in Week 1: **Jason Marshall Jr., Donovan McMillon, Daquan Newkirk, Jadarius Perkins, Tyrone Truesdale, Antonio Valentino, Desmond Watson** and **Rick Wells**.
 - » Marshall Jr., McMillon, Watson and Wells all registered the first tackles of their careers.
- Kicker **Chris Howard** remains perfect in 16 PAT tries over the course of his Florida career.
- Five Gators made their first-career starts at Florida in Week 1.
 - » **Avery Helm, Tre'Vez Johnson, Mordecai McDaniel, Daquan Newkirk** and **Antonio Valentino**



FLIPPING THE DEFENSIVE SCRIPT

- Florida's defense, which in 2020 ranked 74th in the FBS in points allowed per game (30.8), proved to be on the right path during the Gators season opener against FAU, holding the Owls scoreless until halfway through fourth quarter.
- The Gators' 14 points allowed against the Owls is the team's second-fewest total in a game dating back to November of 2019. UF allowed fewer points just once last season, beating Kentucky at home by a score of 34-10.
- After ranking tied-for-eighth in the FBS and second in the SEC with 34 sacks last season, the Gators got to the quarterback six times against FAU – tying the team high from the 2020 season.
- Florida's 126 sacks since Mullen's debut 2018 season rank first in the SEC and third nationally – trailing only Clemson (148) and Pittsburgh (134).
- The Gators recorded two fumble recoveries against FAU raised Florida's total to 67 takeaways since 2018, which rank tied-ninth nationally and third in the SEC.
- After leading the team with 88 tackles in 2020, linebacker **Ventrell Miller** opened the season as Florida's leading tackler with seven in Week 1.
- Zachary Carter set a career high with three sacks in Week 1, becoming the first Gator with three sacks in a single game since Jonathan Greenard (vs. FSU) and Mohamoud Diabate (vs. Vanderbilt) accomplished the feat in 2019.
- Gervon Dexter's pair of fumble recoveries marked the first two of his career.
- Graduate-transfer additions Valentino (Penn State) and Newkirk (Auburn) both made their Gator debuts, starting at nose tackle and defensive tackle, respectively.

[S]ACK CARTER LIVES UP TO HIS NAME



- **Zachary Carter** set a career high with three sacks in Week 1. Carter became the first Gator with three sacks in a single game since Jonathan Greenard (vs. FSU) and Mohamoud Diabate (Vanderbilt) accomplished the feat in 2019.
- Carter's first-quarter sack vs. FAU that resulted in a forced fumble gave him double-digit sacks for his career. He now has 12.5 career sacks and 20.5 tackles for loss.
- His three sacks against FAU rank tied for second in the FBS in sacks and second in sack yards. In the SEC, Carter ranks second in both sacks and sack yards.

- In 2020, Florida logged the **10th season in school history in which it averaged 300-plus passing yards per game** (2019, 2001, 2000, 1998, 1996, 1995, 1994, 1993, 1991).

Despite being without each of the team's top-three receivers from 2020, Florida returns 13 of 16 players who caught at least one pass last year.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSIVE FRONT IS LOADED

In addition to Zack Carter's performance against FAU, sophomore **Gervon Dexter** added a stellar outing for the Gators' front.

Dexter recovered a pair of fumbles, marking the first two of his career, and added two tackles.

For the second year in a row, Dexter opened his season with an unprecedented performance. During his collegiate debut in 2020, Dexter recorded an interception during Florida's season opener at Ole Miss.



Meanwhile, graduate-transfer additions **Antonio Valentino** (Penn State) and **Daquan Newkirk** (Auburn) both made their Gator debuts, starting at nose tackle and defensive tackle, respectively.

The duo contributed for a combined total of three tackles and two quarterback hurries during Week 1.

Valentino totaled two stops (solo) and one quarterback hurry, while Newkirk contributed one tackle and a QB hurry.

Prior to Florida, Valentino earned Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors in 2020, starting all nine games with 14 tackles (five solo), 4.5 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, one forced fumble, two QB hurries and one pass breakup.



Meanwhile, Newkirk tallied 40 tackles, 5.0 TFLs, and 2.5 sacks and one forced fumble across 30 career games at Auburn, including 28 tackles (eight solo), 3.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks in 2020.

Prior to the season opener, Florida added graduate transfer **Tyrone Truesdell**, who appeared in 44 games with Auburn, totaling 67 tackles, 9.0 tackles-for-loss and 3.0 sacks and two fumble recoveries.

