CINCINNATI RETURNS HOME FOR HOMECOMING MATCHUP WITH USF

- Cincinnati, the two-time defending American Athletic Conference champions, returns home to host South Florida at 2:30 p.m. in a sold-out homecoming that will be televised on ESPN+. UC's first-ever homecoming game came against Marshall in 1934.
- UC has won 29 consecutive games at Nippert Stadium, which is the second-longest home win streak in the country behind Clemson (37). The Bearcats have won 17 straight games against AAC opponents, including the last two AAC Championships.
- Sixth-year head coach Luke Fickell will go for his 53rd win at UC, which would tie Rick Minter for the most in school history.
- The Bearcats are coming off of a 31-21 victory on the road at Tulsa where they tied an AAC-record with 11 sacks, terrorizing Hurricane QB Davis Brin, who entered the game averaging more than 350 pass yards per game, to just 237 yards, zero touchdowns and two interceptions, UC's 11 sacks were the most for UC since 2007 and the 15 TFLs were the most since 2002.
- Cincinnati also got two fourth-down touchdowns from RB Corey Kiner and TE Josh Whyle as UC went 3-fo-3 on fourth down conversions in the conference-opening win.
- Kiner recorded his first career 100-yard rushind game (12-106) and scored a touchdown for the fifth straight game.
- The Blackcats defense was led by Jabari Taylor (2.5 sacks, 3.5 TFLs), LB Deshawn Pace (18-yard pick-six, 1.0 sack) and safety Ja'Von Hicks (1 INT, 3 PBUs).
- USF is 1-4 this season and the Bulls are coming off a 48-28 loss against East Carolina in Boca Raton on Saturday. The Bulls did play Florida close, losing 31-28, in Gainesville earlier this season.

BLACKCATS DEFENSE LEADING THE NATION IN SACKS, TFLS AND DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

- · No defense in the country is wreaking more havoc with big plays than the Bearcats.
- · Cincinnati leads the nation in sacks (23), TFLs (50) and defensive touchdowns (4).
- The Bearcats' 11 sacks at Tulsa are the most against an FBS team this season and tied the AAC record.
- Cincinnati is fifth in the nation in yard per play allowed (3.88) and No. 22 in overall total defense (303.2).

'FIREBALL' IVAN SETS THE PACE

- Senior Ivan Pace Jr. leads the country in tackles for loss with 13.5 four more than the next closest player. The Cincinnati Colerain HS product also ranks No. 2 nationally in sacks (6.0) and No. 5 in tackles (11.2 per game).
- Pace Jr. is closing in on the Top 10 in single-season school history in TFLs (17.5) and sacks (8.0).
- In his last game at Nippert, he was outstanding against Indiana, tallying 15 tackles, 4.5 TFLs (fifth-most in UC history), 2.5 sacks and three QB hurries en route to AAC Defensive Player of the Week and Bednarik National Player of the Week honors.
- PFF College rates him as the country's top linebacker with a 92.7 rating highest of any player at the position in the nation. PFF charts Pace Jr. as having 28 QB hits this season - the most of any player in the nation.
- "He's a fireball," Luke Fickell said. "He goes. I think we are going to continue to use him in different ways but find ways that we can kind of let him go, that's where he's dynamic. We're glad we got him."

- Corey Kiner's 106 rushing yards at Tulsa marked the third different UC running back to rush for 100-yards in a game through five games in 2022, joining Charles McClelland and Myles Montgomery. The last time three different UC running backs each had 100-yard games in a season came in 2018 (Michael Warren, Tavion Thomas, McClelland).
- WR Tyler Scott has six TD receptions to lead the AAC and rank sixth in the nation. The speedster has a TD catch in four straight games. He had 10 catches for 185 yards and three TDs vs. Indiana en route to AAC Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- P Mason Fletcher ranks fifth in the nation in punting average (46.6) and already has 11 punts inside the 20.
- QB Ben Bryant's 13 TD passes rank tied for 14th in the nation, while his 276.6 ypg ranks 27th.
- Backup DT Dontay Corleone is the fifth-rated defender (90.7 grade) in FBS according to PFF College. The redshirt freshman has 3.5 TFLs and two sacks through five games.

BEARCATS RE-LOADING...

- · Led by Luke Fickell, the reigning consensus National Coach of the Year, and 12 returning starters, the Bearcats are the two-time defending AAC Champions and are coming off of a 13-1 season that culminated in a trip to the 2021 College Football Playoff.
- With a 48-8 mark since the start of 2018, Cincinnati's 85.7% winning percentage ranks among the nation's Top 5 in that span.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING...

- UC has won a league title seven times in the last 14 years and has played in 12 bowl games in the past 15 years.
- Cincinnati is 654-596-50 (.522) all-time.
- UC is playing its 135th football season in 2022. The Bearcats program dates to 1885 and is one of the 10 oldest in the FBS.

Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact UC Athletics Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regularseason practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and the first 30 minutes (six periods).

PRESS BOX SERVICES

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via GoBEARCATS.com. At the guarter breaks and halftime, quickie stats and drive charts will be printed and distributed via email. Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, postgame quotes from both head coaches and players and postgame notes.

LIVE STATS

Live in-game statistics will be available via StatBroadcast.

Wireless Internet is available in the press box at Nippert Stadium, Members of the Athletics Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Head Coach Luke Fickell will be available to the media every Tuesday at noon ET during the season with the exception of UC's bye week. The press conference is streamed live on GoBearcats.com. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the UC Sports Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the football page at GoBEARCATS.com to request credentials online.

Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. No credentials will be mailed after Tuesday preceding the game. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located by gate J in the lobby of the Steger Student Life Center.

On gameday, media should park in Clifton Court Garage and enter Nippert Stadium through Gate J.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through UC's Athletics Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

The University of Cincinnati follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

AAC ON ESPN+

In Spring 2019, the AAC and ESPN agreed to a 12-year media rights extension beginning in 2020-21. In football, in addition to The American's games continuing to appear on ESPN networks, select conference-controlled games will be available exclusively on ESPN+.

BEARCATS INSIDER TV SHOW

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Luke Fickell has 52 wins for his career, which is the second-most wins by a coach in UC history - just one behind Rick Minter's record of 53.

Cincinnati leads the country with four defensive touchdowns this season. Defensive linemen Jabari Taylor and Dominique Perry have fumble recovery TDs, while Ja'Von Hicks and Deshawn Pace have pick-sixes.

Eight Bearcats were named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List: QB Ben Bryant, DL Jowon Briggs, CB Arguon Bush, S Ja'von Hicks, OL Lorenz Metz, TE Leonard Taylor, TE Josh Whyle and WR Tre Tucker.

