- This will be the Owls' first game in Tampa and their 13th in the state of Florida. Rice is 5-7
  all-time in Florida (3-3 in conference games as members of C-USA) since making its
  debut in the Sunshine State with an 8-0 win over Tennessee in the 1947 Orange Bowl.
- The Owls are 1-2 vs. the University of Florida (0-2 in Gainesville, 1-0 in Miami); 1-1 at UCF, 1-1 at FIU, 1-1 at FAU and 0-1 at Florida State and Miami in addition to their Orange Bowl win.
- Rice is looking to start a season 3-1 for the first time since 2001.
- Four Owls have ties to the Tampa area. OG Lavel Dumont (Wharton HS) was named one
  of the 50 best players in the Tampa area prior to the 2017 season by the Tampa Bay
  Times, despite playing organized football for the first time in 2016 and safety Ichmael
  Joseph prepped at Tampa Bay Tech. Safety Jonathan Jean is from Lakeland, quarteback Shawqi Itraish is from Bradenton.

### OWLS OPEN AAC HISTORY ON THE ROAD AT USF

Rice Football opens a new chapter in its history as the Owls make their American Athletic Conference debut on Saturday on the road against USF. The AAC is Rice's fourth conference since the Owls joined the Southwest Conference in 1915. The Owls remained members of the SWC through 1995 and then competed in the Western Athletic Conference from 1996 through 2004 and then Conference USA from 2005 to 2022.

Rice is 0-3 in conference debut games:

### LAST WEEK, FAST START SPURS RICE PAST TSU

Rice completed a sweep of games against other Houston schools with a 59-7 win over Texas Southern. JT Daniels tied his career high with four touchdown passes and Rice saw a total of 73 players log playing time in the win.

Also of note:

- Rice has started 2-1 for the second straight year and is 5-1 at home in September since 2021.
- The 59 points scored tied for the sixth-most in school history and were the most since Rice defeated Prairie View 65-44 in 2016.
- The Owls' 42 first-half points were the most since scoring 56 against North Texas on Sept. 27, 2008.
- The seven points allowed were the fewest in a game since shutting out Marshall on Dec. 5, 2020.
- In addition to using 73 players in the game, 10 were credited with at least one rush, nine catching at least one pass and 19 were credited with at least one tackle.

### SUPER SETTINGS

With Saturday's game at Raymond James Stadium, Rice will have played in 10 of the 27 stadiums that have hosted at least one Super Bowl. In addition to playing at Rice Stadium, the Owls have also played at least once at the LA Memorial Coliseum, the Superdome and Tulane Stadium in New Orleans, the Metrodome in Minneapolis, NRG Stadium, the Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl and Stanford Stadium.

### FIRST CONFERENCE POINTS

After being shut out in its first two SWC games in 1915, the Owls' first touchdown in the conference was scored by **W. Edward "Mick" Brown** in a 7-0 win over Texas A&M at Houston's West End Park on11/8/1915 (*The recap of the game in the Houston Chronicle did not provide the yardage*). **Spencer George** scored the Owls' first points in the WAC on a four-yard run in the second quarter after Air Force had taken a 14-0 lead on 9/28/96. **Brennan Landry's** 43-yard field goal late in the first quarter against UAB on 10/1/05 provided the Owls first points in C-USA action and fullback **Andrew Cates** scored Rice's first C-USA touchdown on a one-yard run in the second quarter.

### **NATIONALLY RANKED**

Daelen Alexander leads all FBS freshmen with five rushing touchdowns this season and is tied for 4th among all players. Luke McCaffrey is tied for fourth in the NCAA stats with four touchdown receptions. JT Daniels is tied for 14th in the nation with eight touchdown passes.

### **FAST OUT OF THE GATE**

Rice has scored on each of its first possessions this season and has forced a turnover on each of the first three opponents' possessions. The Owls stopped Texas on fourth down to open the game on September 2 in Austin and then kicked a field goal to take a 3-0 lead. Rice drove to a touchdown against Houston after taking the opening kickoff and then Tre'Shon Devones intercepted a deflected pass on the Cougars' first drive to set up Rice's second touchdown. Devones pounced on an errant backward pass on TSU's first play from scrimmage to set up Rice's first touchdown of the night. In the last two games, Rice has scored on all seven possessions that began and ended in the first quarter.

