TIDE BOUNCES BACK: Since 2008, Alabama has suffered 22 losses, including 15 in the regular season. Following a loss during the regular season, UA is 13-1 headed into this weekend at USF. During that time, the Crimson Tide has not lost consecutive regular season games at any point with the lone back-to-back losses coming in the 2014 Sugar Bowl against Oklahoma following a loss at Auburn to close out the 2013 regular season. In matchups following a regular season loss, Alabama is outscoring the opposition 460-160 for an average of 32.9-11.4 points per game. The Tide has posted two shutouts in bounce-back games and has held the opposition to 10-points-or-less 10 times overall.

SABAN vs. NON-CONFERENCE FOES: Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a 104-21 (.832) career record against non-conference opponents in the regular season and postseason across his four stops as a collegiate head coach. His record against non-conference opponents in both the regular season and postseason at the Capstone is 73-8 (.901). Saban has only three losses to non-conference opponents during the regular season, including two in 2007 (21-14 vs. Florida State [in Jacksonville] and 21-14 vs. ULM) and against then-No. 11/10 Texas on Sept. 9.

SABAN'S ROAD RECORD: Head coach Nick Saban owns an 85-35-1 (.707) mark in road games across his four career stops, including a 57-12 (.826) mark while at Alabama. Saban has notched eight perfect road records with the Crimson Tide (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2020) and has lost more than one game on the road in only three seasons (2007, 2010, 2022).

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL: Alabama's No. 10 ranking in the Week 3 release of the Associated Press Poll marked the 248th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 248 weeks more than doubles second-place Georgia with the Bulldogs appearing in the poll for 101 consecutive weeks. Alabama's 248 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 71 consecutive weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

ALABAMA IN THE AP SINCE 2008: Alabama began the 2008 season at No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll. The Crimson Tide opened the year with a dominant 34-10 win over then-No. 9 Clemson in Atlanta, and since that win over the Tigers, UA has not been ranked lower than No. 17 in 246 polls that have followed. According to the College Poll Archive, the Tide has now spent 96.8 percent of the 15-plus years ranked in the top 10. A whopping 85.5 percent of that time Alabama has been ranked in the top five. The Crimson Tide has also been ranked No. 1 a total of 109 times since 2008. Only 13 other teams have earned the No. 1 ranking over that time, with the second-most appearances coming from Georgia at 26 and Clemson close behind at 23.

ALABAMA HAS THE MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 188 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. That total is 19 more than second-place Ohio State, who has totaled 169 wins over that stretch.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 174 of 180 regular season games that have had national championship implications. The final three games of the 2010 campaign and the final three weeks of the 2022 schedule marked the only six regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 15 seasons.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN THE SABAN ERA: Alabama recorded its 90th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era at then-No. 6/8 Tennessee on Oct. 15 of last season when Dallas Turner picked up a fumble and returned it from 11 yards out. Since Saban's arrival in 2007, no team in college football has totaled more non-offensive scores than the Crimson Tide. During Saban's tenure, Alabama recorded a single-season record 15 in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by any FBS team in the last 20 years. The Tide also scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 straight games dating from to the CFP Semifinal against Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015 to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016 for 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

FIRST-YEAR STARTERS UNDER SABAN: With the exit of two-year starter and 2021 Heisman Trophy winner Bryce Young, the Crimson Tide was tasked with finding a new starting quarterback. Under head coach Nick Saban, a total of eight quarterbacks have maintained their starting role for 10-plus games of a season in which they were named QB1. The list of eight includes: Bryce Young (2021), Mac Jones (2020), Tua Tagovailoa (2018), Jalen Hurts (2016), Jake Coker (2015), Blake Sims (2014), AJ McCarron (2011) and Greg McElroy (2009). All but McCarron won an SEC Championship in their first season while the upperclassmen (redshirt sophomore or above) won four national titles - Jones (redshirt junior), Coker (senior), McCarron (redshirt sophomore) and McElroy (junior).

MILROE SHINES IN SEASON OPENER: Jalen Milroe got the start in the Crimson Tide's season opener on Sept. 2 against Middle Tennessee and shined in his season debut. The redshirt sophomore accounted for five touchdowns, including two rushing and three passing. He became the first Alabama quarterback in program history to throw for three scores and rush for two more in the same game. His two rushing touchdowns were also the most by a Tide signal-caller since Bryce Young's two scores against Tennessee on Oct. 23, 2021.

