## UCFACTS

- The 25th-ranked UCF football team will close out its regular-season slate on Saturday at South Florida for the War On I-4. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. from Raymond James Stadium and the game will air live on ESPN2.
- The teams are located less than 100 miles apart off of Interstate-4 and Saturday's matchup will have an added sense of anticipation, as UCF and USF have met on the field in each of the last 10 years. With the Knights move to the Big 12 Conference next season, the rivalry game will likely not be played as often.
- After dropping a three-point loss to Navy last weekend, UCF is listed at No. 25 in the latest Associated Press Top 25 Poll released on Sunday. The Knights were the first team out of the American Football Coaches Association Poll (AFCA).
- UCF's last four games have all been decided by single digits and Saturday's game was the first loss during that span. The four games have been decided by a total of 21 points and each game has been decided by a single possession.
- UCF's red zone defense continues to rank among the best in the country at No. 2 nationally, as opponents have scored on just 66% of their trips to the red zone, converting on 29-of-44 attempts. The Knights have only allowed 18 touchdowns in the red zone in 44 trips for opponents, a 41% rate. UCF has forced at least one red zone stop in eight of its 11 games this season, headlined by a season-high five red zone stops against Georgia Tech.

- The Knights' rushing attack is among the best in the nation as well, averaging 234.5 rushing yards per game to rank seventh nationally and lead the AAC. Fifth-year running back Isaiah Bowser is 13th nationally with 13 rushing touchdowns, which also leads the conference. Dating back to the bowl game last year, Bowser has at least one rushing touchdown in nine of his last 12 games, scoring 15 total during that span. UCF's 28 rushing touchdowns this season lead the conference.

- UCF is the only team in the American Athletic Conference that ranks among the top five in seven of the following eight categories: rushing (2), passing (7), scoring (5) and total offense (2); rushing (4), passing (5), scoring (2) and total defense (3).

Saturday's game will be the 14th all-time meeting in the War On I-4, as UCF leads the series 7-6. Last year, UCF won a defensive battle at home, 17-13. With the score tied at 7-7 following the first quarter, UCF scored in the second to take a 14-7 lead into halftime and only allowed six points in the second half while adding a field goal late.

The 2020 matchup in Tampa was the exact opposite, an offensive explosion. The teams combined to score 104 points - the most between the two teams in the series - as UCF earned a 58-46 road win at Raymond James Stadium. UCF quarterback Dillon Gabriel threw for more than 300 yards and USF signal caller Jordan McCloud tallied more than 400 yards passing.

**THE OPPONENT**

- South Florida has had a tough season and parted ways with their head coach Jeff Scott following the Temple game on Nov. 5. Daniel Da Prato is the acting head coach and will lead the Bulls against UCF on Saturday.
- The Bulls are coming off a 48-42 loss at Tulsa last Friday night. USF led after the first quarter 10-7, but Tulsa scored 24 points in the second quarter to take the lead and held on for the victory.
- South Florida has a strong running game, as running back Brian Battie is second in the American Athletic Conference and 20th nationally in rushing yards with 1,042. He's also second in the league in rushing yards per game with 94.7. Battie paces the AAC in all-purpose yards with 153.0 to rank seventh.

**LAST TIME OUT**

**ORLANDO** – Despite allowing just 82 yards and three points in the second half, the 20th-ranked UCF football team came up short against Navy 17-14 Saturday afternoon at FBC Mortgage Stadium. Points were at a premium in the contest, as both teams' strong defenses were on display and offenses were held well below their season averages.

"First of all, extremely tough loss. It was real disappointing for our guys, especially our seniors in their last home game and everything that went with that," said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. "Give them [Navy] credit. They did what it took to win the game. First half, they had the ball quite a bit. We had opportunities, but we got field goals down there going in and you have to score touchdowns."

Playing against a triple-option offense, the flow of the game and time of possession is always something to keep an eye on. Navy had possession for 39:36, while UCF had the ball for 20:24, the lowest time of the possession the Knights have had in a game this season. The game only saw three touchdowns scored along with three field goals and both teams were held scoreless in the fourth quarter. Navy opened the game with a strong drive, as quarterback Xavier Arline capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive that spanned 6:40.

The Knights' second drive of the game ended with a field goal from their standout freshman kicker Colton Boomer. Big runs by running back RJ Harvey and a 10-yard completion from quarterback John Rhys Plumlee to Ryan O'Keefe helped put UCF in position to score and trim the score to 7-3. After the UCF defense forced a quick three-and-out, the Knights cut the Midshipmen's lead to one at 7-6 following Boomer's second field goal of the day. Navy responded with a 6:47 drive to pull ahead 14-6 before halftime with an eight-yard touchdown run Vincent Terrell II.

## WAR ON I-4

Saturday's War On I-4 matchup will have a little extra excitement, as UCF and USF have met on the field in each of the last 10 years. With the Knights move to the Big 12 Conference next season, the rivalry game will likely not be played as often.

UCF has won the last five matchups in the series, including a 17-13 victory in last year's game.

Held on Black Friday in each of the past five years, the War On I-4 will be played on a Saturday for the first time since 2016. The universities are located less than 100 miles apart off of Interstate-4.

The Knights lead the Bulls in the War On I-4 across all sports this season with two UCF volleyball wins, one women's soccer win and by finishing ahead of South Florida at the American Athletic Cross Country Championship.

**KNIGHT NOTES (CONT.)****BREAKOUT GAME FOR BARBER**

Defensive tackle Ricky Barber turned in the best game of his collegiate career, tallying a career-high 13 tackles and was in the backfield causing havoc throughout the day against Navy. He topped his previous career best of 10 tackles he recorded at a previous school.

His 13 tackles are tied for the second most by a UCF player in a single game this season, behind Jason Johnson's 15 at East Carolina.

Barber tallied two tackles for loss and a sack against the Midshipmen.

In his last four games, Barber has 23 tackles, four tackles for loss and a sack. Additionally, he has seven quarterback hurries in four strong performances.

**JOHNSON ECLIPSES 100**

Senior linebacker Jason Johnson eclipsed 100 tackles for the season in last Saturday's game against Navy. He now owns 103 this season and is one of three players in the American Athletic Conference to accomplish the feat.

He becomes the 44th player in UCF history to record 100 or more tackles in a single season.

**YATES UP FOR THE CHALLENGE**

Making his second start of the season, linebacker Walter Yates III was up for the challenge against a tough Navy offense as he recorded a season-high 11 tackles.

**RUSHING ATTACK**

UCF has rushed for 200 or more yards in eight of its 11 games this season and has accomplished the feat in nine of its last 12 games dating back to the win over Florida in last year's bowl game.

The Knights are seventh nationally with 234.5 rushing yards per game and their 2,579 total yards rushing this season are also seventh nationally.

**WILLIAMS NAMED BROYLES AWARD NOMINEE**

UCF Defensive coordinator Travis Williams was named one of 51 nominees for the Broyles Award on Tuesday, which presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Williams was nominated for the award for the second consecutive season.

Williams is one of four coaches from the American Athletic Conference on the list and one of 24 defensive coordinators.

After improving the UCF defense 70 spots in total defense in his first season, Williams has picked up where he left off in his second season with the Knights' defense ranked 21st nationally in scoring defense (20.0). Thanks to strong play on the defensive end, UCF has recorded two ranked wins in the same season for the first time in program history following the wins against No. 20 Cincinnati and No. 17 Tulane.

**APPROACHING MILESTONES**

Fifth-year running back Isaiah Bowser heads into Saturday's game just two rushing touchdowns shy of tying Latavius Murray for the second most in a single season with 15. Bowser currently owns 13 to tie for the sixth most in a single season.

With nine rushing touchdowns this season, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee is one rushing touchdown shy of tying for the second most in single season in program history with 10. Jeff Godfrey accomplished the feat in 2010 and Daunte Culpepper holds the record with 12 rushing touchdowns in a single season set in 1998.

**CLOSE CALLS**

Each of UCF's last four games have been decided by seven or fewer points. The Knights started the streak with a four-point win against Cincinnati (25-21), followed by a seven-point road wins against Memphis (35-28) and Tulane (38-31). The last time UCF did that was final three games of 2017 season, defeating USF, Memphis in the AAC Championship Game and Auburn in the Peach Bowl all by seven points.

The Knights dropped their last game against Navy by three points, 17-14.

**PLUMLEE GARNERS MORE WEEKLY HONORS**

Following his performance against Tulane, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee was named American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the third time this season. He was also tabbed to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 List and named a Manning Award Star of the Week.

Plumlee set the Knights' program record for rushing yards by a quarterback in a single game with 176 on 18 attempts Saturday to lift UCF to a 38-31 win at then-No. 17 Tulane. The previous mark of 122 was held by Vic Penn, who accomplished the feat against Middle Tennessee in 1999.

Playing nearly two hours from his hometown of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, Plumlee ignited the Knights offense early in the game as he raced 47 yards down the field to the three-yard line to set up a Colton Boomer 25-yard field goal on the opening drive of the game. After a quick three-and-out by Tulane's offense, Plumlee took off for a 67-yard touchdown run to give the Knights a 10-0 lead on the longest rush of the season for UCF.

He found the endzone for the second time rushing on the day in the third quarter, scoring on a nine-yard run to give UCF a 31-14 lead.

Plumlee completed 17 passes for 132 yards, connecting with Javon Baker on an eight-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. His play helped UCF record its first ranked road win since 2013 when the program defeated No. 8 Louisville, 38-35.

**WARD NAMED MANNELLY SEMIFINALIST**

UCF All-America long snapper Alex Ward has been named a semifinalist for the 2022 Patrick Mannelly Award. Named after former NFL long snapper Patrick Mannelly, the award benefits Bernie's Book Bank, a non-profit that provides books for underserved communities in the Chicago, Illinois, area.

This will be the fourth year the award has been presented to the top FBS snapper. A fifth-year player from Fort Walton Beach, Florida, Ward was named to the 2022 Mannelly Award Preseason Watch List and was one of three finalists for the award last season.

Ward earned third-team All-America honors in 2021 from Phil Steele and also was selected first-team All-American Athletic Conference by Steele. Ward is a preseason third-team All-America pick by Steele for 2022.

The 10 semifinalists will be narrowed to the final three on Monday, Nov. 28. The three finalists will be invited to the award presentation dinner is set for Saturday, Dec. 10 outside Chicago.