### **FIRST QUARTERS**

Rice has scored 52 points in the first half in three games this season. The Owls scored 65 in the first quarter in 13 games in 2022 and was outscored 94-65 in the opening period last year. The Owls have not outscored the opposition in the first quarter of a full seson since 2019 (65-58). They held a 29-0 lead after the first during the shortened (5 games) 2020 season.

### **PUTTING ON THE PRESSURE**

Rice has been credited 21 tackles for loss, including seven sacks in the first three games. Against a Texas offensive line that returned all five starters and allowed only eight sacks last season. De'Braylon Carroll was credited for 1.5 sacks and his solo sack against Outland and Lombardi Award Watch list member LT Kelvin Banks, Jr. was only the second he's allowed in his career. Coleman Coco had a career-high two sacks vs. Houston and leads the team with 2.5 this year. Redshirt freshman Demone Green leads the Owls with three TFL, all of them against Houston. Four of his seven career tackles in four games have resulted in losses, including a pair of sacks. most by a Rice running back since Tyler Smith had eight receptions vs. UTEP in 2011.

### **CLOSING IN ON 1K**

Luke McCaffrey has 894 yards in 14 games as a wide receiver at Rice and needs 106 yards to reach 1,000 yards in the second fewest games in school history. David Houser topped 1,000 yards in his 14th career game thanks to a 196-yard effort at Florida in 1976. Turn to page 8 for a list of the number of games needed to reach 1,000 yards for the Owls' top receivers in history.

### **BIG NIGHT**

Daelen Alexander set a school record by scoring 14 points in overtime vs. Houston on pair of short touchdown runs and then the decisive two-point conversion. He is only the second Owl to score twice in OT. Jarett Dillard caught a pair of touchdown passed from Chase Clement at Tulsa in 2006, the second one to give Rice a walk-off win. Alexander added a third touchdown earlier in the game, the most by a true freshman on the ground since Jeremy Eddinaton scored four times vs. East Carolina in 2010.

### THE BIGGEST BREAKUP

Jonathan Joseph's breakup of Houston's attempt at a tying two-point conversion on Saturday night was the seventh by the Owls in the game, their highest total since they knocked away seven at UAB in 2021. The Owls have 13 breakups in the first three games this year, compared with nine at the same point last year. Sean Fresch, the Owls active leader with 16, leads the team with four this year, including three vs. Houston.

### DANIELS LEADS HONORS PARADE

JT Daniels became the first Owl to win an AAC weekly football honor when he was named the conference offensive player of the week after his 401-yard passing effort against Houston. Daniels is the first Owl to capture a conference offensive weekly award since Wiley Green was named the C-USA Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts in Rice's win at UAB in 2021. Daniels was also honored by the Manning Award, the Davey O'Brien Award and the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award as part of their weekly honor roll and he was added to the O'Brien Award Watch list. Luke McCaffrey's one-handed, 32-yard TD reception from Daniels was named the Pop-Tarts "Crazy Good" Play of the Week by the Football Writers of American in conjunction with Florida Citrus Sports and the Pop-Tarts Bowl. Running back **Daelen Alexander** received honorable mention recognition from the

Doak Walker Award in their weekly honorees after scoring three touchdowns against Houston. Mike Bloomgren was named On3.com's National Coach of the Week and Marques Tuiasosopo was named their coordinator of the week for their efforts vs. Houston.

### FIRST STARTS

OT Brad Baur made his first career start vs. TSU. CB Jo Jo Jean made his starting debut vs. Houston. RB Dean Connors, WR Rawson McNeill, WR Landon Ransom-Goelz, and S. Marcus Williams made their first career starts at Texas while OL Brant Banks, DE Coleman Coco, QB JT Daniels and OL Lavel Dumont made their Rice starting debuts.