MILROE NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Quarterback Jalen Milroe was selected as the SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 4 for his performance against Middle Tennessee in the season opener. It was Milroe's first league honor as a member of the Crimson Tide. He was also named one of the Alabama coaching staff's offensive players of the week for his performance against the Blue Raiders.

LONG RUSH BY MILROE: Jalen Milroe took off running for a 77-yard gain at then-No. 20/19 Arkansas on Oct. 1 of last year. His big play came on a 3rd-and-15 with the Tide at its own 20-yard line and helped set up an eventual touchdown for the Crimson Tide. Milroe's 77-yard scamper topped Bryce Young's 63-yard rush from earlier that season against Utah State on Sept. 3. Prior to Young's rush, the longest carry by a quarterback was 60 yards by Jalen Hurts against Mississippi State on Nov. 12, 2016. The Alabama program record for a rush by a quarterback is 85 yards which came from Danny Woodson against Temple on Sept. 7, 1991.

600+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has eclipsed the 600-yard marker 14 times in program history, including seven times dating back to the start of the 2020 season. The Tide most recently went for 600-plus on Sept. 24 of last season when UA posted 628 yards against Vanderbilt in the SEC opener. Alabama went over 600 yards twice in 2021, rolling up 671 yards against then-No. 25/21/22 Arkansas on Nov. 20, a performance that followed a 606-yard effort against Southern Miss on Sept. 25. The Tide eclipsed 600 yards on four occasions during the 2020 campaign, including a season-high 723 at Ole Miss on Oct. 10 of that season.

500+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has recorded 500-plus yards of total offense 55 times in the last 115 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season), including seven of the 13 games in 2022. Last season, the Crimson Tide went for 559 against Utah State, 509 against ULM, 628 in the Vanderbilt contest, 555 at then-No. 20/19 Arkansas, 569 at then-No. 6/8 Tennessee, 527 against Austin Peay and finally 516 against Auburn in the regular-season finale. Alabama's offense recorded 500-plus yards seven times in 2021, eight times in 2020 and nine times in 2019, with the 2018 roster setting the Alabama single-season record with 500-or-more yards in 12 of the 15 total games.

400+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama has gained 400-plus yards of total offense in 61 of its last 71 games, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. The only 10 instances in which the Crimson Tide did not eclipse the 400-plus yards of total offense mark during that span was: vs. Tennessee on Oct. 19, 2019 (373); at then-No. 11/9 Florida on Sept. 18, 2021 (331); vs. LSU on Nov. 6, 2021 (308); at Auburn on Nov. 27, 2021 (388); vs. then-No. 3/3/3 Georgia in the CFP National Championship Game on Jan. 10, 2022 (399); at Texas on Sept. 10 of last season (374); vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 8 (399); vs. Mississippi State on Oct. 22 (290); at then-No. 11/11/9 Ole Miss on Nov. 12 (317); and most recently against then-No. 11/10 Texas on Sept. 9 (362). Alabama is 8-2 in those games.

30-OR-MORE IN 61 OF THE LAST 71: Alabama's offense has scored 30-or-more points in 61 of the last 71 games (dating back to the start of the 2018 season). Included in that stretch is a streak of 34 consecutive games with 30-plus points that set the FBS record. The Crimson Tide's streak started with a 42-3 win over Duke on Aug. 31, 2019 and ended with a 20-14 win over LSU on Nov. 6, 2021. UCF previously held the record of scoring 30-or-more points in 31 straight games from 2017-19.

ALABAMA IN THE AP RANKINGS

Alabama has been ranked in 859 of the 1,220 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 530-137-8 (.791) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 171-25 (.872) mark under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama is also ranked in the AP poll for the 248th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. The 248 consecutive weeks is the second-longest stretch by any program in the poll's history, trailing only Nebraska's all-time mark of 348 consecutive weeks. Alabama has started nine seasons at No. 1 (2022, 2021, 2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches' rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 33 seasons (1991-present) with U.S. LBM coming on the title sponsor of the poll at the start of the 2023 season. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and seven USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) coaches poll national titles.