**WHAT A DRIVE BY BOWSER**

As UCF looked to secure the win against Tulane and keep the clock going, the Knights turned to their fifth-year running back Isaiah Bowser. He rushed 12 times for 41 yards on a 16-play, 75-yard drive in the fourth quarter to chew up 8:07 on the clock. Bowser's incredible runs gave UCF a 38-24 lead after he capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown run to give the Knights a 14-point advantage with only 3:32 remaining.

For the fourth time this season, UCF running back Isaiah Bowser found the endzone twice to extend his season total to 13, which leads the AAC. Bowser's first score gave the Knights a 17-7 lead and his second of the day late in the fourth quarter helped put the game away.

**FIRST TOUCHDOWN PASS, FIRST TOUCHDOWN CATCH**

In the win against Memphis, UCF perfectly-executed one of its special plays as Isaiah Bowser lined up in the wildcat formation and found wide receiver Stephen Martin for a touchdown on a jump pass from the four-yard line.

It was Bowser's first career touchdown pass and Martin's first career touchdown grab.

### HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

UCF's all-time record of 78-24 (.767) ranks in the top 15 in the nation for best win percentage in a current home stadium.

Since 2017, the Knights are 35-4 in home games at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

The Knights finished last season undefeated at home, marking the seventh time in UCF's FBS era, the ninth overall, and the fourth time in the last five years.

Only 22 teams in the nation completed the 2021 regular season undefeated at home.

### AMONG THE BEST IN THE COUNTRY

UCF's red zone defense continues to rank among the best in the country at No. 2 nationally, as opponents have scored on just 65% of their trips to the red zone, converting on 29-of-44 attempts. The Knights have only allowed 18 touchdowns in the red zone in 44 trips for opponents, a 41% rate. UCF has forced at least one red zone stop in seven of its 11 games this season, headlined by five red zone stops in the win against Georgia Tech.

### FINISHING STRONG

UCF has been at its best in the fourth quarters of games this season, as the Knights have scored 103 points, which is the most they have scored in any quarter this season. Additionally, UCF's defense has only allowed 48 points in the fourth quarter.

### SOMETHING ABOUT MEMPHIS

Junior cornerback Davonte Brown has recorded two career interceptions and both have come against Memphis. He snatched a bouncing ball out of the air for his first interception of the season against Memphis last weekend and tallied the first of his career against the Tigers in 2021.

Redshirt senior Divaad Wilson also picked off a pass against Memphis to bring the Knights' season total to four with Wilson's third interception of the season.

### MIKEY ON THE SPOT

In his first action of the season, sophomore quarterback Mikey Keene came up big for UCF leading a pair of Knights scoring drives including the game-winner in the fourth quarter in the win over Cincinnati. After taking a hit in the second quarter, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee was removed from the game and did not return but Keene turned in a stellar outing to lift the Knights to the victory.

Keene finished the game 15-for-21 with 176 yards, completing 71% of his passes.

Thrust into action in a similar manner in 2021 with an injury to Dillon Gabriel, Keene was ready for the challenge against one of the league's best defenses. He tallied 110 of his 176 yards in the fourth quarter, leading UCF down the field to a couple of touchdowns with less than five minutes remaining.

Against Memphis, Keene finished the game 22-for-28 passing for 219 yards with three touchdowns to lead the Knights to the road win. He started the second half of the Navy game and passed for 123 yards on eight completions with a touchdown pass to Javon Baker.

### DOMINANT DEFENSE

UCF held Cincinnati to 35 rushing yards, the fewest for the Bearcats since a matchup against UConn on Oct. 8, 2016 (2 rushing yards). That mark is also the fewest the Knights have yielded in a conference game since Oct. 1, 2016, versus East Carolina (33 rushing yards).

UCF limited Cincinnati to 30 total yards of offense in the first quarter, the fewest yards the Bearcats have had in the first quarter of a game this season and just the second time Cincinnati has been held scoreless in the opening quarter.

Cincinnati's 159 yards in the first half were the fewest at halftime this season and the fewest since Alabama on 12/31/21 (76 yards).

### NO MORE THAN 21

The Knights have only allowed an opponent to score more than 21 points in a game three times this season. Dating back to last season, UCF has held its opponents to 21 points or less in 11 of the last 14 games.

### SNAPPING THE STREAK

Prior to the loss against UCF, Cincinnati had won its last 19 games against conference opponents to tie the record set by the Knights from 2017 to 2019. The Bearcats' last loss to an American Athletic Conference team was to Memphis 34-24 on Nov. 29, 2019.

UCF picked up its first ranked win since the 2018 matchup against Cincinnati (6-2, 3-1) and first under second-year head coach Gus Malzahn. The Knights remained unbeaten in home AAC games in the last two seasons under Malzahn's direction, improving to 7-0.

### BOWL ELIGIBLE

With their sixth win of the season against Cincinnati, the Knights became bowl eligible for the 13th time in school history and the seventh consecutive year.

### RECEIVING RECOGNITION

Following their standout performances in UCF's 25-21 win over No. 20 Cincinnati, junior defensive end Josh Celiscar has been named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week and running back RJ Harvey earned a spot on the Weekly Honor Roll.

Celiscar led a stellar defensive effort against the Bearcats, tallying five solo stops, including a sack and a tackle for loss. He was all over the field on Saturday and brought down Cincinnati quarterback Ben Bryant in the endzone for his first career safety to swing the momentum in the game.

Harvey turned in the best performance of his collegiate career in one of the biggest games that the redshirt junior has appeared to lead UCF to the victory. Facing the top defense in the conference, Harvey gashed the Bearcats for several big runs. He recorded career highs in carries (18), yards (84) and touchdowns (2).

### COLTON BOOMER

Freshman kicker Colton Boomer's perfect streak came to end at Memphis, as his attempt from 64 yards after an inadvertent snap missed towards the end of the first half. Boomer opened the season 10-for-10 on field goal attempts to tie Matt Prater for fourth in UCF history for consecutive field goals made.

The Lake Mary, Florida, native was a perfect 4-for-4 on field-goal attempts and was 1-for-1 on PATs in the win against Georgia Tech. His four field goals in a single game matched the UCF program record and were the most in a game since 2016. Boomer is the first Knights freshman to accomplish the feat since Matt Prater in 2002.

Boomer is now 13-of-14 on the year, which ranks ninth nationally in field goal percentage (.929) and leads the American.

### JOHNSON AMONG NATION'S ELITE

Senior linebacker Jason Johnson tallied a season high 15 tackles at East Carolina to eclipse 300 for his career. He currently ranks 14th among active FBS players with 338 career tackles.

Johnson leads the team with 91 tackles this season, which ranks second in the AAC behind Cincinnati's Ivan Pace Jr. with 104.

### MALZAHN TABBED TO PAUL "BEAR" BRYANT AWARD WATCH LIST

UCF head coach Gus Malzahn is one of 25 active football coaches named to the American Heart Association's 2022 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award watch list. The award is given each January to a college football coach for contributions that make the sport better for athletes and fans alike by demonstrating grit, integrity and a winning approach to coaching and life, both on and off the field.

Now in its 37th year, the Coach of the Year award winner will be announced live from Houston's Post Oak Hotel on Wednesday, Jan. 11, 2023, during an awards ceremony presented by Marathon Oil.

Malzahn was the recipient of the award in 2013 while at Auburn.

### WARD NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY

UCF All-America long snapper Alex Ward has been named a semifinalist for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy®, which is college football's premier scholar-athlete award. The impressive list of candidates boasts an impressive 3.62 average GPA, with more than half of the semifinalists having already earned their bachelor's degrees.

Celebrating its 33rd year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

Ward graduated in December 2021 with a degree in mechanical engineering and is currently pursuing a second degree in integrated business from the College of Business Administration. He was named to the Order of Pegasus last spring, earning the most prestigious honor for any UCF student. Ward also was a dean's list selection for the spring 2022 semester.

A fifth-year player from Fort Walton Beach, Florida, Ward was named to the Patrick Mannely Award Preseason Watch List, which is presented annually to the top long snapper in college football. Ward was one of three finalists for the award last season.

Ward earned third-team All-America honors in 2021 from Phil Steele and also was selected first-team All-American Athletic Conference by Steele. Ward is a preseason third-team All-America pick by Steele for 2022.

### LUCKY NUMBER THREE

UCF's 70 points scored in the win over Temple are the third most in program history and also the third most total points by an FBS team in a game this season. The Knights scored 73 points versus Austin Peay on Oct. 28, 2017, to set the program record and also tallied 71 points in a win over Gardner-Webb in 1992.

Ohio State's 77 points against Toledo are the most by an FBS team this season, while Utah and Western Kentucky have scored 73 points in a game this year.

### OFFENSIVE OUTBURST

UCF's 737 yards of total offense against Temple mark the first time the Knights have surpassed 700 total yards in a game since Memphis on Oct. 17, 2020. The 737 yards are the second-highest mark in the FBS this season, only behind Ohio State's 763 total yards against Toledo.

### PLUMLEE GARNERS AAC, DAVEY O'BRIEN GREAT 8 AND MANNING AWARD HONORS

Following one of the best performances in program history, UCF quarterback John Rhys Plumlee was named American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week, Davey O'Brien Great 8 List and a Manning Award Star of the Week on Oct. 17.

Plumlee tied the program record with seven total touchdowns in last Thursday's 70-13 win over Temple with four passing and three rushing. The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native tied the mark set by former UCF standouts Darin Slack in 1987 and Daunte Culpepper in 1998. His seven touchdowns are the most by any player in the American Athletic Conference this season. He threw for a career-high 373 yards on 18-for-22 passing and he rushed for 37 yards on seven attempts. Plumlee ignited the scoring for UCF in the contest, scoring from nine yards out to cap a 10-play, 74-yard drive in the first quarter to give the Knights a 7-3 lead. After Temple scored to take a 10-7 advantage, Plumlee found the endzone for the

Plumlee closed out his day by throwing a touchdown pass on each of his last three throws with an 11-yard strike to O'Keefe, 68-yard pass to O'Keefe and 64-yard touchdown to Hudson. In the third quarter, he was 5-for-5 and threw for 198 yards with three touchdowns.

### #UCFinSPACE GAME

The #UCFinSpace game has been played annually since the 2017 season and the Knights are 6-0 all-time in space games with the win against Temple on Oct. 13. The game recognizes the University of Central Florida's roots, founded as Florida Technological University in 1963 with the mission of providing personnel to support the growing U.S. space program at the Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. As the academic scope expanded beyond its original focus on engineering and technology, the school was renamed the University of Central Florida in 1978.