UC has allowed only 18.2 ppg since 2018, which is fourth-fewest in college football. The Bearcats have finished fifth, eighth, 24th and eighth in national scoring defense the last four seasons.

Sophomore running back Corey Kiner has scored a rushing touchdown in five-straight games to begin his UC career after transferring from LSU. He was a four-star recruit in the 2021 class out of Roger Bacon HS.

Junior WR Tyler Scott is a big-play threat. His average TD catch is for 44.0 yards. He has 11 career TDs and all have gone for at least 20 yards. He had a 75-varder vs. Indiana and an 81-yarder vs. Miami in 2021.

Cincinnati leads the nation with 23 sacks through five games. The Bearcats tied an AAC-record with 11 sacks at Tulsa, LB Ivan Pace Jr. leads the Bearcats with six sacks this fall.

HOMETOWN HEROS

- A dozen players from Cincinnati appeared on the seasonopening two-deep on offense and defense.
- 26 players from Ohio are also on the initial two-deep.
- This speaks to head coach Luke Fickell's recruiting philosophy to heavily recruit "the State of Cincinnati" and the 50-mile radius around campus.
- UC also features Cincinnati native and legendary Colerain high school coach Kerry Coombs on staff as the cornerbacks coach and special teams coordinator.

THE FICKELL ERA

- · University of Cincinnati football head coach Luke Fickell has elevated the Bearcats' football team to the top of college football.
- · Hired as the 42nd football head coach in UC history on Dec. 10, 2016, Fickell holds a 52-16 (.765) record in his six years at the helm of Cincinnati.
- His 48-8 mark since 2018 ranks among the Top 5 records in the nation during that span.
- After leading UC to a 13-1 record, a second straight AAC Championship and a College Football Playoff appearance, Fickell collected eight national coach of the year honors in 2021, including the The Home Depot National Coach of the Year, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year, the Stallings Award, the Eddie Robinson Award and the Dodd Trophy as well as accolades from the AFCA, Walter Camp Foundation and Sporting News.
- · Fickell has watched 16 Bearcats earn a selection in the NFL Draft, including a school-record nine draft picks in 2022, and captured AAC Coach of the Year honors three times (2018, 2020, 2021).
- Cincinnati Bearcats four-year football players have a 100% graduation rate since Fickell joined the team as head coach.
- Fickell and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca. twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.

FICKELL JUST TWO WINS AWAY FROM MOST AT UC

Fickell's 52 wins are already the second-most in Cincinnati history and he needs just two wins to surpass Rick Minter as the winningest coach in Cincinnati football history.

48-8 RECORD SINCE 2018 AMONG NATION'S BEST

- · Luke Fickell wasted no time vaulting Cincinnati to among the nation's best programs. After going 4-8 in Year 1 of the Fickell Era in 2017, Cincinnati is 48-8 over the last four seasons, winning 85.7% of its games since 2018 to rank among the top five programs in all of the FBS.
- Of the six different teams Cincinnati has lost to since 2018, five have played in a New Year's Six bowl (Alabama, Georgia, Memphis, UCF, Ohio State).

NATION'S 2ND-LONGEST HOME WINNING STREAK

· Cincinnati has won 29 consecutive games at Nippert Stadium - the second-longest home win streak in the nation, behind only Clemson (37). UC hasn't lost at home since Nov. 10, 2017.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOS PACKING LID IN 2022

- · Cincinnati leads the nation with four defensive touchdowns through the first five games (interceptions by Ja'Von Hicks and Deshawn Pace, fumbles by Jabari Taylor and Dom Perry).
- · UC has 18 under Fickell, all over the last five years. That 2018 squad that had five included scores by thenfreshmen Wilson Huber and Arquon Bush. The 2019 team had four, with two more in 2020 and three in 2021.

RIDDER SETS TO RECORD AT USE IN 2021

- In 2021, the No. 2-ranked Bearcats defeated USF, 45-28, on a Friday night in Tampa as Desmond Ridder set the career TD pass record with a toss to TE Josh Whyle in the third quarter. Tre Tucker also caught a TD and RB Ryan Montgomery tallied two TDs. LB Tv Van Fossen tallied three TFLs and Deshawn Pace had an interception.
- Cincinnati also beat USF for homecoming in 2020, 28-7, with Whyle securing a TD catch and Tucker returning a kickoff 97 yards for a TD. The Bearcats intercepted the Bulls five times in the game.

HUBER FAMILY CAPTAINS

- · Sixth-year senior linebacker Wil Huber already had a master's in finance and a real estate certificate heading into his first year as UC's starting middle linebacker.
- · He added captain to his resume, joining his dad, former UC tight end Daryl Huber (1988 captain), as what is believed to be the first father-son captain duo in Cincinnati football history.
- · Daryl Huber caught 51 passes for 519 yards and two scores from 1985 to 1988.
- Wil Huber has 25 tackles and 3.0 TFLs in 2022.

FLETCHER COLLECTS AAC SPECIAL TEAMS AWARD

- · Sophomore P Mason Fletcher was named American Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Monday (Sept. 19) by the league.
- · The Melbourne, Australia native averaged an impressive 48.2 yards per punt on five tries against Miami (Ohio) in a 38-17 victory on Saturday. Fletcher's performance included a career-long 67-yard punt - the longest punt by a Bearcat in over a decade and tied for the eighth-longest ever by UC player.
- "We have confidence in what he can do," head coach Luke Fickell said following the Miami game. "He's done a phenomenal job. He's not rattled by the seven or eight guys that they (Miami) tried to have come after him. Obviously, he had the one (67-yarder) coming out of the end zone that he hammered and it rolled. That was huge."
- · Fletcher was also named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List.
- · Through five games, he ranks fifth nationally with a 46.6 average $-\ \mbox{a}$ mark that ranks second in the AAC. Eleven of his 25 punts have been downed or fielded inside the 20-yard line with five inside the 10. He has seven punts of 50+ and two 60-varders.
- He faced his brother, Max Fletcher, a freshman punter for Arkansas, in the season opener, Mason and Max's parents, Dustin and Suzanne, flew from Australia for the game, It marked the first time in nearly two years that Mason has seen his brother and mother. Fletcher's father, Dustin, a 23-year veteran in Australian Rules Football, came to the Cotton Bowl last season.