40-OR-MORE SINCE 2018: Alabama has scored 40-or-more points in 48 of the last 71 games. Forty-eight leads the nation for the most total games of 40-plus points since the start of the 2018 season. Ohio State has the second-most instances of scoring 40-or-more points over that stretch at 42, while Oklahoma is third with 35.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: The Crimson Tide has won 51 of its last 52 games when scoring a touchdown on the first offensive possession of the game. The most recent instance came last weekend against Middle Tennessee when Jalen Milroe scrambled for six from 21-yards out. Alabama's lone loss when scoring a touchdown on the opening drive during that stretch came at Texas A&M on Oct. 9, 2021.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 298 thanks to a 42-yard field goal by Will Reichard to open last weekend's matchup with then-No. 11/10 Texas. The Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama owns a 239-59 (.802) record over the course of the current streak.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 209 games (dating back to the start of the 2008 season), Alabama has turned the ball over only 224 times (120 fumbles, 104 interceptions) for an average of 1.07 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 206 times in 196 games (1.05/game). The 206 turnovers since 2009 includes 84 interceptions in 5,286 attempts (one interception every 62.9 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 32 lost fumbles in 5,185 carries (one fumble lost every 162.0 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DOWNS NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Safety Caleb Downs was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week on Sept. 4 for his performance against Middle Tennessee. Downs earned the start at safety in his collegiate debut, finishing with a team-high eight tackles, including one for loss (-2 yards). Additionally, Downs earned defensive player of the week accolades from the Alabama coaching staff for his efforts against the Blue Raiders.

KEEPING THE GROUND GAME IN-CHECK: The Crimson Tide defense limited Middle Tennessee to only 78 yards rushing in the season opener on Sept. 2. Entering this weekend's matchup with USF, Alabama's defensive unit has held 18 of its last 30 opponents (dating back to the 2021 season) to less than 100 yards rushing. UA has also limited eight of the last 15 opponents below 80 yards dating back to the start of the 2022 campaign.

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: Alabama has forced at least one turnover in 102 of the last 115 contests (dating back to the start of the 2015 season). During the current run, Alabama has forced 179 turnovers (114 interceptions, 65 fumbles) and returned 40 of those miscues for touchdowns.

SHUTOUTS SINCE 2007: Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, Alabama has recorded 26 shutouts, including 12 in Southeastern Conference play. With its 34-0 win over Austin Peay on Nov. 19 last year, the Crimson Tide defense has 12 more shutouts than its nearest competitor over that span. Ranking second in shutouts during that time is Ohio State with 14.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 341 touchdowns over the last 196 games. That is 57 fewer than the second most in the nation (Wisconsin with 398).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama’s defense has been a force in the run game since head coach Nick Saban’s arrival on campus. More recently, the Tide has given up just 81 rushing scores in the last 115 games (dating to the start of the 2015 season). Since Saban arrived in 2007, the Tide has allowed the fewest rushing touchdowns in the nation at 139, a total that is 33 fewer than second-place Iowa.

PATs FOR REICHARD: Will Reichard owns the Crimson Tide’s career record for made PATs. Entering this weekend’s contest, Reichard has made 248-of-250 career PATs. The senior recorded nine PATs against ULM on Sept. 17 of last season to move past the former record of 186 (188 attempts) by Adam Griffith from 2013-16.

50-PLUS FOR REICHARD: A 51-yard field goal from Will Reichard opened the second-half scoring for the Crimson Tide against then-No. 11/10 Texas on Sept. 9. The three-point make was the sixth for Reichard from 50 yards or better during his career and moved him into second place for the most 50-yarders in Alabama history. The Crimson Tide record holder is Van Tiffin (1983-86) at seven, with the elder Tiffin using a kicking tee for the entirety of his career.

McKINSTRY THE RETURNER: Kool-Aid McKinstry took on the Crimson Tide’s punt returner responsibilities during the 2022 season and excelled. The Birmingham native totaled 332 yards on 21 punts to average 15.8 yards per return. His yardage total and 15.8 yards per return average each ranked second among all Division I returners. He started the 2023 campaign by returning five punts for a combined 66 yards with a long of 33 against Middle Tennessee.

GENERAL NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama’s success on the field over the past 16 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Tide’s success in the classroom. The 2023 squad is no exception as the Crimson Tide entered the season with 11 student-athletes who already had their degrees in-hand and are wearing an SEC Graduate patch on their jersey. The list of graduates includes Chris Braswell, James Burnip, Darrian Dalcourt, Justin Eboigbe, Terrence Ferguson II, Jaylen Key, Jase McClellan, Seth McLaughlin, Malachi Moore, Will Reichard and Roydell Williams. Since Saban’s arrival in 2007, Alabama football has seen a total of 642 degrees earned, including 100 master’s.