### BAKER'S BREAKOUT

Wide receiver Javon Baker enjoyed a breakout game in the win over SMU, as the junior reeled in six passes for a career-high 138 receiving yards. That total ranks among the top receiving performances by a player in the American Athletic Conference.

### SEASON HIGH FOR O'KEEFE

Senior wide receiver Ryan O'Keefe put together his best performance of the season against SMU, catching six passes for 117 yards with a pair of touchdowns.

It marked the third time in his career that the Austin, Texas, native has surpassed 100 yards in a single game.

### 100-YARD RECEIVING DUO

Javon Baker's 138 receiving yards and Ryan O'Keefe's 117 receiving yards marked the first time a pair of Knights receivers have surpassed 100 yards in the same game since Marlon Williams and Jaylon Robinson accomplished the feat against Temple on Nov. 13, 2020.

UCF is one of just four AAC schools to have more than one 100-yard receiver in a game, joining Cincinnati, SMU and Tulsa.

### HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

UCF's halftime adjustments in the SMU game were felt almost immediately in the second half, as the Knights scored 31 points and limited SMU to just six. UCF's 31 second-half points were the most in a second half since Oct. 26, 2019, against Temple when the Knights scored 35 points in the second half.

After gaining 145 offensive yards in the first half, UCF had 204 in the third quarter alone and 339 total yards in the second half.

### HOME SWEET HOME

UCF is one of only seven FBS teams to play five of their first six 2022 games in their home stadium. The Knights played South Carolina State and Louisville at home, went on the road to play FAU, followed by three straight home games versus Georgia Tech, SMU and Temple.

The others to play five of the first six at home are Auburn (only road game is at Georgia after five at home), Florida (at Tennessee), Ohio State (at Michigan State after five at home), Pittsburgh (at Western Michigan), Syracuse (at Connecticut) and UCLA (at Colorado).

This is only the fifth time—and first since 1993—that UCF has played five of its first six at home. The Knights competed at the FCS level in '93 when East Carolina was the lone road game and UCF won all five at home. UCF also played five of the first six at home in 1985, 1987 and 1988 while competing at the NCAA Division II level.

### BULLARD'S SPECIAL

Junior safety Quadric Bullard logged his second blocked punt return for a touchdown this season in the second quarter of the win against Georgia Tech. After Jarvis Ware tallied the block, Bullard scooped up the football and raced 29 yards for the touchdown.

Credited statistically as a punt return touchdown, Bullard is the one of just two players in the country with two punt returns for a touchdown.

In the season opener, he recorded the first blocked punt for UCF since Sept. 7, 2019 with his block in the fourth quarter against South Carolina State in the season opener. He then recovered the punt in the endzone for the first punt returned for a touchdown for UCF since Nov. 12, 2016 against Cincinnati.

It was Bullard's first career touchdown.

### UCF IN AAC OPENERS

Since joining the American Athletic Conference in 2013, UCF has compiled a 7-3 record in conference openers after defeating SMU, 41-19, on Oct. 5 to open its conference slate.

In its final year in the American before joining the Big 12 Conference in July 2023, UCF will look to close out its tenure in the AAC similar to how it started in 2013, by winning the conference title.

### PLUMLEE TABBED AAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Following a stellar performance in the 40-14 win at Florida Atlantic, UCF quarterback John Rhys Plumlee was named American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week, the conference announced on Sept. 19.

Plumlee helped lead the Knights to a bounce back win in Boca Raton, as he threw for a career-high 339 yards and completed a career-best 25 passes. He completed nearly 70% of his passes and threw for a touchdown. He gashed the Owls defense with 20 rushing attempts for 121 yards and two rushing touchdowns.

The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native's 460 total offensive yards in the win over the Owls are the second most by a player in a single game this season and just three yards shy of tying for the national lead.

With Plumlee leading the charge, UCF rushed for 314 yards and passed for 339 yards to surpass 600 yards of total offense for the second time this season.

Plumlee is the first UCF player to earn AAC Offensive Player of the Week honors since Dillon Gabriel earned the accolade on Oct. 19, 2020.

In addition to earning the AAC honors, Plumlee was one of eight players named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 List, which recognizes the National Quarterback of the Week following the Florida Atlantic game.

### DEFENSE DOMINATES

After allowing 14 points in the first quarter at Florida Atlantic, the UCF defense dominated for the remainder of the game and held the Owls scoreless for the final three quarters. The Knights held FAU to zero yards of offense in the third quarter and just 18 yards in the fourth quarter.

### ELITE TERRITORY

Following the first 10 weeks of the season, UCF is one of only three teams nationally to surpass 600 yards of total offense in three games this season, joining Ohio State and Tennessee. In addition to the season-high mark in the win over the Owls, the Knights recorded 653 yards in the road win at Florida Atlantic

and tallied 605 yards in the season opener against South Carolina State.

### FOUR DIFFERENT DAYS OF THE WEEK

UCF has played games this season on four different days of the week. The Knights opened the season against South Carolina State on a Thursday and also played Temple on a Thursday, played Louisville on a Friday, Florida Atlantic, Georgia Tech, East Carolina, Memphis, Tulane and Navy on Saturdays and SMU on a Wednesday.

The Knights are the only FBS teams to play a game on four different days of the week this season.

### FEELING SPECIAL

UCF blocked a field goal attempt for the first time this season in the win at Florida Atlantic on Saturday, Sept. 17. Following a stellar goal line stop from the defense, redshirt junior defensive tackle Keenan Hester got a great push and leaped into the air to get his hand on a 19-yard field goal attempt from the Owls.

It was UCF's first field goal since Sept. 19, 2020, at Georgia Tech when Noah Hancock blocked a field goal in the second quarter.

It was the second big play on special teams for the Knights this season, after Quadric Bullard blocked a punt and returned it for a touchdown in the season opener against South Carolina State.

### HOLLER'S CAREER DAY

Alec Holler turned in a career day against Florida Atlantic, as the tight end reeled in three catches for a career-high 115 yards. Holler nearly doubled his career receiving yards in the contest, as he entered the game with 192 yards.

Holler caught a 64-yard pass from John Rhys Plumlee in the second quarter, which is a career long and was the longest passing play of the season for UCF at the time.

### FIRST OF HIS CAREER

Running back RJ Harvey recorded his first career rushing touchdown with a three-yard run in the third quarter at Florida Atlantic. Defensive tackle Lee Hunter notched the first sack of his career in the contest, taking down the Owls quarterback for a loss of seven yards in the third.

### COLLEGIATE DEBUTS

Freshman placekicker Colton Boomer and punter Mitch McCarthy both made their collegiate debuts against Florida Atlantic. Boomer drilled a 41-yard field goal on his first attempt of his career in the second quarter.

McCarthy's first career punt went for 46 yards with only a three-yard return. It was the only time UCF punted on the day.

### EVERYONE'S WATCHING

The UCF-Louisville game on Sept. 9 was the most viewed ESPN2 Friday game since 2013 with more than 1.8 million viewers. The mark is also the most watched regular season game on ESPN2 since 2017.

### KNIGHTS IN ROAD OPENERS

UCF has won its first road game of the season in five of the last six years. The Knights earned a dominant 40-14 win at Florida Atlantic on Sept. 17 to start their road slate with a win. Last year, UCF dropped a 42-35 game at Louisville but opened the 2020 campaign with a 49-21 win at Georgia Tech.

In 2019, the Knights defeated the FAU Owls in their first road game and UCF won 56-17 at UConn in 2018 in the squad's first road game.

### MALZAHN'S STILL PERFECT IN HOME SEASON OPENERS

UCF head coach Gus Malzahn improved to 11-0 in home season openers with the 56-10 win against South Carolina State.

He owns a 2-0 record at UCF, 8-0 at Auburn and 1-0 mark at Arkansas State.

### QUITE THE DEBUT FOR PLUMLEE

Making his debut in a UCF uniform against South Carolina State, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee wowed Knights fans with a stellar performance as he finished the night 20-of-31 passing for 308 yards and four touchdowns. He was also a factor with his legs, accounting for 100 yards rushing on 16 attempts with another score to account for five of UCF's seven touchdowns in the season-opening 56-10 win against South Carolina State.

Playing quarterback for the first time since 2020, Plumlee quickly acclimated to the position and led a Knights offense that piled up 605 total yards, the most by an AAC team in week one or week 0.

It was Plumlee's first game with both a rushing and passing touchdown in his career. Additionally, he tallied a career high with four passing touchdowns.

### FIRST CATCH, FIRST TOUCHDOWN

Redshirt senior tight end Zach Marsh Wojan recorded his first career catch in the season opener against South Carolina State, reeling in a 21-yard pass from Plumlee for his first career touchdown.

The Vacaville, California, native started three consecutive games with the team coming out in a two-tight end set against Louisville, Florida Atlantic and Georgia Tech.

### SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

A half-dozen UCF football standouts—running back Isaiah Bowser, tight end Kemore Gamble, offensive tackle Tylan Grable, wide receiver Ryan O'Keefe, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee and safety Divaad Wilson—have been named to the watch list for the 2023 Reese's Senior Bowl all-star game (Feb. 4, 2023, in Mobile, Alabama).

### LEADING THE CHARGE

Running back Isaiah Bowser, defensive lineman Josh Celiscar, offensive lineman Sam Jackson, linebacker Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste and receiver Ryan O'Keefe have been selected captains of the 2022 UCF football squad by vote of their teammates. Jackson was also a captain during the 2021 season as well.

### STRONG RETURNERS

Fifteen returning starters (eight on defense, seven on offense) plus a handful of key specialists are back for Gus Malzahn in 2022 as UCF looks to compete for the American Athletic Conference championship it last won in 2017 and 2018.

### COOL UNDER PRESSURE

UCF led the nation last season in fourth-down conversion percentage at 84.6%. The Knights were successful on 11 of their 13 fourth-down attempts.

This season, UCF ranks 20th nationally at 62.5%, converting 10 of its 16 attempts.