### SIXTH YEAR ON **SOUTH MAIN**

At the opposite end of the spectrum from 42 newcomers, three Owls will return to Rice for their sixth season. Running back Juma Otoviano and offensive tackle Clay Servin each saw action in four games as true freshmen in 2018 while retaining their redshirts and running back Ari Broussard, who joined the squad at the start of camp in August of 2018 as a walk-on, made his debut against LSU.



### **SEVEN CAPTAINS IN '23**

The members of the Rice Football team selected seven teammates to serve as captains for the 2023 season. Quarterback JT Daniels, wide receiver Luke McCaffrey and offensive tackle Clay Servin were named captains on offense, defensive tackle Izeya Floyd, linebacker Myron Morrison and rush end Josh Pearcy will serve as captains on defense while safety Chike Anigbogu will captain the Owls' special teams. The seven captains are the largest number for any season in school history. The Owls have named five captains for a season eight times, including each of the last three years. Pearcy is a repeat selection as a captain after being named captain of the special teams in 2022. Four of the captains (Floyd, Morrison, Pearcy, and Servin) signed with Rice out of high school while Anigbogu was a recruited walk-on. McCaffrey and Daniels came to Rice as transfers. Six of the seven have already received their undergraduate degrees.

### SETTLING UNDER CENTER

Rice has seen 14 different quarterbacks make at least one start since 2017, including three in five of the last seven seasons (and started two in the five games in 2020). TJ McMahon made nine consecutive starts in last year, the most for a Rice QB since Tyler Stehling started the first 11 games of 2016 before suffering an injury and missing the finale. Driphus Jackson is the last QB to start an entire season for the Owls (12 games in 2015) and made 25 consecutive starts at QB from 2014-15.

### ON THE RECEIVING END

Luke McCaffrey and JoVoni Johnson have made the successful jump from quarterback to wide receivers for the Owls. McCaffrey led the team with 58 receptions and 903 all-purpose yards while finishing second in 723 yards and six touchdown receptions on his way to being named the winner of the George Martin Award as the team MVP. McCaffrey made three starts for Rice at QB and played in nine games in 2021 and played 11 games (two starts) under center at Nebraska in 2019 and 2020. JoVoni Johnson, who made a pair of starts for the Owls at quarterback, including Rice's shutout of #15 Marshall in 2020 before moving to wide receiver, closed out an impressive spring camp by leading the team with seven catches for 96 yards.

### **WALK-ONS**

Rice's current depth chart includes 11 players on the top two units who came to Rice as walkons. Fullback Micah Barnett and running back Ari Broussard on offense; linebackers Chike Anigbogu and Andrew Awe, defensive end Demone Green, cornerback Tre'Shon Devones and safety Daveon Hook on defense in addition to punter Connor Hunt, kicker Enock Gota and deep snappers Wyatt Freeman and Colby Connell.

### **CONTROLLING THE CLOCK**

In five seasons at Rice, Mike Bloomgren's offenses have not averaged less that 31:28 per game in time of possession and have averaged at least 32:40 in four of five seasons: 2018, 32:41; 2019, 31:28; 2020, 36:00; 2021, 33:14; 2022: 32:48.

### **COACHING STAFF UPDATES**

Five new position coaches will make their Rice debuts on Saturday, adding 60 years of experience at the FBS and NFL levels in addition to one of the most successful high school coaches in Texas over the past decade. Pete Alamar joins the Owls as the Associate Head Coach and Special Teams Coordinator and has worked at the FBS level since 1995. He and Dunleive Family Head Coach Mike Bloomgren were both members of David Shaw's staff at Stanford from 2012-2017. Running backs coach John Settle joined the Owls from Kentucky and has 28 years of coaching experience in college and the NFL. Cornerbacks coach Jeremy Modkins came to South Main after one season as a defensive analyst after coaching at his alma mater (TCU) for the previous eight seasons. New linebacker coach Jon Kay made the move from the high school ranks to Rice from North Shore High School where he compiled a 117-18 record while winning for 6A state titles, including a national title from Max Preps in 2018 while his 2022 team that was the runner up was ranked eighth in the nation by USA Today. His impact on the Rice program precedes his joining the staff as he recommended the Owls recruit nose guard De'Braylon Carroll out of Duncanville after Carroll's play against North Shore in the 2019 state title game. Tight end coach Lucas Reed moves up from an quality control position to round out the staff. Reed has been a member of the Owls staff as both a GA and quality control coach since 2018.