CHAMPIONS IN THE CLASSROOM: Alabama’s achievements in the classroom have been most impressive during national title seasons. Those six squads (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020) included 139 student-athletes who had earned their degrees prior to game time.

APR SUCCESS: According to the most recent Academic Progress Rate (APR) numbers that were announced by the NCAA last May, figures that cover the four-year period extending from the 2018-19 through 2021-22 school years, the Crimson Tide continued to score well above the national cutoff standard. The football program’s total average of 995 was tied for the best among all Southeastern Conference schools and bettered the national average for football by more than 25 points. In total, the football program was one of 15 University of Alabama sports to score a 995 or better.

RETURNING HOME: Each year during head coach Nick Saban’s tenure at least one Alabama player leaves campus early to declare for the NFL Draft. The Crimson Tide staff has made it a point to keep in contact with guys who begin their pro careers but have yet to graduate in hopes of one day helping them earn a degree. The Tide’s academics staff have succeeded in that task for a total of 15 players that have returned from pro careers to earn their first or second degree. The list of 15 includes: Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Terrence Cody, Landon Collins, Glen Coffee, Amari Cooper, Ronnie Harrison, Derrick Henry, Marlon Humphrey, Nico Johnson, Rolando McClain, Dee Milliner, Bo Scarbrough, Vinnie Sunseri, Tua Tagovailoa and Chance Warmack (master’s). Additionally, Jimmy Johns returned to the Capstone to receive his degree in May 2023.

NEW HIRES: Saban’s 2023 coaching staff features three new hires including Robert Bala (inside linebackers), Tommy Rees (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks) and Kevin Steele (defensive coordinator).

ALABAMA’S TV RECORD: Alabama’s matchup with then-No. 11/10 Texas on ESPN was the Crimson Tide’s 474th televised game. Alabama has compiled a 329-141-4 (.698) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed-circuit telecasts).

193 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 207 GAMES: Alabama’s matchup with then-No. 11/10 Texas was the Tide’s 193rd nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of 2014.

172-9 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama is 172-9 (.950) when leading at the half. UA is also 155-4 (.975) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era. The Crimson Tide has held the lead at the half in 90 of its last 115 games (dating back to the start of the 2015 season).

MOST WINS BY ACTIVE HEAD COACH: Alabama head coach Nick Saban’s 281 career wins are the most career victories by an active FBS head coach. Saban ranks just ahead of North Carolina’s Mack Brown, who has 276, with LSU’s Brian Kelly close behind in third, collecting 274 career wins across his stops.

SABAN AT No. 1: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has coached the most games as the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team among active head coaches. Following the Oct. 8 victory over Texas A&M, Saban has coached 98 games as the nation's top-ranked team, which is 77 more games than second-place Dabo Swinney, who has totaled 21 games at No. 1. The third coach on the list is Kirby Smart at 18.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 76-21 (.784) against the Associated Press Top 25 since the start of 2008. That record includes a 4-2 mark during the 2022 season.

SABAN vs. AP TOP 25 OPPOSITION: The Crimson Tide's 45-20 win over then-No. 11 Kansas State in the Allstate Sugar Bowl on Dec. 31 was Nick Saban's 100th career win, and 78th at Alabama, against the Associated Press Top 25. Saban moved past Joe Paterno (86) for the most career wins against the AP Top 25 when he defeated then-No. 22 Auburn on Nov. 28, 2020. The late Florida State legend Bobby Bowden ranks third all-time (82), while Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth (66). Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth (64). Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (100-47, .680) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

DOMINATING THE AP TOP 25: Alabama's 45-20 win over then-No. 11 Kansas State in the Allstate Sugar Bowl to close out the 2022 campaign was head coach Nick Saban's 23rd career win by 25-plus points against a ranked opponent. Saban is the all-time leader for the most wins by 25-plus points in the Associated Press Poll Era (since 1936), sitting just ahead of Bobby Bowden's previous record of 20. Saban is also the NCAA record holder with 25 career wins of 20-plus points against AP top-15 opponents, including the win over the Wildcats. A total of 22 of Saban's career 20-plus point wins against AP top-15 opponents have come while at UA.