### RETURNING WEAPONS

The Knights return a solid list of weapons for 2022:

- their starting quarterback, Mikey Keene, who threw for 1,730 yards and 17 TDs in 2021
- their top six rushers, led by Isaiah Bowser, who ran for 703 yards and nine TDs in only eight games, and Johnny Richardson, who led the team with 733 yards and three TDs
- four of their top five receivers, paced by Ryan O'Keefe and his 84 receptions for 812 yards and seven TDs
- two of their top four tacklers in safeties Quadric Bullard (83 tackles, 6 PBU) and Divaad Wilson (72 tackles)

### WHO'S GONE

The most noteworthy personnel losses for UCF are:

- wide receiver Brandon Johnson (38 catches for 565 yards and 11 TDs in 2021; signed free-agent contract with NFL Denver Broncos)
- offensive linemen Cole Schneider (47 career starts; signed as free agent with NFL Green Bay Packers) and Marcus Tatum (18 career starts; signed as free agent with NFL Jacksonville Jaguars)
- leading tackler Tatum Bethune (108 tackles; 1st-team all-AAC/Pro Football Network)
- linebacker Bryson Armstrong (led the squad in tackles much of the year, finishing with 77 after a season-ending injury in the 10th game)
- defensive end Big Kat Bryant (paced the Knights with 14 tackles for loss, 6 sacks and 10 quarterback hurries, while adding 52 tackles; consensus 1st-team all-AAC; signed free-agent contract with NFL Dallas Cowboys)
- quarterback Dillon Gabriel (started first 3 games in 2021 and 25 in a row in his career before season-ending injury; career totals included 554 of 913 passing for 8,037 yards, 70 TDs, 14 ints.)
- wide receiver Jaylon Robinson (18 rec. for 322, 2 TDs in 2021; 1st-team all-AAC in 2020 with 55 rec. for 979, 6 TDs)
- defensive tackle Kalia Davis (6th-round pick of San Francisco 49ers in 2022 NFL Draft; 17 tackles, 4.5 TFL in 2021 while playing only 5 games)

Starters returning on offense are Keene, Bowser/Richardson (5 starts each), O'Keefe, center Matt Lee, guard Lokahi Pauole, tackle Sam Jackson and tight end Alec Holler (19 for 192, 3 TDs).

Regulars back on defense are end Josh Celiscar (39 tackles in 2021), tackles Ricky Barber (29) and Keenan Hester (24), linebacker Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste (51), plus defensive backs Brandon Adams (19), Davonte Brown (38), Corey Thornton (32), Justin Hodges (35), Bullard and Wilson.

Among specialists returning are placekicker Daniel Obarski (8 of 14 on field goals), punter Andrew Osteen (41.1-yard average) and All-America long snapper Alex Ward.

UCF returns eight players who received either first-, second- or third-team all-conference recognition on at least one all-AAC team in 2021—O'Keefe, Pauole, Bullard, Wilson, Brown, Lee, Thornton and Ward.

### DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

UCF hopes to continue its defensive improvement after ranking seventh

in the country in pass efficiency defense in 2021 (after standing 104th in 2020)--continuing a string of recent top-12 finishes (8th in 2011, 11th in 2014, 12th in 2016 and 3rd in 2019).

The Knights improved their NCAA standing in passing yards allowed by 86 slots (35th in 2021 at 210.1 after 121st in 2020 at 299.2), including 89 fewer yards per game.

UCF improved by 70 spots in total defense (53rd in 2021 at 369.3 versus 123rd in 2020 at 491.8). That's 122.5 fewer yards allowed per game than last year.

According to Pro Football Focus, UCF's 2021 "stop rate" (percent of defensive drives that ended in punts, turnovers or turnovers on down) ranked 28th nationally at 69.5%, 31 spots higher than in 2020.

The Knights ranked 28th nationally in rushing, the fourth straight season the Knights have averaged at least 196 yards per game.

### NEW FACES

The Knights' spring workouts included four incoming freshmen who enrolled in January (quarterback Thomas Castellanos, defensive back Nikai Martinez, running back Jordan McDonald and tight end Grant Stevens) plus transfers John Rhys Plumlee (QB/Ole Miss), Tylan Grable (OL/Jacksonville State), Kobe Hudson (WR/Auburn), K.D. McDaniel (DE/Kentucky), Ryan Swoboda (OL/Virginia), Koby Perry (DB/Austin Peay), Kemore Gamble (TE/Florida), Lee Hunter (DT/Auburn) and Terrence Lewis (LB/Maryland).

Additional transfers added later to the roster are Javon Baker (WR/Alabama), Will Bohn (QB/Coffeyville), Demarkcus Bowman (RB/Clemson/Florida), John Harris (OL/Virginia Tech/Mercer), Branden Jennings (LB/Maryland/Kansas State), Terrell Jackson (DB/Air Force Prep), Jason Johnson (LB/Eastern Illinois), Cameron Kinnie (OL/Georgia), Camden Vining (LB/Army) and Walter Yates (LB/Savannah State).

247Sports rated UCF's incoming list of transfers as the 16th best group in the country—while the Knights' overall combined ranking (incoming freshmen plus transfers) was 38th nationally, highest in program history.

### WELCOME TO ORLANDO

The Knights have two new members of their full-time coaching roster: offensive coordinator/quarterback coach Chip Lindsey (most recently head coach at Troy) and wide receiver coach Grant Heard (most recently at Indiana).

### MALZAHNS CONTRIBUTE TO UCF

UCF head football coach Gus Malzahn and his wife Kristi have made a \$250,000 gift commitment to McNamara Cove which is part of "The Gateway" football campus project made possible by Sharon and Marc Hagle (<https://ucfknight.com/news/2022/6/28/football-sharon-and-marc-hagle-commit-more-than-5-million-to-ucf-athletics.aspx>).

The commitment marks a major step forward in creating momentum for UCF's Mission XII initiative ([www.missionXII.com](http://www.missionXII.com)) as the Knights look toward their official transition to the Big 12 Conference July 1, 2023.

"We are excited about the future for UCF," said Kristi and Gus Malzahn. "We love Orlando, This Place, our amazing fans and our players. McNamara Cove, among other projects and initiatives for UCF Athletics, is a game-changer in the lives of our student-athletes. Just as we always challenge our players, our goal is to

use our influence in a positive way and hopefully this gift does that and helps us compete for championships moving forward in the Big 12."

According to UCF vice president and director of athletics Terry Mohajir, "We are grateful that Kristi and Gus made a commitment to help fund our ongoing efforts to further develop the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village, specifically McNamara Cove. We believe this gift will allow us to better serve our student-athletes and the UCF community. We hope their leadership inspires others."

The future vision of the UCF football campus was first presented to UCF Board of Trustees in August 2021, including significant proposed new elements that will enhance the Knights' ability to compete for football championships. The intent

**BURNETT, MURRAY HEADLINE 2022 UCF ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS**

Two former UCF football greats—Joe Burnett and Latavius Murray—headline the UCF Athletics Hall of Fame class for 2022.

That duo is joined by fellow inductees Mackenzie Audas (softball), Linda Gooch (cheer coach), and Krystina Sarff (rowing).

That quintet were officially inducted into the Hall of Fame on Friday, Sept. 23 and honored on the field at halftime of the UCF-Georgia Tech football game the following day at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

The UCF Athletics Hall of Fame since 1998 has been inducting former Knight players and coaches and others connected to the UCF program.

Here are details on Burnett and Murray:

**Joe Burnett, Football, 2005-2008**

- record-setting cornerback and return specialist for Knights
- named first-team All-American as senior in 2008 by ESPN.com and Sports Illustrated, as only player in country to rank in NCAA top 20 in both punt and kickoff returns (he led Conference USA in both categories); a second-team pick by Walter Camp Foundation; named Conference USA Special Teams Player of Year in 2008
- an eight-time first-team all-Conference USA selection (four as punt returner, three as defensive back, one as kickoff returner)
- named to Freshman All-America teams in 2005 by Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), Rivals.com, CollegeFootballNews.com and The Sporting News
- helped UCF to its first two bowl berths (2005 Hawaii, 2007 Liberty) and school's first conference championship in 2007
- holds UCF record with 16 career interceptions; set UCF and Conference USA career marks for punt return yards with 1,304; set UCF records for most punt returns (96) and tied the record for most punt return touchdowns with three
- averaged 13.6 average yards per punt return and 28.7 yards per kick return, along with two touchdowns
- had 221 career tackles, including 12 TFLs, 16 career interceptions and 35 pass break-ups; started 46 games among 49 career games played
- drafted by Pittsburgh Steelers as 32nd pick of fifth round (168th overall) of 2009 NFL Draft
- played three seasons with Steelers (2009-2010), New York Giants and Jacksonville Jaguars (2011)
- moved on to Canadian Football League with Edmonton Eskimos (2011-2014), Calgary Stampeders (2015-2017) and Montreal Alouettes (2018)
- native of Eustis, Florida
- 2008 UCF graduate with degree in interdisciplinary studies and minor in hospitality

**Latavius Murray, Football, 2008-2012**

- finished his UCF career second in school history in total touchdowns (44), eighth in carries (453), seventh in yards (2,424) and third in rushing TDs (37)
- also caught 50 career passes for 524 yards and six TDs
- MVP of 2010 Conference USA Championship Game and 2010 Liberty Bowl victory over Georgia, when he scored winning TD and rushed for 104 yards in UCF's first bowl win
- first-team all-Conference USA choice in 2012
- rushed for career-high 233 yards and two TDs in final game of junior year in 2011 versus UTEP

- ran for 1,106 yards and 15 TDs on 198 attempts in senior season of 2012
- has played in NFL since 2013 with Oakland Raiders (2013-16; sixth-round draft pick in 2013), Minnesota Vikings (2017-18), New Orleans Saints (2019-20) and Baltimore Ravens (2021)
- has rushed for 5,492 yards (1,310 attempts) and 49 touchdowns in NFL career; also 195 receptions for 1,369 yards and two TDs
- NFL Pro Bowl selection in 2015 after rushing for career-high 1,066 yards (career-best 266 attempts) and making career-high 41 receptions (232 yards)
- inducted into 2022 Greater Syracuse Hall of Fame in June
- native of Titusville, Florida; attended high school in Onondaga, New York
- 2012 UCF graduate with degree in interpersonal/organizational communication

Longtime UCF radio play-by-play veteran Marc Daniels is in his 28th season in that role in 2022. He's also UCF's director of broadcasting. Analyst Gary Parris (a former Florida State player) is in his 27th season in that position. They are joined by Scott Adams (pre-game host and sideline reporter—in his 21st season), Frank Lovre (engineer, in his 31st season) and Chris Vazquez (producer, in his fifth season).