### **BOOTH OR FIELD**

New tight ends coach Lucas Reed ise the only position coach working in the coaches' booth on game days, the remainder of coordinators and position coaches will be on the sidelines.

### **DEGREES IN HAND**

21 Owls will take the field this fall having completed their undergraduate work, including 11 who earned their degrees at Rice (Jack Bradley, Ari Broussard, De'Braylon Carroll, Tre'Shon Devones, Izeya Floyd, Luke McCaffrey, JoVoni Johnson-McCray, Myron Morrison, Juma Otoviano, Josh Pearcy and Clay Servin.

# CASEY TO BE INDUCTED IN RICE HALL OF FAME

James Casey's improbable path from released minor league pitcher to college football standout has led him to a spot in Rice's Athletics Hall of Fame. Casey in one of seven individuals who comprise the 2023 class who will be inducted on October 27. After retiring from baseball in the summer of 2006, he came to South Main as a member of the 2007 recruiting class and needed just two years to become the most dominant, do-it-all tight end in Rice Football history. A consensus All-Conference USA honoree as a senior, he recorded 157 receptions and 1,914 yards both of which rank fifth on the school's all-time list, while his 17 touchdowns rank fourth. In 2008, had one of the most dominant seasons by a tight end in NCAA history, recording a school-record 111 receptions and 1,329 yards, while scoring 13 touchdowns. His 111 receptions are also the most by a tight end in NCAA history. Casey also set a school record with 208 receiving yards at Memphis. He added 11 touchdowns on the ground. He caught at least one pass in his last 22 games and had at least five catches in each of his last 19 contests. Casey became the first player in NCAA history to have two games in which he threw a touchdown pass, caught a touchdown pass and rushed for a score in the same game (at Tulsa and vs. Houston). Following his Rice career, Casey was drafted by the Houston Texans in the fifth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. In seven NFL seasons with the Texans, Philadelphia Eagles and Denver Broncos, he caught 72 passes for 842 yards and six touchdowns. Casey has spent the last eight year as an assistant on both the collegiate and pro level, spending the last five as the tight ends coach with the Cincinnati Bengals.

# DILLARD ON CBF HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Jarett Dillard, the record-setting receiver who led Rice to a pair of bowl appearances after a 45-year absence, is one of 101 players from the Football Bowl Subdivision on the 2024 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame. Although lightly recruited out of high school and signing with a school known for its triple-option ground attack, Dillard thrived in the switch to a spread attack in his sophomore season and went on to set NCAA career records for most touchdown receptions (60) and games with a touchdown catch (38). During a breakout sophomore season, he set NCAA single-season records for both games and consecutive games with a touchdown reception (13), despite playing with three different quarterbacks. He was named a Biletnikoff Award finalist while leading the Owls to their first bowl berth in 45 years. He caught 21 touchdown passes as a sophomore and then added 20 as a senior, becoming the

only player in NCAA history to twice catch at least 20 touchdowns in a season. He wrapped his career while leading the Owls to a 10-4 season capped by a win in the Texas Bowl--their first bowl win since 1954—and with virtually every school receiving record in his possession. He has held the NCAA career record for touchdown receptions for 15 years (2008 to present) the longest streak since Elmo Wright set the record with 34 in 1970 until it was broken in 1989. Dillard was the first Owl named to the Football Writers All-America team in 50 years in 2008. He was the first player from Rice to earn first-team All-Conference USA three times and set conference career marks for touchdown receptions and receiving yards (4,138). He was the 10th receiver in NCAA history to pass 4,000 yards receiving and the 13th player with four 1,000-yard seasons. By the time he was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the fifth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Dillard had caught at least two passes in each game of his career (49 games), the longest streak in NCAA history for players with multiple catches in every game of the streak. His 51 touchdown receptions from quarterback Chase Clement set the NCAA record for most touchdowns by a passing duo and the tandem added a 52nd in the Texas Bowl as Dillard threw a scoring pass to Clement. After three seasons in the NFL, Dillard retired and entered law school. He is currently an associate in the Energy & Natural Resources Group with Reed Smith LLP in Houston focusing on construction litigation, contract disputes, and alternative dispute resolution. He was inducted into the Rice Athletics Hall of Fame in 2015 and was an inaugural member of the Conference USA Hall of Fame and the Texas Bowl Gridiron Legend in 2019.