50-PLUS vs. RANKED OPPONENTS: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama has posted 50-plus points against Associated Press Top 25 teams on seven occasions, while three of those seven occasions came in 2020. The most recent instance came on Jan. 11, 2021 at the College Football Playoff National Championship Game when the Crimson Tide defeated then-No. 3/3 Ohio State, 52-24. SABAN LEADS IN WINS vs. TOP-FIVE TEAMS: Alabama's 27-6 win over No. 4 Cincinnati in the 2021 College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic on Dec. 31 was Nick Saban's 29th career victory against a team ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, the most in college football history. Saban's 29-15 career record in top-five contests gives him a .659 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419).

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Alabama owns an 84-79-1 (.515) all-time record against teams ranked in the top-10 of the Associated Press poll. Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 35-13 (.729) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 20-7 (.741) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's six national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 18-2 (.900) against top-10 opponents.

MORE THAN A DECADE AT No. 1: With Alabama's Aug. 15 preseason ranking at No. 1 in 2022, the Crimson Tide has been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 15-year streak is the longest by any program and coach in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak by any one team was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92. The previous streak by one coach is six straight seasons, which was accomplished by Frank Leahy at Notre Dame in 1943 and continued from 1946-50 following an absence while Leahy served in the Navy.

TOUGH TO GET SABAN'S TIDE TWICE: During his tenure at Alabama, head coach Nick Saban has suffered 28 total losses. Of those 28 losses, the Crimson Tide and Saban have had the opportunity to face the team that beat them at a later date on 22 occasions. In those 22 rematches, Alabama owns a 20-2 mark when avenging its previous loss. The only two times the Crimson Tide has fallen in back-to-back games against the same opponent is LSU (2010-11) and Ole Miss (2014-15). Alabama has not yet had the opportunity to bounce back from losses against Utah (2009), Clemson (2018), Georgia (2021), Tennessee (2022), LSU (2022) and Texas (2023).

SIX RINGS IN 12 SEASONS: The Crimson Tide's win in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game helped Alabama claim its sixth national title in 12 seasons, making UA the first team in the Associated Press Poll Era (since 1936) to win six championships over a 12-season span. The only other team in college football history to win six titles in a quarter of a century or less was also Alabama, coming across a 19-season stretch from 1961-79.

THREE DECADES OF SABAN: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has claimed six national titles during his time with the Crimson Tide and seven across his collegiate head coaching career. With Alabama's win in the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game, Saban became the first head coach to win an Associated Press/Coaches Poll National Championship in three different decades - the 2000s, the 2010s and the 2020s. Saban's first national championship came in 2003 at LSU, six seasons before he came to Tuscaloosa and captured the crown in 2009. The 2010s saw Saban win national titles in 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017, while his most recent one came on Jan. 11, 2021.

SIGN WITH THE TIDE, LEAVE WITH A RING: Since Nick Saban’s arrival at Alabama in 2007, members of each one of his recruiting classes have won at least one national championship. The 2009 class tops the list with three to their name while the 2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2017 classes each achieved two national titles during their time in Tuscaloosa. The 2007, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2019 and 2020 classes can each claim one national title with the latter group still having time to add to that number.

BAMA IN THE NFL

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: As of the 2023 NFL Draft, Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 15 drafts (123) than any other program in the nation. The list of 123 features 12 Super Bowl champions, 27 Pro Bowl selections, 14 First Team All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

2023 NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw 10 former players selected in the 2023 NFL Draft, including three first-round picks in quarterback Bryce Young (No. 1, Carolina Panthers), linebacker Will Anderson Jr. (Houston Texans) and running back Jahmyr Gibbs (No. 12, Detroit Lions). Defensive back Brian Branch (Lions) went early in the second round while four former Tide standouts went in the third round - Tyler Steen (Philadelphia Eagles), Byron Young (Las Vegas Raiders), Jordan Battle (Cincinnati Bengals) and Cameron Latu (San Francisco 49ers). Henry To’oTo’o was next up, going in the fifth round (Texans) with DeMarcco Hellams (Atlanta Falcons) rounding out the group following his seventh-round selection.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban has produced the most first rounders of any NCAA Division I head coach with 49 players chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 44 while at Alabama. The Crimson Tide’s three first-round selections in the 2023 NFL Draft extended Saban’s all-time mark, producing 16 more first-rounders than second-place Joe Paterno (33).