SCOTT. PACE JR. SWEEP AAC AWARDS AFTER INDIANA

- · Tyler Scott, joining Ivan Pace Jr. as first-time AAC Players of the Week, had a 10-catch, 185-yard, three-touchdown performance (all-career highs) against the Hoosiers. He tied the UC single-game record for touchdown receptions and became the first Bearcat to have three TD receptions in a single half. He caught touchdowns of 75 yards, 34 yards and 32 yards in the final 16 minutes of the first half as Cincinnati jumped out to a 38-10 lead.
- · Pace Jr. was everywhere leading Cincinnati's Blackcats defense to stifle an Indiana offense that ran 104 plays, but generated only 3.3 yards per play. Pace Jr. tallied 15

- tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 2.5 sacks and three QB hurries. One of his sacks secured a 17-yard loss.
- He has led Cincinnati in tackles every game this season.
 His 13.5 TFLs through five games lead the nation and his
 56 total stops and 6.0 sacks also rank in the Top 10.

TYLER SCOTT IS A BIG-PLAY MACHINE

- Junior wide receiver Tyler Scott caught three touchdowns, all in the first half, of 32, 34 and 75 yards in the Indiana win. Only 10 other receivers at UC have had three in a game, and he is the only one to do so in one half.
- Scott has 11 touchdowns in his career (six this year), and all are on receptions of 20-plus yards. Scott, who clocked a 4.29 40-yard dash in high school, hauled in an 81-yard score from Desmond Ridder on the first pass of the 2021 season for his first end-zone trip.
- Scott leads UC in all three receiving categories: catches (28), yards (500) and touchdowns (6), ranking 13th and sixth nationally in the latter two categories, respectively. In 2021, he had 30 catches for 520 yards and five scores.
- Scott has two touchdowns in each of the past two weeks on the first play of a drive (75 yards versus Indiana, 61 at Tulsa).

SCOTT THE FIRST IN FIVE YEARS

Tyler Scott's 61-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter at
Tulsa marked the fourth straight game with a touchdown
for the junior receiver from Akron, Ohio. He is the first
Bearcat to accomplish that feat since Kahlil Lewis opened
the 2017 season with a touchdown catch in the first four
games.

WR DUO BOTH GO OVER 100 AGAINST REDHAWKS

- Wide receivers Tyler Scott (119) and Tre Tucker (105) each went over 100-yards receiving vs. Miami (Ohio). It was the second 100-yard game for Tucker and the first for Scott.
- It marks the first time that the Bearcats have had two 100yard receivers in the same game since Devin Gray (143) and Thomas Geddis (104) did so at Tulsa on Nov. 25, 2016.

THREE'S (100-YARD RUSHING) COMPANY

- Corey Kiner's 109-yard output at Tulsa marked UC's third different 100-yard rusher on the season. Myles Montgomery had 104 against Kennesaw State, while Charles McClelland went for 101 against Miami (OH).
- It is UC's first instance since 2020 when Gerrid Doaks, Jerome Ford and Desmond Ridder accomplished the feat. The last time UC had three RBs do so was 2018 (McClelland, Michael Warren II, Tavion Thomas).

FIRST-HALF AIR ATTACK LEADS UC PAST INDIANA

- Cincinnati used 21 second quarter points over a fourminute span to turn a one-score game into 38-10 halftime lead and ultimately a 45-24 victory over Indiana at Nippert Stadium. The win was the 29th straight at home for UC.
- Ben Bryant had as many touchdowns as incompletions in the first half, completing 17-of-21 for 314 yards and a career-high four touchdowns. He finished with 354 passing yards and WR Tyler Scott tied the UC record with three TD receptions.
- Senior linebacker Ivan Pace, Jr. led the team in tackles for the fourth straight game with 15 total tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and two sacks.
- The Bearcats swept the home-and-home series with the Hoosiers after beating Indiana in Bloomington, 38-24, in 2021

BEARCATS SECURE VICTORY BELL SERIES LEAD

- Cincinnati won its 16th straight against Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 17 to take the series lead in the nation's oldest nonleague rivalry, and second-oldest overall, for the first time since 1915. The Bearcats and RedHawks first played in 1888.
- Cincinnati overcame two 10-point deficits in the first half against the RedHawks, trailing 10-0 and 17-7, before scoring 31 unanswered points en route to the victory. It was UC's biggest comeback since overcoming a 14-0 deficit at Indiana on Sept. 17, 2021. UC held Miami to just 67 yards in the second half and 1-for-11 on third down for the game.
- QB Ben Bryant completed his first 12 passes and finished with 337 yards and two TDs, while Ivan Pace, Jr. paced the defense with eight tackles and two TFLs.
- Senior CB Arquon Bush had his eighth career INT and Charles McClelland rushed for 101 yards and two TDs.
- The game was played at Paycor Stadium home of the NFL's Bengals - and Miami was the home team.

BLACKCATS LIVE IN THE BACKFIELD

- Cincinnati's famed defense put on a dazzling display in the Tulsa backfield, tying an AAC record with 11 sacks while producing 15 TFL.
- The former was the team's most since 2007 at Syracuse, while the latter had not been accomplished since 2002 versus UAB.
 The 36 rushing yards came after Tulsa had 262 one week prior at Ole Miss and 297 in Nippert Stadium in 2021.
- UC is allowing 57.0 rushing ypg over the last three outings after 183.0 the first two.
- To add to it, Deshawn Pace's 18-yard pick-six for the game's first score marked UC's fourth defensive TD in just the first five games.

TRANSFERS PROVIDE SPARK IN DEBUTS AT ARKANSAS

- Cincinnati's first 17 points at Arkansas came by way of first-year transfers, highlighted by starting QB Ben Bryant (Cincinnati, EMU, back to Cincinnati).
- Corey Kiner (LSU) pulled UC within 14-7 on the second half's opening drive with a 5-yard dive into the endzone, ultimately leading the team with 59 yards on 12 carries.
- Nick Mardner's (Hawaii) first catch as a Bearcat was a 35-yard strike from Bryant four minutes later, making it a 21-14 deficit
- Ivan Pace (Miami, OH) turned heads with team-highs of 12 tackles and 3.5 TFLs, including a thunderous, unblocked sack in the fourth quarter. It marked the most TFLs for a Bearcat since Darrian Beavers in 2020 at UCF.
- Ryan Coe (Delaware) also kicked a 26-yard field goal.
- To cap it off, Bryant's fourth-quarter connection with Leonard Taylor was his second in a UC uniform, with the other going to Taylor in 2019 at Memphis.