### **IN THE LEAGUE**

Rice had a record 11 players active in the league in 2021 and saw 10 active in 2022. The Owls had 10 players in training camps this year. (Myles Adams, Calvin Anderson, Chris Boswell, Christian Covington, Ikenna Enechukwu, Jack Fox, Elijah Garcia, Nick Leverett, Austin Trammell, Austin Walter). Covington (6th round Houston 2015) is the only one of to enter the league via the draft. While not producing recent draft picks, the Owls have seen at least one former player make his debut as a non-drafted free agent in each of the last five years and in seven of the last eight years:

### **OVERDUE RETURN**

Rice has not returned an unblocked punt for a touchdown in over 25 years. LaDouphyous McCalla took one 84 yards for a score against TCU on Nov. 8, 1997. Sam McGuffie scooped up a Tulsa punt he had blocked and returned it 12 yards for a score on October 20, 2012, for the last official punt return TD for the Owls.

### **BOZ/SENIOR BOWL 75**

Chris Boswell, who is entering his ninth season with the Pittsburgh Steelers, has been named a finalist for the Senior Bowl's "75 Team" to commemorate the 75th Senior Bowl which will be played next February in Mobile, Alabama. The Senior Bowl 75 team is intended to honor some of the top players who played in the Senior Bowl before launching their professional careers. To avoid duplicating many of the players who were selected to the Senior Bowl's 50th-anniversary team, only players who were on NFL rosters between 1998 and 2023 are eligible for selection to the 75th team. Boswell re-wrote the record book at Rice, finishing his career with 65 field goals, including 13 of 50-yards or longer while his 359 points rank second in school history. He was not selected in the 2014 NFL Draft after his appear-

ance in the Senior Bowl, but he was signed by the Steelers on October 3, 2015 and has been a mainstay for the team and an Pro Bowl selection in 2017. He enters the 2023 season ranked third in franchise history in career field goal percentage (202-234, 86.3), third with 855 career points and 202 career field goals. He holds franchise records in single-season field goal percentage (2020, 19-20, 95.0) and with 25 consecutive field goals made (2019-20, 25). He owns the franchise record with a 59-yard field goal and has made at least 20 field goals in seven of his eight seasons in the NFL. In 2016, Boswell became the first player in NFL postseason history to convert each of his first 15 field goal and set an NFL record for most field goals made in a single postseason game (6, AFC Divisional Playoff 1/15 at Kansas Citv).

### **STADIUM WORK**

Work on the second phase of the modernization of Rice Stadium is slated to be completed in August. The R Room which sits above the south end zone opened in 1972, received a major modernization. The south end zone club area was completely reimagined and added state-of-the-art audiovisual features, including a new sound system and televisions, offering fans crystal-clear viewing and immersive game-day excitement. The space will continue to honor the program's storied history and legendary figures, including hall of fame members, all-Americans, and conference champion teams. A pair of party decks were added on the Northwest and Southeast corners of the stadium while improved WiFi connectivity and the installation of TV's throughout the areas enhance fans' digital access to the game. The grass practice field to the north of the Patterson Center received a major renovation to increase drainage and improve both the quality and sustainability of the surface. This phase of stadium renovations is a key component of this season's "For The Owls" campaign to salute the Owls' loyal fan base as Rice enters the American Athletic Conference.



# MIKE BLOOMGREN HEAD COACH 6TH SEASON

Dunlevie Family Head Football Coach Mike Bloomgren enters his sixth season looking to leverage the momentum gained by a return to the postseason into greater success in the Owls' historic first season of play in the American Athletic Conference.