QUICK HITS ON ALABAMA’S NFL DRAFT SUCCESS: Below is a look at some of Alabama’s recent success in the NFL Draft.

- Over the last 15 NFL Drafts, Alabama has produced 123 total picks which is more than any other program in the nation. Of those 123, an impressive 44 (35.8 percent) have been first-rounders.
- Since 2000, the Crimson Tide has produced an NCAA-leading 46 first-rounders, a number that is nine better than the next closest school in Ohio State (37).
- Since 2010, Alabama has had an NCAA-best 43 players selected in the first round, a number that nearly doubles the next closest school in OSU (24).
- In 2023, Bryce Young became the only Alabama player in program history to be selected first overall in the Common Draft Era (since 1967). Young is also the only player to go 1-1 during head coach Nick Saban’s career.

- Will Anderson Jr.’s third overall selection matched Marcell Dareus (2011) and Quinnen Williams (2019) for the highest defender taken during Saban’s tenure in Tuscaloosa.
- With Young at No. 1 and Anderson Jr. at No. 3, UA produced the first offensive and defensive player taken in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- Jahmyr Gibbs went 12th overall to the Detroit Lions, making him the second-highest running back selected during Saban’s tenure. He trailed only Trent Richardson, who went No. 3 overall to the Cleveland Browns in the 2012 Draft.
- With the selection of Young in the 2023 NFL Draft, Alabama has had at least one player selected in the first round of 15 straight drafts (2009-present) to set the new NCAA record. The Crimson Tide was previously tied with Miami (1995-2008), who owned the old mark of 14 consecutive first-rounders
- Alabama has produced multiple first round picks in 12 of the last 15 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.
- With Jameson Williams’ selection in the 2022 NFL Draft, Alabama became the just the second college program to produce a first-rounder at wideout in a three-year stretch. Tennessee also accomplished the feat from 1982-84.
- After the 2021 NFL Draft, Alabama became the first school in the modern draft era to have four wide receivers drafted in the first round in a two-year span (2020 – Henry Ruggs III, Jerry Jeudy; 2021 – DeVonta Smith, Jaylen Waddle).
- Also in 2021, Alabama became one of just two schools (Oklahoma) to have quarterbacks selected in the first round in back-to-back years (2020 –Tua Tagovailoa; 2021 – Mac Jones).
- With the first-round selection of Tagovailoa in the 2020 NFL Draft, Saban has produced at least one first-rounder at every starting position on offense and defense during his illustrious collegiate head coaching career.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE NFL: Alabama enters Week 1 of the 2023-24 NFL season with 58 players on active 53-man rosters. In total, the Crimson Tide currently has 69 players on an NFL roster (including reserve/practice squad) and is represented on 25 of the league’s 32 teams. Below is a look at where former Crimson Tide standouts are currently playing.

LEADERS IN THE LEAGUE: Every year, the National Football League allows each of its 32 teams to name up to eight team captains. The start of the 2023-24 season featured 13 former Crimson Tide players who were selected as one of the permanent captains for their respective squad. The list of captains to start the year included Jonathan Allen (Commanders), Derrick Henry (Titans), Jalen Hurts (Eagles), Eddie Jackson (Bears), Kareem Jackson (Broncos), Josh Jacobs (Raiders), Mac Jones (Patriots), Ryan Kelly (Colts), Xavier McKinney (Giants), C.J. Mosley (Jets), DeVonta Smith (Eagles), Tua Tagovailoa (Dolphins) and Bryce Young (Panthers). The Baltimore Ravens do not name team captains, per head coach John Harbaugh's rules, while the Dallas Cowboys name team captains on a game-by-game basis.

70 IN A SEASON: A total of 70 former Crimson Tide players appeared in a game and played at least one snap during the 2022-23 NFL regular season. Alabama became the first program to have 70 former players see game action in any regular season in NFL history. Reggie Ragland earned snaps in the Cleveland Browns' Week 15 matchup with the Baltimore Ravens to push the total to 70. The number of former Tide players to play in an NFL regular-season contest has now increased each year for six consecutive seasons starting with 38 in 2016. The 2017 season saw 44 former players earn game action, breaking Alabama's previous record of 40 in 1987, and was followed by 52 in 2018. The total moved to 62 in 2019, followed by 64 in 2020 and 68 in 2021.