'PACE'-ING THE DEFENSE

- Senior LB Ivan Pace, Jr. (a transfer from Miami [OH]) leads
 UC in tackles (56) and TFLs (13.5), emerging as a force.
- He leads the AAC and ranks fifth nationally in tackles (11.2 per game). His 13.5 TFLs lead the nation and are 4.0 more than the second person.
- He ranked 10th nationally with 125 tackles for Miami (OH) in 2021. He had six sacks to tie the NCAA record in a single game in 2019.
- He led UC with 12 tackles and 3.5 TFLs in his UC debut at Arkansas to open 2022, earning AAC honor roll accolades.
- · He has led the team in stops all five games this year,

- · UC is the 18th-oldest public institution in the United States and traces its origins to the founding of the Medical College of Ohio and Cincinnati College in 1819.

following up his Fayetteville performance with 11 (plus a TFL and forced fumble) against Kennesaw State and eight (with 2 TFL and a sack) versus Miami.

- His brother, Deshawn Pace, a dynamic defensive playmaker, finished sixth in the conference and third on the team with 94 tackles while also adding nine for loss and a team-high four interceptions. His field-goal block at Navy and subsequent return set up a 52-yard field goal as time expired.
- In 2022, Deshawn has 20 tackles, 3.0 TFLs, a blocked kick and pick-six.
- · Deshawn was named the AAC Defensive Player of the Week after totaling a game-high 10 tackles and making a fourth-quarter interception in the 38-24 win at Indiana in 2021. He also had a 27-yard INT at Notre Dame in 2021.

YES, THAT'S CORRECT HE HAD SIX SACKS IN A GAME

- · Senior Ivan Pace, Jr. had six sacks in a single game, to tie an NCAA record, while starring for Miami (Ohio).
- · He played in 22 games for the Redhawks from 2019-2021, making 193 tackles, 25.5 TFLs and 11 sacks.
- · His Ione interception came against Eastern Michgian, when he picked off Ben Bryant in 2021.

THE OTHER HUBER (JOE) READY FOR HIS CHANCE

· Former walk-on right tackle Joe Huber saw significant playing time with the first team offense in the spring and fall camp at right tackle. The redshirt sophomore engineering major earned his first start at right tackle at No. 19 Arkansas and has held that spot all season. The 6-5, 310-pounder starred at Jerome High School in Dublin, Ohio. He has started all four games this season.

BRYANT QB1

- · Ben Bryant, who started his career at Cincinnati in 2018, returned to Clifton, following his season as the starter at Eastern Michigan. After a close competition in fall camp with redshirt sophomore Evan Prater, Bryant won the job.
- The 6-3, 220-pounder from La Grange, Ill., passed for 325 yards and two scores on 26-of-43 attempts with one pick at Arkansas. He passed for 177 yards in the third guarter and 233 after halftime. His 325 passing yards were the most by a Bearcat since Desmond Ridder passed for 338 yards at UCF on Nov. 21, 2020.
- · He tossed for 201 yards and three first-half touchdowns versus Kennesaw State. As part of his 337 yards against Miami (OH), his 119 to Tyler Scott and 105 to Tre Tucker marked UC's first dual 100-yard receiving game since Nov. 25, 2016 against ECU.
- In 2022, he is 107-of-164 for 1,383 yards and 13 touchdowns with just four INTs.
- Bryant started one game for UC in 2019, passing for 229 yards and one TD on 20-of-32 attempts at Memphis.
- · Bryant played in 16 games over three seasons with one start for UC from 2018 to 2020. He passed for 553 yards, two touchdowns and three interceptions for the Bearcats before transferring.
- Bryant is also a triplet, and his father, Sean, grew up in Cincinnati before becoming a linebacker and long snapper at Eastern Michiaan.

BRYANT ON THE MONEY IN 2021

· Ben Bryant completed 68.4% of his passes (279-of-408) while throwing for 3,121 yards and 14 touchdowns at Eastern Michigan in 2021. He ranked as the nation's 11th most accurate passer. His 68.4% completion percentage

would've been the third-highest in UC history and better than any season by Desmond Ridder, Tony Pike, Gino Guidugli or Greg Cook.

MCCLELLAND SHINES

- · Charles McClelland has overcome two ACL tears in his Cincinnati career after showing promise in 2018, when he rushed for 495 yards (7.7 ypc) and four touchdowns.
- He had 86 total vards on nine touches at Arkansas.
- · He rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns on a careerhigh 18 carries versus Miami (Ohio).
- His 61-yard run at Tulsa was a career-long and Cincinnati's longest rush of 2022.
- He has 323 rushing yards (5.9 ypc) and three TDs in 2022.
- · He missed the 2019 season due to a preseason injury and suffered the same fate after playing the first four games in 2020.

TURNOVER TIME

- · UC finished in the top 10 in turnovers gained over the 2019-21 seasons.
- Cincinnati forced 30 turnovers in 2021, averaging more than two gained per game to rank third in the country. UC was +12 in turnover margin to rank fifth in the country.
- · The Bearcats ranked 10th nationally with 21 turnovers gained in 2020.
- UC ranked 10th in 2019, as well, with 26 turnovers gained.
- Since 2019, UC is +23 in turnover margin.
- · Cincinnati has forced 2.05 turnovers per game since 2019 (88 turnovers forced, 43 games).

TOP 10 SCORING DEFENSE IN 2020, 2021 AND ..

- Cincinnati has had one of the nation's top 10 scoring defenses each of the last two seasons and three of the last four years. ranking No. 5 in 2021 (16.9) and No. 8 (16.8) in 2020. UC ranked No. 24 (20.6) in 2019 and No. 8 in 2018 (17.2)
- UC is allowing 20.6 ppg through five games in 2022.

THREE LOSSES SINCE 2020 AMONG NATION'S FEWEST

- Cincinnati is 26-3 since the start of 2020.
- · UC's 26 wins since 2020 are tied for the third-most in the nation, too.

TIGHT END TANDEM

 The Bearcats returned arguably the nation's top tight end tandem in seniors Leonard Taylor and Josh Whyle. Whyle, a third-team PFF All-American in 2020 and a Honorable Mention All-AAC selection from La Salle High School in Cincinnati, has 13 career touchdown catches over the last two years. The duo combined for 10 TD receptions in 2021 with Taylor, a former prep quarterback from Springfield, Ohio, hauling in four scores. This year, they have 24 catches for 213 yards and four touchdowns.

THE 'NICKEL' IS BACK TO LEAD PASS DEFENSE

• Senior defensive backs Arquon Bush and Ja'Von Hicks return to lead the Cincinnati pass defense. Bush, who started at nickelback last season, has made 26 career starts and tallied 94 tackles, 18 pass breakups and eight interceptions in five seasons. Bush starts at field cornerback this season. Hicks has started 33 games at safety. He led the AAC with five interceptions in 2019 and he has nine picks in this career, including a 45-yard pick-six versus Kennesaw State. Cincinnati had the nation's best pass defense in 2021, finishing No. 1 in the country in pass efficiency defense (103.37), No. 2 in passing yards allowed (169.2), No. 3 in interceptions (19) and No. 4 in opponent completion % (54.0).