PRESEASON PUB

The Gators had four representatives on the Media's Preseason All-SEC Team: DL Zachary Carter (first team), DB Kaiir Elam (first), LB Ventrell Miller (second) and WR Jacob Copeland (third).

Carter, Elam and Miller all garnered preseason recognition for the second-straight season after receiving second team honors at their respective positions in 2020.

Elam was named to the Coaches All-SEC First Team and AP Second Team as a defensive back in 2020 after finishing with 39 tackles (28 solo), 11 pass breakups and two interceptions.

Florida also saw five Gators combine to appear on seven different NCFAA Watch Lists heading into the season.

ADDITIONAL ACTIVE / HISTORICAL STREAKS

UF has scored in 411-consecutive games -- which is an NCAA record. The Gators broke Michigan's record of 365-consecutive games (1984-2014) against LSU on Oct. 7, 2017.

UF has 11-consecutive games of 400-plus total yards for the first time since at least 1981. UF also has at least seven-straight 400-yard outings against SEC teams for the first time in school history.

UF has finished with fewer than 10 penalties in 33 consecutive games. Dating back to the start of 2019, UF has been charged with five or fewer penalties in 15 of their 25 games, including nine of the last 14.

Since 2008, Florida and Alabama are the only FBS teams that have not lost to a team which finished the season with a losing record. Florida's last such loss was against Mississippi State (3-9) in 2004.

- After finishing as the nation's No. 1 passing offense last season, the Gators opened up the 2021 season as the leading rushing offense with 400 rushing yards per game.
 - » This is the second-straight time Florida led the SEC in rushing yards after week one - recorded 196 yards vs. Ole Miss in 2020.
- Last year, Florida broke its previous record for passing yards in a season opener with 446 vs. Ole Miss, meaning the Gators have broken the record for most rushing yards and most passing yards in a season opener over the last two seasons under Mullen.

- Florida assistant coaches have faced Jeff Scott multiple times as assistant and are 3-10 lifetime.
- USF Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks coach Charlie Weis Jr. was a quality control coach at Florida in 2011.
- Florida's **David Turner** was the defensive tackle/linebackers coach for Virginia when the Cavaliers played Jeff Scott in 2002 when he was a senior WR for Clemson.
- USF cornerbacks coach George Barlow was on the Oklahoma coaching staff when former UF quarterbacks coach **Garrick McGree** played for the Sooners in 1996.
- The Gators have seven players from Tampa while South Florida has zero from Gainesville.
- Florida's **Austin Barber** ('21) and **Marcus Burke** ('21), and USF's CJ Ross ('21) all attended Trinity Christian Academy and helped the school reach the 3A state championship game last season.
- Gator **Jeremy Crawshaw** ('20) and USF Andrew Stokes both were born in Australia and attended ProKick Australia.

- Dan Mullen's 29-9 record through 38 games is the third-best start in school history behind only Steve Spurrier (30-8) and Urban Meyer (31-7).
- In 2020, UF beat four SEC opponents by at least 20 points for the first time since 2008 (seven times).

Offensive Upticks Continued in Mullen's Second Act

- Florida recorded seven games of 500-plus total yards in Mullen's first two seasons. In 75 games from 2012-17, UF had six 500-yard outings.
- Florida recorded 14 games of 400-plus total yards in Mullen's first 26 games as head coach. In the program's 50 games from 2014-17, UF had 400-plus yards just 14 times.
- The Gators had eight games of 400-plus total yards in 2019, their most such games in a season since 2008 -- Mullen's final year as O.C. -- when they did it 10 times.
- UF scored 40-plus points nine times in Mullen's first 26 games (three in 2019, six in 2018). In the 88 games spanning 2011-17, Florida scored 40 points on nine occasions.
- UF scored 105 offensive touchdowns in Mullen's first 26 games. In the three seasons prior to his arrival (2015-17), the Gators scored 93 offensive touchdowns in 38 games.

Mullen Revived Florida's Offense in Debut Season

- The Gators finished in the top 100 in scoring offense for the first time since 2014. They had not finished higher than 96th in total offense since 2010 (when they were 83rd), and their only passing offense to rank higher than 85th following the 2009 season checked in at 79th (2016).
- Florida's averages in each of the following categories were also its highest since 2009: scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense (and average), touchdown-interception ratio, passing touchdowns, and scrimmage touchdowns.