A new addition for 2022 is former UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton. He will be part of the pre-game show looking at the week's opponent and "KZ's Keys to the Game" segment. He will appear on the "Orlando Health Jewett Orthopedic Institute Tailgate Show" before each game this season. Milton also will serve as a sideline analyst for selected home games this season.

Pre-game coverage begins two hours before kickoff and features a preview of the game with interviews from UCF players and coaches—including coach Gus Malzahn and athletics director Terry Mohajir. All games and radio shows can be heard on 96.9FM/740AM—and UCF fans can access all broadcasts from anywhere with the iHeart app (search for 96.9 The Game).

**UCF ADDS SPANISH RADIO BROADCAST FOR HOME FOOTBALL GAMES**

UCF home football games for the first time in 2022 will feature a Spanish radio broadcast, presented by Florida Blue and accessible through a link from the main athletics webpage, [UCFKnights.com](http://UCFKnights.com).

There are more than 62 million Hispanics in the United States, and an estimated 41.7 million U.S. residents, or 13.5% of the population, speak Spanish at home.

The U.S. Department of Education officially designated UCF as a Hispanic Serving Institution in 2019, paving the way for the university to secure additional federal funding to improve the educational experience of Hispanic and low-income students. To become a qualifying institution, Hispanic enrollment must be at least 25% of full-time-equivalent undergraduate students. UCF's Hispanic enrollment was 28% for Fall 2021.

UCF has invested in numerous pathways that serve Hispanic students and position them to succeed, including peer mentoring programs, leadership development and a variety of partnerships including one with Google to assist students with developing their digital skills for career readiness. This summer, UCF joined the Alliance of Hispanic Serving Research Universities, which aims to double the number of Hispanic doctoral students and increase the number of Hispanic faculty by 20%. Last year, UCF earned the prestigious Seal of Excelencia

from Excelencia in Education, a reflection of the university's commitment to accelerating Hispanic student success, and Hispanic Outlook magazine ranked UCF among the top schools for awarding bachelor's and master's degrees to Hispanic students.

Carlos Bohorquez, who handles play by play, has been the Spanish radio play-by-play voice for the NFL Tampa Bay Buccaneers since 2018. Bohorquez has additional experience calling soccer matches in his native Venezuela and here in the United States. He also has worked on numerous shows on Univision and currently serves as the producer for Todo Tampa Bay.

Sergio Ruiz Torres, the color analyst, is the Spanish play-by-play voice of MLS Orlando City SC. Ruiz is in his eighth season at the helm on Acción 97.9FM/810AM. A former sports anchor for Univisión Orlando, the native of Venezuela also serves as a producer and reporter for Telemundo Orlando and previously broadcast World Cup qualifying, Copa America and Copa Libertadores matches.

"We are excited to add Spanish broadcasts for all UCF football home games this season," says Marc Daniels, UCF director of broadcasting and radio play-by-play voice of the Knights. "As Knight Nation continues to grow across the area and beyond, we feel this allows us to serve the demand of that growing fan base. We are thrilled to add Carlos and Sergio to our broadcast team of talent. They bring tremendous experience and passion and look forward to the new season."

The Spanish broadcast streams will be available for all seven UCF home games at FBC Mortgage Stadium.

### BOWLS, BCS AND NEW YEAR'S SIX

- The Knights appeared in their sixth straight bowl game in 2021, extending the program record for most consecutive bowl game appearances. UCF played in the Cure Bowl in 2016, the Peach Bowl in 2017, the Fiesta Bowl in 2018, the Gasparilla Bowl in 2019, and the Boca Raton Bowl in 2020.
- The 2021 Gasparilla Bowl marked UCF's ninth bowl appearance in the last 10 seasons and the Knights' 13th in the past 17 years.
- Since the 2013 season, UCF has appeared in three BCS/New Year's Six bowl games and won two (2014 Fiesta Bowl, 2018 Peach Bowl).
- The Knights are one of only 17 FBS programs in the nation to appear in three such games during that span and one of only 12 teams to win two games during that time.
- UCF is the only current non-"Power 5" team to appear on either list.

### BIG 12 CONFERENCE

- The University of Central Florida accepted an invitation to join the Big 12 Conference, as announced by Big 12 commissioner Bob Bowlsby, UCF director of athletics Terry Mohajir, and UCF President Alex Cartwright on Friday, Sept. 10, 2021.
- The Knights athletics program has now moved from Division III, Division II, the FCS level, the FBS level that included time in the MAC, Conference USA, the AAC, and now to the Big 12 Conference.
- Mohajir: *"This is a landmark day for anyone ever associated with UCF or UCF Athletics. As we anticipate a future move to the Big 12 Conference, we first owe a vote of thanks to all those at UCF who have gone before us. There's a long list of student-athletes, coaches, athletics directors, university presidents and support staff, fans and donors and, of course, our student body, plus so many others whose hard work and successes have helped pave the way for today's announcement. The bases were already loaded, and I feel very blessed and honored to get to step up to the plate on behalf of UCF."*

### FUTURE FOOTBALL CAMPUS VISION

- On August 19, 2021, UCF director of athletics Terry Mohajir announced his planned vision for UCF Athletics' football campus at the Kenneth G. Dixon Athletics Village.
- UCF's previously announced McNamara Cove that will include a recovery river for student-athletes and "Covegating" experiences for fans on game days is part of the plan.
- Also announced was the Launch Club, a new structure on the south side of the stadium located above the Garvy Center for Nutrition, combined with premium seating areas.
- The north end zone will feature additional seating and standing-room only decks for expansion of the Knightmare Student Section.

**UCF SELLS OUT SEASON TICKET ALLOTMENT AGAIN IN 2022**

UCF sold out its allotment of home football season tickets in 2022 for the third time in four years (also in 2019 and 2021). Meanwhile, the Knights are coming off a handful of their highest season attendance averages in school history:

--Both in 2007 (the year FBC Mortgage Stadium opened—then known as Bright House Networks Stadium) and again in 2018 (when UCF finished 8-0 at home) the Knights averaged a season-record 44,018 spectators for each game in a facility that officially seats 44,206.

--In 2019 UCF again was unbeaten at home (at 6-0) while averaging 43,788 fans per game (third-highest season average).

--Then in Gus Malzahn's first season at UCF in 2021, the Knights did not lose any of their seven home games while averaging 40,427 fans per contest (fifth-highest mark all-time).

--UCF's first two home games in 2022 averaged 44,111, just less than 100 below capacity.

--The single-game high-water mark in 2018 came when 47,795 fans viewed UCF's victory over 19th-ranked Cincinnati on a weekend when ESPN Game Day came to UCF for the first time. That number is the second-highest single-game figure for Spectrum Stadium (48,453 fans watched the 2009 home game against Miami).

Since it opened in 2007 the Knights' home stadium has added a premium chair-back seating and club area, the Carl Black and Gold Cabana, on the east side of the field and a similar Stadium Club on the west side, also including chair-back seats and premium amenities. The Carl Black and Gold Cabana area expanded in 2019 with the addition of approximately 900 more gold chair-back seats. Other major premium additions were field cabanas in the south end zone in 2017 and then in the north end zone in 2018—and loge cabanas on the south side in 2018 and north side for 2019.

Gus Malzahn's first season as UCF head football coach in 2021 featured six wins in the Knights' final seven games, an overall 9-4 mark capped by a postseason bowl invitation (10th straight for teams coached by Malzahn and sixth straight for UCF), a 29-17 Gasparilla Bowl triumph over Florida, a perfect 7-0 home record—and an eye-opening response to a parade of injuries to key personnel.

Malzahn's Knights began the season by recording the largest comeback victory in UCF history in a 36-31 weather-delayed triumph over Boise State. His first team in Orlando prospered by pulling out three other wins by four-point margins and playing six games overall decided by a touchdown or less—with two UCF defeats coming by a combined 11 points.

The Knights had to survive the early-season loss of their starting quarterback (Dillon Gabriel—he missed the last 10 games) as well as lengthy sideline stints for their best defensive player (tackle Kalia Davis—he missed the last eight games), their top running back (Isaiah Bowser—he missed five games) and their most dangerous receiver (Jaylon Robinson—he missed six games). They finished the campaign by running for 288 yards in the bowl triumph over Florida in front of 63,669 fans in Tampa.

One of three finalists for the Steve Spurrier Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America to the best head coach in his first year at a school, Malzahn saw long snapper Alex Ward win third-team All-America honors from Phil Steele, while defensive end Big Kat Bryant was a first-team All-American Athletic Conference pick by three different selectors. Pro Football Network named Bryant the AAC Newcomer of the Year and the league's Defensive Lineman of the Year.

Eight other UCF players received at least one first- or second-team All-AAC honor—linebacker Tatum Bethune, receivers Ryan O'Keefe and Brandon Johnson, offensive linemen Lokahi Paulele, Cole Schneider and Marcus Tatum, and defensive backs Quadric Bullard and Divaad Wilson.

UCF in 2021 ranked seventh nationally in team pass efficiency defense (after ranking 104th in that NCAA statistical category the previous year), while also showing dramatic improvement in several other statistical categories:

--An upgrade of 86 slots in passing yards allowed compared to 2020, while permitting 89.1 fewer passing yards in 2021

--An improvement of 70 slots in total defense, while allowing 122.5 fewer yards per game compared to the previous season

Malzahn and his staff then capped their first season by building the highest-rated recruiting class in UCF history (rated 38th overall by 247Sports, including both high school players and transfers).

Malzahn, who led Auburn to the Bowl Championship Series National Championship Game following the 2013 season in the first of eight straight years his Tigers qualified for bowl games, was named the

ninth head football coach at UCF on Feb. 15, 2021. He begins his second season with the Knights in 2022.

In eight years as head football coach at Auburn, Malzahn also led the Tigers to a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and six New Year's Day bowl selections to go with those eight postseason appearances.

Malzahn, now 94-45 (.676) in 11 seasons overall as a head coach, has helped teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 16 seasons as a collegiate coach, including winning a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012. In the final Associated Press rankings his Auburn teams finished second (2013), 10th (2017), 22nd (2014) and 24th (2016).

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach-of-the-Year honors that season after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history. He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and top-ranked Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship Game win over fifth-ranked Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

The 34-28 victory over top-rated Alabama in 2013 came on a memorable 100-yard return of a Tide missed field goal on the final play of the game. Malzahn's Tiger squads also defeated seventh-ranked Texas A&M in 2013, seventh-rated Ole Miss in 2014, second-ranked Georgia and top-rated Alabama in 2017 and fifth-ranked Alabama in 2019.