Rice enters the AAC coming off a season that saw the team return to bowl action for the first time in eight years with a lineup bolstered by its highest-ranked recruiting class of the modern era and an influx of veteran talent from other programs.

In the new era of open transfers, Bloomgren and staff have added 42 new faces to the returning core group of players who return 302 combined starts. Seven of the newcomers join Rice from FBS programs and add another 114 games of experience. Six of the transfers joined the Owls for spring drills in addition to four 2023 high school signees, who made up the first class of early freshmen enrollees in program history.

The wealth of returning talent stands in marked contrast to Bloomgren's first campaign in 2018, which was one of transition as 21 true freshmen from his initial national recruiting class saw action, eight of which (in addition to one JUCO transfer) found their way into the starting lineup. The youthful Owls learned their lessons quickly and closed with a resounding 27-13 win over Old Dominion, which had defeated 13th-ranked Virginia Tech earlier in the season.

His second season was highlighted by a closing rush as the Owls won their last three games, their first three-game winning streak to end a season since 2012 and setting the stage for optimism heading into 2020 before a pandemic entered the picture. When Rice finally took the field in October of 2020, the Owls saw a dramatic rally snuffed out by the most improbable of football bounces in their opener followed by an emphatic win on the road at Southern Miss. Any momentum was muted by a pair of games canceled due to COVID-19 issues and a loss on the road at North Texas. After a third COVID cancellation, the Owls headed to Marshall to face the 15th-ranked Thundering Herd and stunned the home crowd with a 20-0 win. The win was the Owls' first shutout of a ranked opponent since 1960 and was the first time in history Marshall had been shut out at home since it opened its new stadium in 1986.

The following season, the Owls handed UAB its first home loss in a conference game since the program returned in 2017 (15 games) and in 2022 Rice snapped Louisiana's 15-game winning streak, the longest active streak in the nation at that time.

Off the field, Bloomgren's Owls have excelled in the classroom as well, ranking in the top 10% of all FBS programs in the latest NCAA tracking of graduation success while Elijah Garcia (2022) and Ikenna Enechukwu (2023) have won the last two Bob Quin awards as the top male student-athlete at Rice.

Garcia became the sixth Owl in Bloomgren's five seasons to reach the NFL when he made his debut with Denver last season.

Bloomgren was named the 19th head football coach at Rice University on December 6, 2017 and immediately turned his focus on instilling the culture of "Intellectual Brutality" that he first conceived while on the staff at Stanford. Part of that effort involved broadening the Owls' search for talent to a national scale and his 2022 team features players from 22 states, compared with just six on the roster he inherited.

Bloomgren came to Rice after seven seasons with the Cardinal, first as the offensive line coach (2011-12) and then assuming the reigns of Stanford's pro-style offensive attack in 2013, setting the stage for one of the most successful decades in the program's rich history. Stanford won eight or more games in each of his seasons and reached the Pac-12 Football Championship four times, winning three titles.

Prior to 2017, Bloomgren had coached 12 NFL Draft selections and 11 All-America selections at Stanford, including 2015 Outland Trophy winner Joshua Garnett and NCAA all-purpose yardage record holder Christian McCaffrey.

The 2017 campaign saw running back Bryce Love nearly match McCaffrey's production on his way to being named a finalist for both the Heisman Trophy and Doak Walker Award. Love burst out of the gate with 180 yards on 13 carries against Rice in the season opener in Sydney, Australia, and completed the regular season with 1,973 yards on the ground, second only to McCaffrey's school-record 2,019 in 2015.

Bloomgren's 2016 unit ended the season on a six-game winning streak in which the offense produced 290.5 rushing yards/game, the most by any Power 5 program over that stretch. Mc-Caffrey, the eighth overall pick in the NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers, earned All-America honors for the second straight season and was an All-Pac-12 first-team running back. His 183.87



career all-purpose yards/game were the most of any active FBS player at season's end, and his 6,987 career all-purpose yards were the second-most of any active FBS player.