- Florida also had its most games of 500-plus total yards (four), 400-plus total yards (six), and 350-plus total yards (10) since 2009, when it had five, six, and 10, respectively.

- Mullen joined Stanford's Chuck Shaughnessy (1-7-1 in 1939; 10-0 in 1940) and Auburn's Gus Malzahn (3-9 in 2012; 12-2 in 2013) as the only other head coaches in history to win 10 games in a debut season at a current Power Five program after inheriting a team that won less than five games the year prior.
- Oversaw the second-highest wins turnaround in school history (4-7 to 10-3 / +6), with it only being behind the 1980 Gators, who went 8-4 following a 0-10-1 campaign in 1979.

In Perspective: Mullen's Mississippi State Turnaround

- Mullen took over in Starkville with the Bulldogs coming off a 4-8 season and a nine-season stretch from 2000-08 in which they went 37-69 and made just two bowl appearances.
- The Bulldogs went 69-46 overall, 33-39 in SEC play, and made eight bowl games in Mullen's nine seasons as head coach. Of his losses, 34 (or 74 percent of them) were to ranked opponents.

- Mullen made Mississippi State one of 11 FBS programs to produce six different 1,000-yard rushers from 2009-17. The others were: Auburn (9), Nevada (7), Alabama (6), Army (6), Baylor (6), Boise State (6), Georgia Tech (6), Navy (6), Ohio State (6), and Wisconsin (6).



DAN MULLEN - FLORIDA HEAD COACH

- Mississippi State produced 26 NFL Draft picks in Mullen's tenure, including a pair of first-rounders. From 1996 through 2008, MSU had 27 NFL Draft picks.
- Seven of MSU's top nine (and all of its top four) highest total offense per game season averages were produced with Mullen as head coach
- MSU broke over 112 game, season, and career school records under Mullen.

In Perspective: Mullen Takes Mississippi State to No. 1

- Mullen led Mississippi State to a 9-0 start in 2014, allowing the Bulldogs to secure the No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 for a five-week stretch from Oct. 12 through Nov. 9.
- MSU held the No. 1 ranking until after a 25-20 loss at No. 4 Alabama on Nov. 15.
- Since 2001, only 16 FBS programs -- predominantly "blueblood" schools -- have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25. **And 11 of those 16 were ranked No. 1 in the AP Top 25 at least five weeks:** Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Florida State, LSU, Miami, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Ohio State, Oregon, and Southern California.
- Since 2013, only six FBS programs have been the No. 1 team in the AP Top 25.**

In Perspective: Mullen as Florida's O.C.

- During Mullen's four seasons as the Gators offensive coordinator (2005-08), UF ranked 3rd in passer rating (155.9), 8th in scoring offense (36.3), 15th in total offense (418.9), 21st in rushing offense (185.6), 39th in passing offense (233.2).
- Coordinated an offense that ranked 4th nationally in points per game (43.6--also fourth in school history) and 15th in yards per game (445.1), eventually helping the Gators win the 2009 BCS National Championship Game.
- Coordinated a Gators offense that scored 41 points to rout Ohio State--which had the nation's top scoring defense--in the 2007 BCS National Champ. Game.
- Coordinated the 2007 offense to 457.2 total yards per game -- 8th in UF history.
- Helped Chad Jackson garner Biletnikoff Award semifinalist status after he set UF's single-season record with 88 receptions in 2005. Jackson led the SEC and ranked 6th nationally in receptions.
- Also in 2005, center Mike Degory was named a Rimington Trophy finalist.

In Perspective: Mullen's Quarterbacks Track Record

- In 2002 at Bowling Green, Mullen helped Josh Harris account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (41) among FBS players and 3,213 total yards.
- In 2004 at Utah, Mullen helped Alex Smith account for the second-most total touchdowns (42) among FBS players, and amass 3,604 total yards.
- Smith finished fourth in the 2004 Heisman Trophy voting and was the No. 1 pick in 2005 NFL Draft.
- In 2007, Mullen helped Tim Tebow account for the 2nd-most total touchdowns (55 -- an SEC record) among FBS players, and amass 4,181 total yards.
- Tebow was the first quarterback in FBS history to pass for 20+ touchdowns and rush for 20+ touchdowns in a season (2007), and his 2007 season remains the

only one in history of more than 30 passing and 20 rushing touchdowns.