After his eight seasons at Auburn, Malzahn qualified as the second-longest tenured head coach at one school in the SEC. He is one of only 10 active FBS head coaches to take a team to a national championship game. During his time with the Tigers, Auburn was one of only three SEC schools to play in multiple SEC Championships games and play for a national championship.

Malzahn has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 16 seasons as a college coach, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 (despite missing significant time with injuries) and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 and 2010 (both Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.





During Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, the Tigers had the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 228.6 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) came under Malzahn's leadership. Auburn became just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards (also Texas A&M in 2012).

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing TDs in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense versus Missouri in the 2013 SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Mason, the 2013 SEC Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 TDs, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. He set Auburn single-season records for rushing yards and all-purpose yards (2,374) and was second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards versus fifth-rated Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

In Malzahn's eight seasons at Auburn 32 players were selected in the National Football League Draft, highlighted by four first-round picks—including Derrick Brown (No. 7) and Noah Igbinoghene (No. 30) in 2020. Malzahn's other first-round picks were Greg Robinson (No. 2 overall) and Dee Ford (No. 23) in 2014. In the last two drafts combined (2020 and 2021), 12 Auburn players were drafted, most for the Tigers in a two-year span in the common draft era.

Malzahn coached 14 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn, including consensus selections center Reese Dismukes (2014) and defensive lineman Derrick Brown (2019). Brown won the Lott IMPACT Trophy in 2019, while Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center.

The Tigers faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's eight years at Auburn, facing 38 ranked opponents, including 21 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1- and No. 2-ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four College Football Playoff semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn and his coaching proved highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive top-10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in Auburn history. Six of his eight recruiting classes rated in the top 11 nationally.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012 when he led the program to a 9-3 regular-season mark and the Sun Belt Conference title. In that role he worked hand in hand with current UCF vice president and director of athletics Terry Mohajir who was named the Red Wolves' vice chancellor and director of athletics in the middle of that 2012 season and remained in that role until coming to UCF in early 2021.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957. Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records while leading the SEC and finishing in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. Malzahn coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 TDs, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the number-one overall selection in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) as assistant head coach and co-offensive coordinator at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records. The 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally, averaging 47.2 points per game. Malzahn in 2006 spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state

Gus Malzahn was responsible for two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history: Auburn in 2013 (7,018 yards of total offense and Auburn in 2010 (6,989 yards of total offense).

## 50-POINT GAMES

Since the year 2000, in the eight years Malzahn was at Auburn, the Tigers posted 25 50-point games. In the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers recorded three 50-point games in a season four times with Malzahn as head coach (2013, 2016, 2018, 2019)

## MALZAHN AT HOME

Malzahn now holds a record of 58-13 (.816) at home as a collegiate head coach. He was 5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State, at Auburn went 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017, 5-2 in 2018, 6-1 in 2019 and 4-1 in 2020, finished 2021 with UCF 7-0 and was 5-2 this year. He started his tenure at Auburn with 13 consecutive home victories.

## NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Gus Malzahn earned multiple national coach of the year awards in 2013, including the Eddie Robinson Award, the Bobby Bowden Award, and the Bear Bryant Award, as well as national coach of the year honors from Home Depot, the Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, and USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

After one year as defensive coordinator in 1991 he spent four years (1992-95) as head coach at Hughes (Arkansas) High School, five years in 1996-2000 as head coach at Shiloh (Arkansas) High School and five years (2001-05) as head coach at Springdale (Arkansas) High School.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Arkansas, and played football at Arkansas (wide receiver in 1984-85) and Henderson State (receiver and punter in 1988-89), earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson State in 1990. As a player he helped the Razorbacks to the 1984 Liberty Bowl and the 1985 Holiday Bowl (a win over Arizona State).

Malzahn and his wife Kristi (Otwell) are parents of two daughters, Kylie (Collin) Peek and Kenzie (Charl) Stander.

**ORLANDO** – The UCF football team came out strong in its home opener against South Carolina State Thursday Night at FBC Mortgage Stadium, scoring 28 unanswered to start the evening in route to a 56-10 victory. The win was the Knights' seventh straight in home openers.

The Black and Gold received the ball to start the game, giving quarterback John Rhys Plumlee his introduction to Knights fans. Plumlee found Javon Baker on a crossing route for a 12-yard touchdown pass, capping off the Knights' 70-yard opening drive.

Plumlee found the end zone twice more in the first quarter, with a beautiful 30-yard pass to Kemore Gamble. Just over four minutes later, he decided to take it himself, weaving past the Bulldogs defense for a 17-yard touchdown rush and pushing the Knights to an early 21-0 lead. Before the end of the half, Isaiah Bowser recorded his first of two rushing touchdowns of the game, and UCF took a commanding 28-3 lead into the locker room at the half.

The Bulldogs notched their only touchdown of the game in the third quarter, to which the Knights responded with another 28 unanswered point run to close the game. Plumlee recorded two more touchdowns in his debut, finding both Johnny Richardson on an 18-yard pass and Zach Marsh-Wojan on a 21-yard pass.

Special teams showed their strength in the first minutes of the fourth quarter, as Quadric Bullard blocked a Bulldogs punt and recovered it in the endzone for a defensive score, pushing the score to its final margin of 56-10. The blocked punt was the first since Sept. 7, 2019. The returned touchdown was the first since Nov. 12, 2016 against Cincinnati.

With a five-touchdown performance from Plumlee, freshman Thomas Castellanos also gave a worthy introduction to the fans with a 32-yard rush in his first drive.

Walter Yates III led the UCF defense with seven total tackles, while redshirt-senior safety Divaad Wilson recorded his third career interception in the victory.

**ORLANDO** – Despite a pair of opportunities to tie the score or take the lead late, the UCF football team came up short against the Louisville Cardinals, 20-14, Friday night at FBC Mortgage Stadium. The Knights move to 1-1 on the year, while the Cardinals improve to 1-1.

“Obviously an extremely tough loss,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “We came out of the game playing well. We were in control of the game and at halftime had some momentum. The third quarter we came out and did nothing really offensively at all.

“We had a long touchdown called back for holding I think, it was a second of the game. Our defense did a good job at the end, that gave us a chance. We just didn’t get things done down there.”

Trailing late in the fourth quarter, the UCF defense came up with a big fourth down stop to give the offense a chance to knot the score with 5:41 remaining. Quarterback John Rhys Plumlee found wide receiver Javon Baker for a 24-yard pass to put the Knights in the red zone. A three-yard rush from Isaiah Bowser gave UCF first and goal from the nine-yard line, but the Black and Gold was unable to convert.

The Knights defense rose to the occasion once again to force a Louisville punt with 1:41 on the clock, but UCF was unable to get in the endzone and turned the ball over after an unsuccessful fourth-down attempt.

After Louisville scored on its opening drive following a touchdown from Tiyon Evans, UCF countered with a 10 play, 80-yard drive capped off by Bowser’s two-yard touchdown run to even the game at 7-7. Bowser found the endzone a few minutes later, this time from three yards out to give the Knights a 14-7 lead.

Louisville trimmed the UCF advantage to 14-10 after a 35-yard field goal from James Turner and the Cards took the lead after quarterback Malik Cunningham broke loose for a 43-yard touchdown run to make it 17-14.

UCF had a few big plays called back in the second half due to penalties and the Knights were not able to find the endzone.

Jason Johnson led a strong defensive effort with 12 tackles, including nine solo stops. Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste tallied seven and Quadric Bullard had four.

**BOCA RATON, Fla.** — After allowing just 18 yards in the second half, UCF football bounced back in a big way with a 40-14 win against Florida Atlantic Saturday night at FAU Stadium. The Knights defense held the Owls to zero yards in the third quarter and only allowed 18 yards in the fourth quarter.

UCF (2-1) has now won all four games in the series against Florida Atlantic (2-2), including a perfect 2-0 record at FAU Stadium.

Florida Atlantic scored on its opening drive of the game, but UCF quickly responded to knot the score at 7-7. Following consecutive passes to Ryan O'Keefe and Xavier Townsend, Knights quarterback John Rhys Plumlee called his own number and scored on a rushing play from seven yards out.

The Owls scored a second touchdown with a few seconds remaining in the first quarter, but the Knights defense held Florida Atlantic scoreless for the final three quarters.

A 41-yard field goal from freshman kicker Colton Boomer, making his collegiate debut, cut the UCF deficit to 14-10 and Plumlee scored his second rushing touchdown of the game a few minutes later to give the Knights a 16-14 lead at halftime. The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native turned in a career performance with 121 rushing yards, a career-high 339 passing yards and 25 completions for three total touchdowns.

The second half was all UCF with the Knights compiling 327 yards of total offense and limiting Florida Atlantic to 18 total yards.

Isaiah Bowser opened the second-half scoring with a one-yard rushing touchdown, his fifth of the season. The Sidney, Ohio, native has scored a rushing touchdown in all three games this season and dating back to the bowl game last year, Bowser has seven touchdowns in his last four games.

A three-yard touchdown run from RJ Harvey pushed the Knights' lead to 30-14 on the redshirt junior running back's first career touchdown.

Boomer connected on a 29-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to finish a perfect 2-2 on field goal attempts, stretching the UCF advantage to 33-14. Javon Baker reeled in a 20-yard pass from Plumlee for the final score of the game to cap a nine-play, 69-yard drive.

**ORLANDO** – Headlined by 284 yards rushing, the UCF football team defeated Georgia Tech 27-10 Saturday afternoon at FBC Mortgage Stadium. For the third time this season, the Knights held an opponent to 14 points or less.

“It was a good, hard fought win at home,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “Our crowd was unbelievable, and we really appreciate our crowd. We started out with a 20-play drive, I think it took almost 10 minutes and we only got three points with that. That’s really the first time I’ve seen that. Probably the big play of the game was the blocked punt right before halftime, that gave us some momentum going into halftime.

“Our defense got off the field and came back out. We were able to establish a run better once the second half got going. I think we had 285 yards rushing. There’s a lot of things we can correct, which is good. We got a quality win. I’m very proud of our players and our coaches.”

UCF scored first in the game following a 20-play, 71-yard opened drive capped by a 21-yard field goal from freshman Colton Boomer. The game’s opening drive featured 17 running plays and chewed up 9:47. It was the longest scoring drive by time of possession since Oct. 27, 2012, in a 54-17 UCF win over Marshall.