TUCKER LOOKS TO LEAD

• Senior wide receiver Tre Tucker has already proven to be one of the nation's top kick returners after leading the AAC with a 29.9 kick return average en route to all-conference honors in 2020. He has two career kick return touchdowns, running for a score versus USF in 2020 and a momentum-shifting 99-yard score at Indiana in 2021. The 5-9, 175-pounder from Akron, Ohio, has 81 career receptions and six touchdown catches.

BRIGGS READY TO BREAK OUT

• Senior nose tackle Jowon Briggs is ready to breakout. The 6-1, 313-pounder is called the strongest player on the team by head football strength coach Brady Collins. He's also a married father of two, who starred at Walnut Hills High School in Cincinnati. A former four-star recruit and Under Armor All-America, he started his career at Virginia before transferring back home last season. He rotated at defensive end in 2021 and finished with 42 tackles, including three sacks. He came on strong at the end of the season recording a sack in each of the final regular season games. He is also an accomplished singer.

DAY ONE READY CAMPAIGN

- The Day One Ready Campaign launched in November 2021 as a \$100 million fundraising initiative to prepare for the university's upcoming move to the Big 12.
- The Day One Ready Campaign will raise money to directly boost the Bearcats' abilities to enhance the student-athlete experience and compete for championships in its new conference.
- The construction of a new indoor practice and performance facility on campus is a key project of the campaign.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school record in June.
- It's the first time in history that UC has sold out of season
- · Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season

tickets sold. HOLD THE LINE

- Cincinnati was one of eight schools nationally to bring back all five of its offensive line starters. The Bearcats also return Mackey Award watch list tight ends Leonard Taylor and Josh Whyle for good measure.
- Entering the season, those five linemen (Jeremy Cooper, Lorenz Metz, Dylan O'Quinn, Jake Renfro, James Tunstall) had appeared in 138 games at UC (94 starts), which was eighth in the nation (heading into the season).
- First-year offensive line coach Mike Cummings came to UC after three seasons as the offensive line coach at Central Michigan. In 2021, CMU had a 9-4 record and led the MAC in points scored (465) and touchdowns (59). Running back Lew Nichols III led the conference in rushing yards (1,927) and averaged 5.4 yards per carry behind Cummings' offensive line.

COMMUNITY SHOWS UP FOR COLLEGE GAMEDAY

- ESPN College GameDay came to Cincinnati for the firsttime in school history on Saturday, Nov. 6, 2021.
- Originating from The Commons at the heart of UC's campus, the show featured a live interview with head coach Luke Fickell and a behind-the-scenes segment on the Bearcats.
- Cincinnati was the 78th different school and the 94th different city to host GameDay during the show's 35 seasons. In addition, it was the fourth time that GameDay originated from the home site of an American Athletic Conference program, having travelled to Memphis (2019), UCF (2018) and Temple (2015) in recent seasons.
- Approximately 15,000 fans attended the event in an incredible show of support for the Bearcats.

ENTER SEVEN TRANSFERS

QB Ben Bryant (Eastern Michigan)

 Bryant spent three seasons as a backup quarterback at UC before starring at Eastern Michigan where he threw for over 3,000 yards this past fall. His only start for UC came on the road at No. 18 Memphis, where he played valiantly in place of Desmond Ridder in a 34-24 loss, throwing for 229 yards, while tossing one touchdown and rushing for another score.

LB Ivan Pace, Jr. (Miami [Ohio])

• Pace collected Mid-American Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2021 from Pro Football Focus and All-MAC First Team honors after leading the conference and ranking 10th in the nation with 125 tackles. Pace had an NCAA-record-tying six sacks in a win over Akron in 2019. He will get to team with his younger brother Deshawn Pace, who led the Bearcats with four interceptions and finished with 94 tackles and 9.5 TFLs during his sophomore season.

WR Nick Mardner (Hawaii)

Mardner totaled 46 receptions for team highs of 913 yards and five touchdowns at Hawaii in 2021. A native of Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, he tallied 62 receptions for 1,270 yards and eight touchdowns with an impressive 20.5 yard per catch average for his career with the Rainbow Warriors.

OL Dartanyan Tinsley (Kentucky Christian)

 The 6-5, 315-pounder collected First Team All-National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) honors in 2020-21 and grabbed First Team All-Mid-South Conference Appalachian Division accolades in back-to-back seasons (2020-21).

K Ryan Coe (Delaware)

 Coe connected on 12 of 15 field goals with a long of 51 in 2021. He nailed 12 field goals, including a 54-yarder in an FCS Playoff game in 2020-21 — the longest field goal by any kicker in the CAA that season.

RB Corey Kiner (LSU)

• Earned valuable reps as a true freshman at LSU, totaling 79 carries for 324 yards (4.1 per carry) and two touchdowns... Had 11 and 12 carries the first two weeks against McNeese and Central Michigan, with rushes of 23 and 26 yards respectively, and scoring in each game. Also had 10 carries at Ole Miss and 14 in the Texas Bowl against Kansas State. Had season-high 74 yards against CMU, as well as 56 against McNeese and 53 versus K-State. Four-star prospect (7th RB, 163 nationally) while earning Ohio Mr. Football honors at Cincinnati's Roger Bacon HS.

DL Noah Potter (Ohio State)

 Spent 2019-21 seasons at Ohio State. Did not see game action in 2021. Appeared in four games in 2020, totaling two tackles. Played in four games as a true freshman in 2019 before redshirting. OSU Scholar-Athlete in 2019 and 2020, as well as Academic All-Big Ten in 2020. Four-star prospect and No. 6 player in Ohio by 247Sports.

AAC'S TOP RECRUITING CLASS AGAIN

- Cincinnati signed 19 players on National Early Signing Day on Dec. 15, 2021. The Bearcats' class was rated No. 25 by ESPN and No. 33 by 247Sports on Early Signing Day, marking the highest-rated class in the American Athletic Conference and the highest-ranked in school history. UC did not sign any prep players during the later signing day in February.
- The 2022 Class is represented in 10 different states, including eight from Ohio and three from Florida.
- Of the 19 high school signees, three are consensus fourstar recruits (Derrick Shepard, Mario Eugenio, Jonquis "JQ" Hardaway) — two of which played in the national all-star games. Hardaway was selected to play in the 2022 Under Armour All-America Game in Orlando, Fla., on Jan. 2, while Eugenio is slated to play in the All-American Bowl in San Antonio. Texas. on Jan. 8.
- Eight signees are current early enrollees (RB Stephen Byrd, WR Jojo Bermudez, OL Luke Dalton, DB JQ Hardaway, DB Kalen Carroll, DB Ken Willis, LB Cincear Lewis, DT CJ Doggette).