• Saban has compiled a 286-70-1 (.803) record as a college head coach. He has claimed seven national championships – six at Alabama – 11 conference championships and 23 of his teams will have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals in seven of the last nine seasons including six of the last eight CFP National Championship Games.

• Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and the only coach to win three CFP National Championships. He has won seven titles in his last 17 years coaching college football, most recently capturing the CFP National Championship following the 2020 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years (2009, 2011-12). His title in 2020 moved him past Paul “Bear” Bryant for the most national championships in the poll era with seven.

• In 2009, Saban produced Alabama’s first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. Saban made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson, 45-40, to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game and took home his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game. Saban’s most recent title came in dominating fashion as the Crimson Tide defeated Ohio State, 52-24, in the 2021 CFP National Championship Game in Miami Gardens, Fla.

• In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team’s response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

• A five-season run at LSU (2000-04) produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships and three SEC West Division championships. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban’s guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. “Bear” Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America.

• Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans’ defensive coordinator/secondary coach. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach, including four postseason appearances. In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season.

• Saban’s first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points) and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

• A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor’s degree in business. He earned a master’s degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and one grandson, James.

• At Michigan State, the Sabans started the Nick’s Kids Foundation, which they have continued in Tuscaloosa, a vibrant example of their continuing concern for disadvantaged children. Since Nick and Terry arrived in Tuscaloosa, over \$12 million has been distributed to students, teachers and children’s causes at over 150 charities through the Nick’s Kids Foundation.

• Personally, Nick and Terry have given over \$1 million to their First Generation Scholarship at The University of Alabama. The Sabans also contributed \$1 million to The Crimson Standard, Alabama’s 10-year, \$600 million capital campaign. Most recently, the Sabans announced plans for The Saban Center in Tuscaloosa, a learning and discovery center on the Black Warrior River that brings together the Children’s Hands-On Museum and the Tuscaloosa Children’s Theater. The Sabans made a personal gift of \$1 million to the project and the Nick’s Kids Foundation contributed another \$2 million.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. – The No. 4/3 Alabama football team opened the 2023 campaign with a resounding 56-7 win over Middle Tennessee in front of a sold-out crowd at Bryant-Denny Stadium. With the victory, the Crimson Tide won its 21st consecutive home game which stands as the fourth-best streak in program history.

Making just his second career start, quarterback Jalen Milroe shined against the Blue Raiders, accounting for five touchdowns and 242 total yards of offense. Milroe closed the night with 194 yards and three touchdowns through the air, while also rushing seven times for 48 yards and a pair of scores.

Eight different receivers caught at least one pass in the win, led by Isaiah Bonds five catches for 76 yards and a touchdown. Both Jermaine Burton (3 receptions, 62 yards) and Amari Niblack (2 receptions, 49 yards) also found the back of the endzone for Alabama.

Defensively, the Tide was led by Caleb Downs' eight tackles, which included six solo stops, while Deontae Lawson added seven tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack. As a unit, Alabama combined to make three sacks, seven tackles for loss, six quarterback hurries and a pair of turnovers.

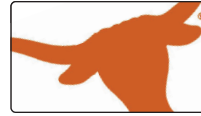

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. – The No. 3/3 Alabama football team dropped a 34-24 decision to No. 11/10 Texas. The Longhorns trailed by a field goal entering the fourth quarter of play but scored three touchdowns in less than a six-minute span to pull away for the victory.

The loss was Alabama's first at home since Nov. 9, 2019 (lost 46-41 to then-No. 1 LSU), while it's the first time since Nov. 17, 2007 that the Tide has lost a non-conference home game (lost 21-14 to ULM). The defeat not only ended UA's 21-game overall home-winning streak, but also snapped a streak of 43 consecutive home wins over non-conference opponents.

Alabama quarterback Jalen Milroe finished the night with 299 yards of combined offense, passing for 255 yards and a pair of touchdowns through the air while also rushing for 44 yards on 15 carries. Kobe Prentice had five receptions for 68 yards while Jermaine Burton (2 receptions, 58 yards) and Amari Niblack (2 receptions, 45 yards) each found the back of the end zone.

Defensively, the Tide was led by Caleb Downs and Trezmen Marshall, who each finished with 10 tackles, while Deontae Lawson added eight stops.