Georgia Tech countered with a 59-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Jeff Sims to wide receiver Malachi Carter in the second quarter, as the Yellow Jackets pulled ahead 7-3. A few minutes later, Boomer connected on his second field goal of the game from 31 yards out, as the Knights regained the lead 10-7.

A big play on special teams helped UCF head into the locker room at halftime with momentum leading 13-7, as redshirt senior Jarvis Ware powered through the Yellow Jackets line to get a hand on the punt attempt from David Shanahan. For the second time this season, Quadric Bullard scooped up the blocked punt and returned it 29 yards for the touchdown. It was the first blocked punt of Ware’s career.

For the second consecutive game, the Knights defense was stellar in the second half as Georgia Tech was just 1-for-7 on third down attempts, 0-for-3 on fourth down attempts and 0-for-3 on red zone opportunities.

“Our defense did a good job,” Malzahn added. “We did give up some yards, but once we got into the red zone, they came up big time and time again. Our team is growing, I thought it was a quality win.”

The teams traded field goals in the third quarter, with Boomer connecting from 37 yards and Georgia Tech’s Jude Kelley making a 42-yarder to cut the UCF lead to 16-10 heading into the fourth quarter.

John Rhys Plumlee scored his fourth rushing touchdown of the season with 10:37 remaining in the game, breaking free along the right side for a 28-yard scamper. He finished the game with 100 rushing yards on 16 attempts.

Boomer matched the Knights program record with his fourth field goal of the game to push the UCF lead to 27-10. The Lake Mary, Florida, native is the first player to make four field goals in a single game since Matthew Wright against South Carolina State on Sept. 3, 2016.

Jason Johnson led the UCF defense with eight tackles, while Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste returned to the lineup for the Knights and contributed seven, including 2.0 TFLs.

**ORLANDO** – Thanks to a strong second half, the UCF football team opened American Athletic Conference play with a 41-19 win over SMU Wednesday night at FBC Mortgage Stadium. Trailing 13-10 at halftime, the Knights outscored the Mustangs 31-6 in the second half with SMU scoring as time expired.

“First of all, I’m really proud of our team and the way we played, specifically in the second half,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “We’ve been talking all week about we’ve got to come out in the second half and play good football and we did that. We dominated the second half.”

“We played our best football game, and I’m telling you hats off to SMU. They’re a really good team and Coach Lashlee is a great coach. We wish them nothing but the best moving forward.”

The game was a difference of two halves, as SMU compiled 287 yards of total offense to UCF’s 145 to take a three-point lead into the intermission. It was a different story in the second half; however, as the Knights came out of the locker room and dominated for the remainder of the game.

UCF recorded 204 yards of offense in the third quarter, passing for 148 yards and rushing for 56 yards. The Knights’ defense was stellar in the quarter, shutting out SMU and limiting the Mustangs to just 83 yards. SMU was 0-for-3 on third-down conversions and 0-for-2 fourth-down conversions in the third quarter.

Isaiah Bowser ignited the offense with a one-yard touchdown run to give UCF a 17-13 lead after the extra point from Colton Boomer. Ryan O’Keefe found the endzone for the first time this season on a 26-yard pass from John Rhys Plumlee with 3:07 remaining to push the Knights’ advantage to 24-13.

UCF’s defense pressure continued in the fourth quarter, as Tre’mon Morris-Brash tackled SMU quarterback Tanner Mordecai in the endzone for a six-yard loss and the Knights first safety since the 2021 season opener against Boise State.

Plumlee found O’Keefe for his second touchdown reception of the game on a 58-yard pass, as O’Keefe scampered down the left side of the field. Bowser recorded his third rushing touchdown of the game and eighth of the season to take over the AAC lead, extending UCF’s lead to 41-13.

Several Knights turned in their best performances of the season, as Javon Baker caught a career-best six passes for 138 yards, which was also a personal best. O’Keefe’s 117 yards receiving were a season-high and Plumlee surpassed 300 yards passing for the third time this season.

Jeremiah Jean-Baptiste, Jason Johnson and Koby Perry led UCF in tackles with nine each. The Knights defense tallied seven tackles for loss, eight pass break ups and five quarterback hurries.

**ORLANDO** – In its annual Space Game, the UCF football team played out of this world to rout the Temple Owls, 70-13, Thursday night at FBC Mortgage Stadium. The Knights' 70 points scored are the third most in program history and third most by an FBS team this season.

UCF moves to 5-1 on the year and 2-0 in American Athletic Conference play, while Temple falls to 2-4 and 0-2 in league action. The Knights remained unbeaten in their annual Space Game with a record of 6-0 following the win.

"I'm real pleased with our team," said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. "I think we played our best football game tonight. Early on they moved the football, but our defense held them to field goals. Offensively, I thought we had some good rhythm early and had some good drives. Probably the key drive of the whole game was right before halftime. We were able to punch that in and give it some breathing room.

"Our defense played really well in the second half, I think they gave up around 90 yards and held another opponent under 20 points. I think that's the ninth in a row or something like that."

UCF's offense was firing on all cylinders in the game, recording 737 total yards – the second most by an FBS team in a single game this season behind Ohio State's 763 yards against Toledo. The Knights rushed for more than 300 yards for the second time this season and passed for 433 yards, the most in a game since Oct. 24, 2020, against Tulane when UCF had 422.

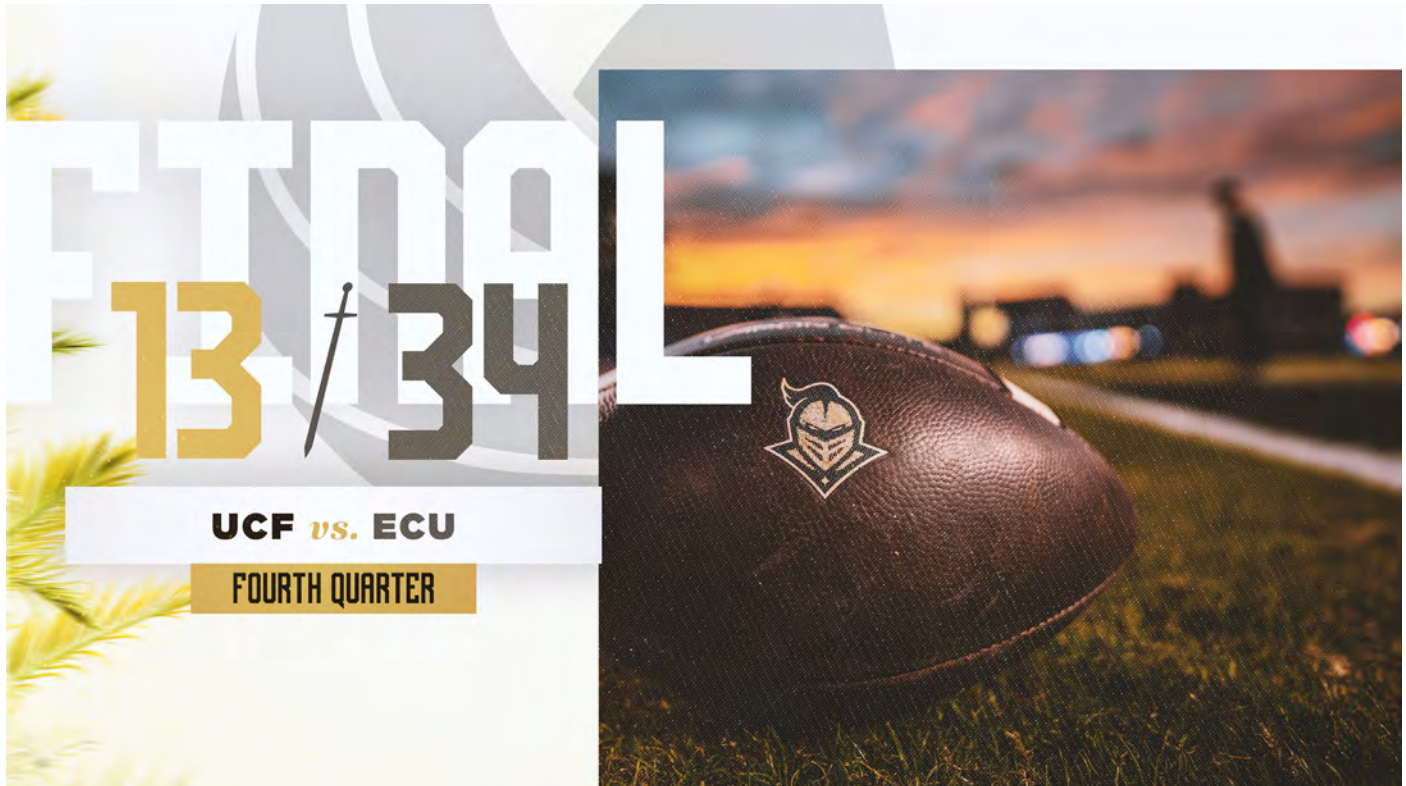
Knights quarterback John Rhys Plumlee had arguably one of the best performances of his career, as he tied the program record with seven touchdowns responsible for with four passing and three rushing. The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native tied the mark set by former UCF standouts Darin Slack in 1987 and Daunte Culpepper in 1998. His seven touchdowns are the most by any player in the American Athletic Conference this season. Plumlee threw for a career-high 373 yards on 18-for-22 passing and he rushed for 37 yards on seven attempts. He ignited the scoring for UCF in the contest, scoring from nine yards out to cap a 10-play, 74-yard drive in the first quarter to give the Knights a 7-3 lead.

After Temple scored to take a 10-7 advantage, Plumlee found the endzone for the second time on the day with a one-yard rush to help UCF regain the lead, 14-10.

"Our quarterback, he played extremely well," Malzahn added. "Not very many times I think, I've had an offense that had 400 yards passing and 300 yards rushing so I'm real proud. That team [Temple] had a real defense coming in, you know they were top 10 statistically in a lot of different categories, so I'm real pleased with our team."

The Knights scored 21 points in the second quarter to pull away and take a 35-13 lead into halftime, as UCF has led at the intermission in five of its six games this season. Isaiah Bowser found the endzone for the 10th time this season and Kobe Hudson recorded his first touchdown in a UCF uniform moments later. Plumlee's third rushing touchdown with five seconds remaining in the first half pushed the Knights' lead to 22 heading into halftime – its largest lead at halftime this season.