FREAKS LIST

- UC boasted three members of Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks" list for the second-straight season.
- Speedy wideout Tyler Scott boasts a 40-time of 4.29, turning him ino a big-play machine in 2021. At 5-foot-11 and 185 pounds, Scott squatted a very impressive 600 and did 16 reps at 225 pounds on the bench press, maxing out at 345. Scott also has a vertical jump of 40 1/2 inches and an 11-foot broad jump.
- Fellow wide receiver Tre Tucker has a lot of power for his size, squatting 600, while standing 5-foot-9 and weighing 185. Tucker recorded a broad jump of 10'10 and a vertical of 36 1/2 inches.
- Josh Whyle, a Mackey Award Watch List nominee and 2020 PFF All-American rounded it out. With his huge frame, 6-foot-6 and 250 pounds, he clocked a 4.65, 40 while topping out at 20 mph on the GPS. Not only does

- he have speed for a big man, but also has a 35 1/2-inch vertical and a broad jump of 10-3 1/2.
- Alec Pierce (Colts), Desmond Ridder (Falcons) and Myjai Sanders (Cardinals) all made the list last season.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS (AGAIN)

- For the second time, UC enters a season under Fickell with a target on their back as the projected league favorite with a Top-20 preseason ranking.
- UC won the 2021 and 2020 AAC Championships, its 16th league title, for its first two since 2014 and first outright crown since 2009.
- · UC was playing in its third-straight AAC title game.
- Each of the last two were played at Nippert Stadium. UC toppled No. 16 Houston in 2021 after defeating No. 23 Tulsa on Cole Smith's game-ending 34-yard field goal. That first game, played on Saturday, Dec. 19 at Nippert Stadium, marked the latest date a game was played in Nippert since a matchup vs. Xavier on Dec. 7, 1918.

UPDATING THE COACHING STAFF

• Luke Fickell made several changes to his coaching staff, most notably promoting Bearcat legend Gino Guidugli to offensive coordinator. Guidugli, UC's all-time leading passer and a member of the Hall of Fame and Ring of Honor, had been the quarterbacks coach since 2018 and the passing game coordinator since 2020. Also returning to UC is former team captain defensive lineman Walter Stewart, who will coach the defensive line after serving in same role at Temple and Northern Illinois most recently, as well as Kerry Coombs, a former Ohio State defensive coordinator/assistant and UC assistant and state champion prep coach from the 'Queen City.'

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- For the past 24 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- Higher Ground has two 100-yard turf practice fields, including a new surface installed in 2017, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

FOOTBALL HISTORY

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

The University of Cincinnati football program dates to 1885 and ranks as one of the 10 oldest in major college football and holds an all-time mark of 653-596-50 entering its 135th season. UC has won a conference championship seven times in the last decade while playing in the postseason in 13 of the last 16 years. UC played in the American Athletic Conference title game for the first time in 2019 and won the championship game in a 2020 and 2021. The Bearcats have tallied 46 wins since 2018, which ranks among the top five teams in the FBS. In 2010, UC reached as high as No. 3 in all three major polls (Associated Press, USA Today, Bowl Championship Series) - only to be topped by the No. 2 ranking (Associated Press) in 2021.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF RUN IN 2021

The Bearcats authored the greatest season in school history in 2021, starting 13-0, rising to as high as No. 2 in the AP poll, winning a second consecutive AAC Championship and advancing to the College Football Playoff. Cincinnati fell to Alabama the CFP Semifinals at the Cotton Bowl Classic, but not before beating Indiana and No. 9 Notre Dame on the road, as well as routing Houston for the league title. The historic win over the Fighting Irish was Cincinnati's first-ever win over a Top-10 opponent on the road. UC's first-ever back-to-back 50-point games followed the road wins. Cincinnati also hosted ESPN College GameDay for the first time ever in a season that featured the most prolific offense in school history and one of the nation's most stout defenses. Led by Desmond Ridder, who set the school-record with 87 career touchdown passes and won 44 games (third-most in FBS history), Cincinnati set school records for touchdowns (70) and points scored (516). The Bearcats had the nation's top pass defense, which was led by First Team All-America cornerbacks Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner (No. 4 pick in 2022 NFL Draft) and Coby Bryant (Thorpe Award winner). Head Coach Luke Fickell was named the consensus national Coach of the Year. winning eight awards from national organizations. The season culminated with a school-record nine players selected in the 2022 NFL Draft, which ranked third in the country and cemented Cincinnati as one of the country's premier college football programs.

SIMPLY "SAUCE"

Cornerback Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner burst on the scene for a pick-six in an upset of UCF as a true freshman and never looked back, becoming the first Bearcat position player to collect consensus All-America honors before becoming the highest drafted player in UC history when he was selected with the No. 4 pick by the New York Jets in the 2022 NFL Draft. The two-time First Team All-American and unanimous AAC Defensive Player of the Year famously never allowed a touchdown pass over more than 1,000 coverage snaps in his three-year career.

COBY BRYANT IS UC'S FIRST JIM THORPE AWARD WINNER

Cornerback Coby Bryant returned for a fifth "bonus" season in 2021, granted by the NCAA due to the pandemic. The Cleveland, Ohio, native took full advantage of it. A team captain, he was named the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award winner as the nation's top defensive back in 2021 as he led the Bearcats to the College Football Playoff and finished his career with 45 passes defended and 10 interceptions.

RECORD-BREAKING RIDDER

Quarterback Desmond Ridder capped his Cincinnati career (2017-2021) with 44 wins, the third most in FBS history, two AAC Championships, two AAC Offensive Player of the Year Awards, an appearance in the College Football Playoff and countless school records, including most touchdown passes (87), most total yards (12,418), AAC TD responsibility (115) and most rushing touchdowns by a UC QB (28). He finished eighth in Heisman Trophy voting in 2021.

A TOWER OF STRENGTH

UC's football program is one of the nation's oldest — only Rutgers (1869), Michigan (1879), Navy (1880), and Minnesota (1883), among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision institutions, predate Cincinnati, which began the sport in 1885.