- Tebow won the Heisman Trophy in 2007 (first-ever underclassman winner).
- Tebow's numbers dipped slightly in 2008, but he still ranked 7th nationally in total touchdowns (42) and accounted for 3,419 total yards.
- In 2014, Mullen helped Dak Prescott finish tied for fifth nationally in total touchdowns (42) in 2014, in addition to totaling 4,470 yards (3,449 pass / 986 rush / 35 receiving).
- Prescott was eighth in the Heisman voting and a Maxwell Award finalist in 2014.
- Prescott's rushing production dipped in 2015, but he increased his passing production and finished the season ranked 15th nationally in passing yards (3,793). He also ranked 11th nationally with 39 total touchdowns.
- In 2016, Mullen helped first-year starter Nick Fitzgerald, a redshirt sophomore, tie for 14th nationally with 37 total touchdowns. Fitzgerald also ran for 1,375 yards--ranking 3rd among FBS quarterbacks.
- In 2017, Fitzgerald accounted for 2,766 yards (1,782 passing, 984 rushing) and 29 touchdowns (15 passing, 14 rushing) despite missing nearly all of the Egg Bowl and Mississippi State's bowl game due to a gruesome ankle injury.
- Much of Florida's offensive success in 2018 could be attributed to Feleipe Franks' turnaround, which Mullen engineered. Franks finished the year tied for 17th nationally in touchdown-interception ratio, and his 24 touchdown passes (to six interceptions) were the highest season total since Tim Tebow threw 30 en route to the 2008 national title. Franks threw nine touchdowns and eight interceptions, and ranked 99th nationally with a 113.31 passer rating in 2017.

Chris Harry's Quick Slant

WHAT HAPPENED: The first packed house at Spurrier/Florida Field in more than 21 months probably left the fans wanting more from the home team's new-look offense, but they settled for a 35-14 victory over Florida Atlantic and a long-awaited night of college-football atmosphere with a crowd of 86,840 celebrating the return of the "Swamp." Quarterback Emory Jones, in his first career start (and tasked with replacing 2020 Heisman Trophy finalist Kyle Trask), accounted for 187 yards of offense and passed for a touchdown. Senior tailback Malik Davis rushed for 102 yards and a score, while classmate Dameon Pierce ran for a couple TDs, as the 13th-ranked Gators took care of the Owls on a pretty September football night. Jones, the fourth-year junior from LaGrange, Ga., completed 17 of 27 passes for 113 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions (one coming in the end zone), while rushing 10 times for 74 yards. Redshirt freshman backup Anthony Richardson figures to be a topic of conversation this week, after relieving Jones and leading the Gators on two fourth-quarter touchdown drives, the second coming on his electrifying 73-yard run. Richardson, who ducked in for two series in the first half, completed all three of his seven passes for 40 yards and rushed seven times for 160 yards (all but 28 in the second half). He looked really good, but this was Jones' game all the way, though, and he'll come away from it knowing he and the Florida passing game have a lot of work to do after leading the nation in throwing the ball last season at 378.6 yards per game. Defensively, Florida gave up 351 yards and 23 first downs, but forced a pair of turnovers on the way to flirting with the unit's first shutout since 2019 -- and a year after finishing 89th nationally and allowing 30.8 points per game. UF scored on its first possession, with Jones leading an 11-play, 75-yard drive that ended with Pierce scoring on a 2-yard run. A 9-yard Jones-to-Rick Wells scoring toss gave the Gators a two-touchdown cushion in the first period. Pierce added a 3-yard score in the fourth period and Davis dove over for a 1-yard TD midway through the fourth quarter. The Owls staved off a shutout with an eight-play, 67-yard drive ended with a 2-yard scoring run by Johnny Ford. Florida Atlantic quarterback N'Kosi Perry completed 19 of his 33 passes for 261 yards, with his lone TD passing coming with 1:37 left in the game.

WHAT IT MEANS: Florida had a school-record string of 27 consecutive season-opening victories snapped in 2017 when the Gators fell to Michigan 33-17 in Arlington, Texas. They've now won four straight openers, all under Coach Dan Mullen, with the victory over the Owls the first season-opening home win since 2018. UF kicked off the last two seasons away from home, beating Miami 24-20 at Orlando in 2019 and Ole Miss on the road in 2020. The Gators have won 32 straight home openers, dating to 1990.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: The easy and obvious pick would be Jones vs. Richardson, but Davis had a nice game running the football. Good for him. Davis took a lot of heat (too much, actually) last year for his late fumble at Texas A&M, so to start his fifth-year senior season and answer the call (with runs of 31, 17 and 21 yards in the first half). Davis, with the second 100-yard game of his career, became the first UF back to hit triple-digit rushing in a season opener since Matt Jones had 114 in 2014. On defense, linebacker Jeremiah Moon became the first player in school history to play in six different seasons (2017-22). Moon, who has struggled to stay healthy over his career, was a pass-rushing presence in finishing with six tackles (five in the first half) and a QB hurry.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The communications staff will be sifting through the records this week to find the last time a Florida offense had nearly three times as many rushing yards (400) as passing yards (153) in a game.