**GREENVILLE, N.C.** – The UCF football team was outdone in its first American Athletic Conference road game of the season at East Carolina 34-13 Saturday evening at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. The Knights couldn't overcome four turnovers and suffered their second loss of the season.

"Give East Carolina the credit, they got after us and beat us in all three phases of the game," said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. "What stood out to me was that they controlled the tempo and time of possession, we couldn't get off the field."

UCF (5-2, 2-1 AAC) moved the ball well in the first half, but saw its first two drives end with a turnover. It was the first time the Knights turned the football over since the Georgia Tech game.

After the UCF pressure forced a missed field goal on East Carolina's (5-3, 3-2) first drive of the game, the Pirates got on the board with a 28-yard field goal with two minutes remaining in the opening period.

The Knights had a nine-play, 59-yard drive end on a fumble early in the second quarter and East Carolina turned the miscue into a touchdown to grab a 10-0 lead.

Freshman kicker Colton Boomer ignited the scoring for UCF in the game, as he connected on a 27-yard field goal as time expired in the first half. The kick capped a five-play, 70-yard drive for the Knights in 44 seconds to end the shutout prior to the intermission.

For just the second time this season, UCF trailed at halftime, but the Knights marched down the field on their opening drive of the third quarter. Isaiah Bowser found the endzone for the 10th time this season, scoring from three yards out to trim the Knights deficit to 17-10.

ECU countered with a touchdown and a field goal to pull ahead 27-10 and take control of the game. Boomer connected on his second field goal attempt of the game from 36 yards to make it 27-13, but UCF couldn't get any closer.

Linebacker Jason Johnson led the UCF defense with 15 tackles, while Tre'mon Morris-Brash added six tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

"Disappointing loss, but we've gotta find a way to put it behind us," Malzahn added.

UCF will return to action at home next weekend when the Knights welcome No. 21 Cincinnati to FBC Mortgage Stadium for its homecoming game. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on ESPN.

**ORLANDO** – The UCF football team bounced back in a big way on Saturday with a strong performance to take down No. 20 Cincinnati 25-21 on Homecoming at FBC Mortgage Stadium. With the win, the Knights snapped the Bearcats' 19-game winning streak against American Athletic Conference opponents, as Cincinnati looked to set the conference record for consecutive wins.

UCF (6-2, 3-1 AAC) picked up its first ranked win since the 2018 matchup against Cincinnati (6-2, 3-1) and first under second-year head coach Gus Malzahn. The Knights remained unbeaten in home AAC games in the last two seasons under Malzahn's direction, improving to 7-0. UCF is now bowl eligible for the 13th time in school history and the seventh consecutive year, the only team from the state of Florida that is bowl eligible at this point in the season.

"First of all, I'm just real proud of our team. This was a huge win for us," said Malzahn. "I think everybody knows that. Sometimes it's how you win that really can help you moving forward. I'm real proud of our team, you know, that's a championship program we beat."

"They went down and scored with three minutes left and took all the momentum, but then Mikey Keene came in and drove us down the field. It was one of those championship type of drives."

In his first action of the season, sophomore quarterback Mikey Keene came up big for UCF leading a pair of Knights scoring drives including the game-winner in the fourth quarter. After taking a hit in the second quarter, quarterback John Rhys Plumlee was removed from the game and did not return but Keene turned in a stellar outing to lift the Knights to the victory.

Keene finished the game 15-for-21 with 176 yards, completing 71% of his passes.

After both teams punted on their opening drives, UCF struck first in the game after a seven-play, 53-yard drive capped by a 26-yard field goal from Colton Boomer. Three big runs by Plumlee, Ryan O'Keefe and Johnny Richardson set up the Knights' first score.

Running back RJ Harvey had the best game of his career, as he rushed 18 times for 84 yards with two touchdowns – all of which are career highs. He found the endzone late in the first quarter on a 26-yard run to give UCF a 10-0 lead.

The Knights defense shut down any thoughts of a late score, as K.D. McDaniel sacked Bryant and forced a fumble which was nearly recovered by UCF but resulted in a 20-yard loss for the Bearcats.

**MEMPHIS** – Headlined by forcing three red zone stops, the 25th-ranked UCF football team earned a hard-fought 35-28 road win at Memphis Saturday afternoon at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium. The Knights moved to 7-2 on the year and 4-1 in American Athletic Conference (AAC) play, earning the first conference road win of the season, while Memphis falls to 4-5 and 2-4 in league action.

As the nation's top red zone defense, UCF came up big again on Saturday forcing a turnover on downs, interception and a missed field goal. In 36 trips to the red zone for opponents this season, the Knights have only allowed 12 touchdowns (33%).

With the score knotted at 21-21 heading to the fourth quarter, UCF capped a nine-play, 61-yard drive to take a 28-21 lead after quarterback Mikey Keene connected with Kobe Hudson for the second time on the day for a 13-yard touchdown.

On Memphis' next drive, Divaad Wilson picked off quarterback Seth Henigan to give the Knights the ball back with their second turnover of the day to have a chance to add to their lead. It was Wilson's third interception of the season and second interception of the game for UCF.

After the teams traded possessions with both ending in punts, Keene found wide receiver Javon Baker in the back of the endzone for his third touchdown pass of the day, extending the UCF lead to 35-21 following the extra point from Colton Boomer.

The Tigers answered with a six-play, 61-yard drive to cut the deficit to 35-28 after a 14-yard touchdown pass from Henigan to Joe Scates. Needing a few first downs to continue running the clock and retain possession, Alec Holler made one of the biggest plays of the day on third down to keep the drive going. He caught the pass at the UCF 19-yard line, made the first defender miss and then leaped across the line to gain to pick up the first down.

After Memphis used its final timeout, Isaiah Bowser burst through the middle for 19 yards to give UCF another first down and the ability to run out the clock for the win.

After winning the toss and electing to receive, UCF marched down the field on its opening possession to grab a 7-0 lead after a 22-yard touchdown run from RJ Harvey. He took the handoff from Keene and bounced it to the sideline to score his fourth touchdown of the season.

The Tigers countered on their first possession with a 10-play, 75-yard drive to even the score at 7-7 after a seven-yard touchdown run from Brandon Thomas.

**NEW ORLEANS** – Needing to play one of its best games of the season on the road at No. 17 Tulane, the 22nd-ranked UCF football team was up for the challenge. Headlined by a season-high 336 rushing yards, the Knights earned a 38-31 road win against the Green Wave Saturday evening at Yulman Stadium.

UCF (8-2, 5-1 AAC) handed the Green Wave (8-2, 5-1) their first conference loss of the season and first home AAC loss in nearly a full calendar year. The win was also the Knights’ first ranked road win since 2013 when the program defeated No. 8 Louisville, 38-35.

With the win, UCF now sits in a three-way tie for first place in the American Athletic Conference but the Knights control their own destiny thanks to defeating Tulane and Cincinnati, the other two teams tied for first.

“Real proud of our team,” said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. “Going on the road against a top-20 team in one of the biggest games that they’ve had here in probably a really long time and our guys played really well. Defensively, we were down three starters and had a bunch of young guys that haven’t played a lot in the game, and I thought they battled. We forced turnovers and almost had three.”

Dubbed as a battle between the American’s top defenses statistically, it was the offenses that stole the show in the game. UCF tallied 468 yards of total offense, while Tulane compiled 391. The Knights rushed for 336 yards to eclipse their previous season high of 314 set against Florida Atlantic. That mark is the most for the program since Oct. 31, 2020, when UCF recorded 353 at Houston.

Tulane entered the game allowing 127 rushing yards per game and had only given up four rushing touchdowns. After it was all said and done Saturday, UCF more than doubled the rushing yards mark and tallied at least four rushing touchdowns in a game for the fourth time this season.

Making his return to the field, John Rhys Plumlee started at quarterback for the Knights and rushed for 176 yards to set the program record for rushing yards by a quarterback in a single game. The previous mark of 122 was held by Vic Penn, who accomplished the feat against Middle Tennessee in 1999.

Playing nearly two hours from his hometown of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, Plumlee ignited the Knights offense early in the game as he raced 47 yards down the field to the three-yard line to set up a Colton Boomer 25-yard field goal on the opening drive of the game. After a quick three-and-out by Tulane’s offense, Plumlee took off for a 67-yard touchdown run to give the Knights a 10-0 lead on the longest rush of the season for UCF.

**ORLANDO** – Despite allowing just 82 yards and three points in the second half, the 20th-ranked UCF football team came up short against Navy 17-14 Saturday afternoon at FBC Mortgage Stadium. Points were at a premium in the contest, as both teams' strong defenses were on display and offenses were held well below their season averages.

"First of all, extremely tough loss. It was real disappointing for our guys, especially our seniors in their last home game and everything that went with that," said UCF head coach Gus Malzahn. "Give them [Navy] credit. They did what it took to win the game. First half, they had the ball quite a bit. We had opportunities, but we got field goals down there going in and you have to score touchdowns."

Playing against a triple-option offense, the flow of the game and time of possession is always something to keep an eye on. Navy had possession for 39:36, while UCF had the ball for 20:24, the lowest time of the possession the Knights have had in a game this season.

The game only saw three touchdowns scored along with three field goals and both teams were held scoreless in the fourth quarter.

Navy opened the game with a strong drive, as quarterback Xavier Arline capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive that spanned 6:40. For the first time since the East Carolina game, UCF was held scoreless in the first quarter.

The Knights' second drive of the game ended with a field goal from their standout freshman kicker Colton Boomer. Big runs by running back RJ Harvey and a 10-yard completion from quarterback John Rhys Plumlee to Ryan O'Keefe helped put UCF in position to score and trim the score to 7-3.

After the UCF defense forced a quick three-and-out, the Knights cut the Midshipmen's lead to one at 7-6 following Boomer's second field goal of the day. Navy responded with a 6:47 drive to pull ahead 14-6 before halftime with an eight-yard touchdown run Vincent Terrell II.

Looking for a spark after the intermission, UCF made a change at the quarterback position and Mikey Keene started the second half. In his first action of the day, he led the Knights on a 75-yard, five-play scoring drive. Keene found Baker for six yards on his first pass and then connected with O'Keefe for 45 yards on a deep ball, which set up his 28-yard touchdown pass to Baker.

Navy countered with a field goal on its next possession, but after that offense was limited on both sides. One its lone possession in the fourth quarter, UCF was unable to convert on fourth down from the Navy 37-yard line as Keene's pass to Baker was broken up by Navy's Mbiti Williams Jr.