THE ROCK OF TRUTH

UC has been involved in several historic college football milestones starting with Dec. 8, 1888. That day, the Bearcats and Miami (Ohio) University engaged in the first college football game played in the state of Ohio, launching a rivalry that is tied for the oldest in the game among major universities - North Carolina vs. Wake Forest began playing that same year. The Battle for the Victory Bell is the fifth-most played rivalry series in college football.

ALWAYS ON THE SIDE OF INNOVATION

A few years later in 1897, UC received an invitation to visit New Orleans to play a football game as a reward for a successful season, a precursor to the current postseason football bowl games.

BOWL-CATS

Cincinnati has been to 17 bowl games over the last 21 seasons and 22 in the program's 134 seasons, UC played in the first Bowl Championship Series, now New Year's Six, game in school history, taking on Virginia Tech in the 75th FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 2009. The Begreats returned to the New Year's Six in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl on Jan. 1. 2021 in Atlanta. In 2021. Cincinnati advanced to the College Football Playoff Semifinals at the 86th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Arlinaton, Texas, on Dec. 31, 2021.

WE ENGINEER BETTER

In the 1930s, a UC football player wore a device with his helmet to protect his broken nose. The device was a forerunner of the now standard face mask. The first soccer-style place kick was also attempted by a Bearcat, Hank Hartong, in the early 1960s.

THE CHART TOPPERS

In 1968, the Bearcats were the nation's top passing team with quarterback Greg Cook leading the NCAA in total offense, while receiver/kicker Jim O'Brien captured the national scoring title. A year later, Cook earned Rookie of the Year honors as a Cincinnati Bengal, and two years later, O'Brien kicked the game-winning field goal for the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl V.

ALL-AMERICA TRADITION

Forty-seven Bearcats have earned All-America recognition. Mike Woods garnered first-team honors in 1977, earning him an appearance on Bob Hope's television special. Punter Kevin Huber became the first two-time First-Team Associated Press all-American in UC history when he earned the honor in 2007 and 2008. In 2021, Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner become the first position player to earn consensus All-America honors. He was a two-time First Team All-America selection in 2020 and 2021.

"THE TOE"

Jonathan Ruffin received the Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker in 2000 after booting a record 26 field goals. He was presented the award by ESPN's Chris Fowler. Ruffin was also a consensus All-American that year.

OUR CRADLE OF COACHES

Coaching luminaries have patrolled the sidelines at Cincinnati. College Football Hall of Fame coach Frank Cavanaugh began his 24-season career at UC. Sid Gillman, a member of the College and NFL Halls of Fame, was the architect of one of the top eras of Cincinnati football history. He directed the Bearcats to three conference titles and a pair of bowl game appearances during his six seasons (1949-54) before leaving for the professional ranks. Cincinnati, with Gillman developing the passing offenses which would make him successful in the pro ranks, became known for its aerial attack in the early 1950s. That notoriety continued long after his departure. Current head coach Luke Fickell enters his sixth year with the program having already taken the program to unprecedented heights, including two AAC Championships, two Top 10 finishes and a College Football Playoff apperance, He is a three-time AAC Coach of the Year and the 2021 consensus National Coach of the Year.

UPSET CATS

Cincinnati has been dangerous to top teams over the years, knocking off the likes of No. 8 Wisconsin. 17-12, at home in 1999, upending defending national champion Penn State in 1983 14-3 on the road, and dominating Virginia Tech, 16-0, in 1995 while allowing just 41 yards of offense. However, possibly the biggest upset in UC history came in 2006 as the Bearcats beat its highestranked opponent in Nippert Stadium history, blowing away then-No. 7 Rutgers, 30-11. Although not technically an underdog when the No. 7-ranked Bearcats beat No. 9 Notre Dame in South Bend. Ind., in 2021, the game marked the first-ever win over a Top 10 team on the road.

CHAMPIONSHIP FOOTBALL

Between 2008-12, UC became the only FBS AQ school to earn four conference championships in five seasons. The 2008 BIG EAST Conference Championship was the school's first since 1956. UC finished with a school-record 12 wins in 2009 and finished No. 3 in the Bowl Championship Series standings. The 2008 and 2009 squads made the first two BCS appearances in school history, playing in the Orange and Sugar Bowls, respectively. The Bearcats added BIG EAST titles in 2011 and 2012 along with their first American Athletic Conference title in 2014. UC made a school-record five-straight bowl appearances between 2011-15, playing in the Liberty, Belk - twice, Military and Hawai'i bowls. The 2020 season saw UC return to the Top-10 in all three national polls, AP, USA Today and College Football Playoff, for the first time since 2009, including UC's highest CFP ranking, No. 7 on Nov. 22 and 28, 2020. Cincinnati kept the momentum going in 2021, finishing 13-1 en route to a second straight AAC title and its first appearance in the College Football Playoff.



CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM



- During the season-ending clash with rival Miami (OH) in 1923, Jimmy Nippert sustained a spike wound injury and died a month later from blood poisoning.
- His grandfather, James N. Gamble of Procter and Gamble, provided the funds needed to complete the horseshoe-shaped structure, and the James Gamble Nippert Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Nov. 8,
- The stadium's founder was Arch Carson, who as captain and principal organizer played a significant role in starting football on the UC campus in 1885. In 1901 as physical director of the university, Carson guided the construction of the field which was later named for him -- the playing surface is still called Carson Field.

CARSON FIELD AT NIPPERT STADIUM HAS BEEN THE VENERABLE HOME OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI FOOTBALL TEAM SINCE 1901 AND PROVIDES A PHENOMENAL HOME-FIELD ENVIRONMENT.

HARD TICKET TO COME BY

- · Cincinnati football officially sold out of season tickets for the 2022 football season, selling more than 23,500 to set a new school record in June.
- It's the first time UC has ever sold out of season tickets.
- · Last season, UC set a record with just over 22,000 season tickets sold.

A MODERN CLASSIC

- · The third-oldest NCAA FBS stadium entered a new era in 2015 following the completion of a 20-month, \$86-millon. privately funded renovation and expansion project.
- The post-renovation season in 2015 coincided with the 100th anniversary of the original 1915 construction.
- · UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1901, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (1915) and Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium (1917).
- Through numerous renovations, the structure situated in the middle of the Clifton campus has retained its early-century brickwork, wrought-iron gates, and trim giving Nippert a comfortable old-time stadium charm and appeal, while remaining a classic showplace for college football.

FOR THE FANS

- Both concourses were renovated and widened and now feature nearly 75 permanent point-of-sale concession locations are available on game days.
- · Concession stands feature the usual stadium staples along

- with offerings from premium local vendors, including Frisch's, Montgomery Inn and Skyline Chili.
- Enhancements were added in 2019, including: new tailgating spots, social gathering spaces, fans-first pricing and a season-long DJ for in-game entertainment.