UP NEXT: The Gators (1-0) will play a rare nonconference road game (against an opponent other than Florida State) when they travel to Tampa to face South Florida (0-1) at Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls, out of the American Athletic Conference, opened the 2021 season Thursday by getting drilled 45-0 at North Carolina State. The game will mark UF's first regular-season game in Tampa since beating Mississippi State 21 there on Sept. 30, 1989, although the Gators have played in Tampa five times since in the Outback Bowl.

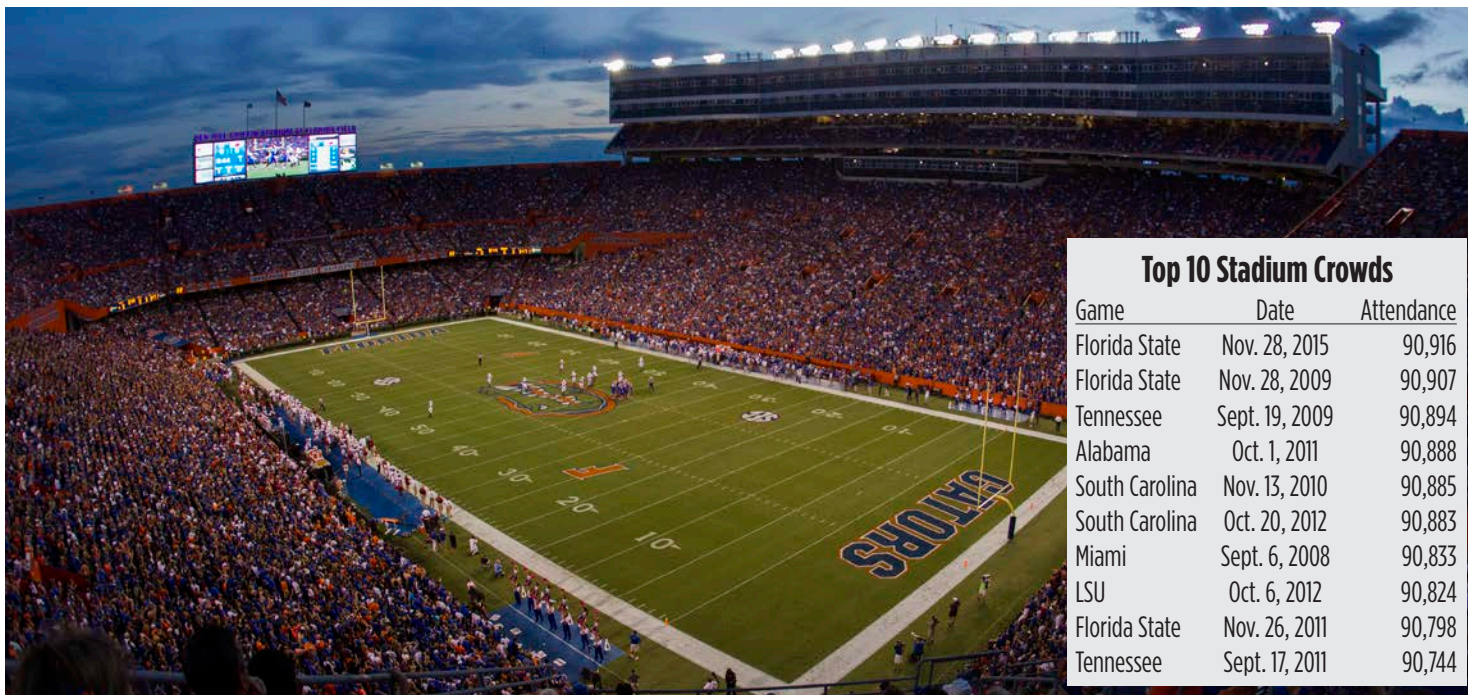

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."