THE WEST PAVILION

- · The most striking changes sit five stories above the west concourse. At 105,000 square feet and 130 yards long, the West Pavilion rises out of the stadium concourse in glass and angles which contain a host of new premium seating along with state-of-the-art press facilities.
- The curvature of the facility matches that of Herschede-Shank Pavilion on the east side of the stadium and contains four levels; the Margaret & Michael Valentine press and suite level, suite level, scholarship club level, and patio suites mezzanine level.
- UC went from having nearly no premium seating options to the addition of 1,100 scholarship club seats and 53 indoor and outdoor suites of varying sizes. A skywalk connects Tangeman University Center to the West Pavilion with premium area customers able to access the facility on gameday from the other side of campus.

FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- · The Cincinnati Bengals played at Nippert from 1968-69 and MLS' FC Cincinnati played there until 2021.
- Nippert has served as a venue for numerous concerts and events, including speeches by US Presidents, Franklin D. Roosevelt (1936) and Barack Obama (2008).

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY COMES TO UC IN 2021

"The best atmosphere this year (2021) for College GameDay was at Cincinnati. Man, they were so fired up. They were fired up for their team. They were fired up for the validation that having GameDay come to campus brings, and they were absolutely electric. I mean there were thousands of people for as far as you could see back on the main quad area on campus at UC not far from Nippert Stadium...Cincinnati was a great, great stop this year." College GameDay Host Rece Davis (2021)

Thousands of Cincinnati fans attended ESPN College GameDay Built by The Home Depot on Nov. 6, 2021. The three-hour college football pregame show aired live from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. from "The Commons" in front of Tangeman University Center adjacent to MainStreet at the center of the University of Cincinnati's West Campus. College GameDay's first-ever visit to Cincinnati registered 1,826,000 viewers, tops among Saturday morning college football pregame shows with 2,376,000 viewers in the final hour in what was essentially a three-hour commercial for the University of Cincinnati and the football program. The weekend also served as UC's homecoming and Cincinnati defeated Tulsa, 28-20, at Nippert Stadium that night.

HEAD COACH LUKE FICKELL | SIXTH SEASON

2021 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

University of Cincinnati football head coach Luke Fickell has elevated the Bearcats' football team to the top of college football in less than five years.

Hired as the 42nd football head coach in UC history on Dec. 10, 2016, Fickell, an Ohio native, led Cincinnati to back-to-back 11-win campaigns in 2018 and 2019 and an undefeated regular season that culminated with a Peach Bowl berth in 2020, before leading the Bearcats to the greatest season in school history in 2021. He guided the Bearcats to an appearance in the College Football Playoff Semifinals at the Cotton Bowl and the first-ever 13-0 regular-season record in school history.

It's no surprise Fickell collected eight national coach of the year honors in 2021, including the The Home Depot National Coach of the Year, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year, the Stallings Award, the Eddie Robinson Award and the Dodd Trophy as well as accolades from the AFCA, Walter Camp Foundation and Sporting News.

Fickell has watched 16 Bearcats earn a selection in the NFL Draft, including a school-record nine draft picks in 2022, and captured AAC Coach of the Year honors three times (2018, 2020, 2021). He has firmly established his T.E.A.M. (Together Everyone Achieves More) culture on Cincinnati's Clifton Hts. campus, graduating players and instilling discipline and consistency on and off the field.

Fickell holds a 48-15 (.762) record in his five years at the helm of Cincinnati. His 44-7 mark since 2018 ranks among the Top 5 records in the nation during that span.

In 2021, the Bearcats finished as the nation's only undefeated team in the regular season and as the No. 4 seed in the College Football Playoff, capturing a spot in the CFP Semifinals at the 86th Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic in Arlington, Texas. Cincinnati battled No. 1 Alabama tough before ultimately falling to the defending national champions at AT&T Stadium.

UC also secured a No. 2 ranking early in the fall in the Associated Press Poll – their highest ranking in school history. Cincinnati defeated No. 9 Notre Dame, 24-13, in South Bend, Ind., for its first-ever road victory over a Top 10 team, before rattling off back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in school history in dominant wins over Temple (52-3) and UCF (56-21). The Bearcats' capped the season by defeating No. 16 Houston, 35-20, for their second consecutive AAC Championship title.

Cincinnati set school records for points (516) and touchdowns (70) in 2021 and extended the nation's second-longest home winning streak to 27-straight at Nippert Stadium.

UC proved to be one of the nation's most complete teams, ranking in the nation's Top 10 in both scoring offense (39.2, 8th) and scoring defense (16.1, 4th) in the reaular season.

Fickell's Bearcats saw 12 players earn All-AAC First Team honors, including two-time conference offensive player of the year senior quarterback Desmond Ridder and unanimous defensive player of the year junior cornerback Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner.

Additional honors were given to senior cornerback Coby Bryant, who became the first Bearcat to win the Jim Thorpe Award, given to the nation's top defensive back, while senior linebacker Darrian Beavers was a finalist for the Butkus Award, given to the nation's top linebacker, Gardner collected several All-America First



Team honors and became the Bearcats' third consensus All-American all-time.

With Fickell at the 2022 NFL Draft in Las Vegas to support him. Gardner became the highest drafted Bearcat when he was selected by the New York Jets with the fourth overall pick of the first round on April 28. Five Bearcats in all were drafted in the Top 100 picks and UC's nine selections were the third-most in the country behind only national champion Georgia (15) and LSU (10). The draft was further proof that no program in the country is on par with Fickell's Cincinnati squad when it comes to development. Only fifth-round pick Jerome Ford, who transferred to UC from Alabama, was rated higher than a three-star by recruiting services entering college.

Fickell has firmly established his T.E.A.M. (Together Everyone Achieves More) culture on Cincinnati's Clifton Hts. campus, graduating players and instilling discipline and consistency on and off the field.

Cincinnati's four-year football players have a 100% graduation rate since Fickell arrived and four Bearcats collected Academic All-America honors in 2021 - the most of any team in the country.

Community service is a foundational pillar of Fickell's Cincinnati program. UC football players visit local elementary schools to mentor at-risk youth weekly and participate in countless reading events at schools.

Fickell is one of the founders of the 2nd & 7 Foundation, which promotes reading by providing free books and positive role models to kids in need while encouraging young athletes in the community to pay it forward.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Fickell played football at Ohio State and graduated in 1997 with a degree in exercise science.

Fickell and his wife Amy have six children: Landon, Luca, twin sons Aydon and Ashton, and twin sons Laykon and Lucian.




MIKE TRESSEL