Bloomgren was instrumental in the breakout season posted in 2015 by McCaffrey, that season's Associated Press Player of the Year and Heisman Trophy finalist. McCaffrey, the program's single-season rushing leader, led the nation in all-purpose yards while breaking Barry Sanders' NCAA record.

Stanford amassed a school-record 3,131 rushing yards on 610 attempts that season, the most by the program. The offensive unit's 529 points ranked second-most in a season, and its 33 rushing touchdowns, 223.7 rushing yards/game, 30 passing touchdowns, 37.8 points/game and 6,097 total yards of offense ranked third.

Stanford scored at least 30 points in a national-best 13 consecutive games and led the nation in time of possession (34:48), the seventh-best by any team in the past 20 years.

Four Cardinal heard their names called at the NFL Draft following the 2015 season, including first-round selection Garnett, Stanford's unanimous first-team All-America -- the ninth in school history. Garnett was the program's first Outland Trophy winner as the nation's top interior lineman, and won the Morris Trophy, presented to the Pac-12 Lineman of the Year.

Bloomgren's linemen were named a finalist for the inaugural Joe Moore Award in 2015, given to the nation's top offensive line.

While facing six nationally-ranked opponents in 2014, including four on the road, Bloomgren helped Stanford win eight games. The Cardinal scored at least 30 points in seven of 13 games on the season and increased its nation-best streak of scoring at least 10 points to 95 games. Stanford also set a record for the most points in a bowl game in program history with 45 in the Foster Farms Bowl win against Maryland.

Stanford amassed a program-best 2,904 rushing yards during the 2013 season, Bloomgren's first year at the offensive helm.

Individual honors are closely tied to Bloomgren. He has earned recognition for both his coaching and recruiting prowess. Rivals.com named Bloomgren one of its 2014 National Recruiters of the Year -- the latest such honor that began in 2012 when ESPN recognized him as its Pac-12 Recruiter of the Year. Rivals.com tabbed Bloomgren as one of the nation's top-25 recruiters in 2016. FootballScoop.com named Bloomgren its 2013 Offensive Line Coach of the Year following two years of eye-opening accomplishments.

Bloomgren joined the Cardinal staff as offensive line coach and run game coordinator in 2011 after spending four seasons with the New York Jets, where he served as assistant offensive coordinator (2010), offensive assistant (2009) and offensive quality control coach (2007-08).

In 2013, all five offensive linemen received All-Pac-12 honors, including first-team selection David Yankey, Stanford's first two-time first-team All-American selection since Bob Whitfield (1990-91) who was also selected as a semifinalist for the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award.

Four of Bloomgren's five starting offensive linemen earned All-Pac-12 honors in 2012, including Yankey who earned consensus All-American honors while becoming the first Stanford player to win the Morris Trophy since 2002.

The Cardinal offensive line afforded 200-plus yards rushing in six games during the 2012 season, paving the way for record-breaking running back Stepfan Taylor. The Doak Walker Award semifinalist produced the best season of his career (109.29 yards/game).

Bloomgren's work with the offensive line in 2011, which included three first-year starters, played a pivotal role in providing protection for Heisman finalist Andrew Luck to complete over 70 percent of his passes and throw a school-record 37 touchdowns, in addition to compiling the third-highest rushing total in school annals. Stanford's ground game keyed an offense that ranked seventh nationally in scoring average at 43.2 points/game and eighth in total offense at 489.3 yards/game.

Bloomgren launched his coaching career as an undergraduate assistant for Bobby Bowden at Florida State, where the Seminoles captured a pair of Atlantic Coast Conference titles (1997-98) during his tenure. He served as co-offensive coordinator at Catawba College from 2002-04 and offensive coordinator at Delta State from 2005-06. A 1999 graduate of Florida State with a bachelor's degree in sports management, Bloomgren earned his master's degree in higher education from Alabama in 2001.

A native of Tallahassee, Florida, Mike and his wife, Lara, have two sons, Tyler and Parker.

### INTELLECTUAL BRUTALITY

Mike Bloomgren created the phrase "Intellectual Brutality" in 2013 while at Stanford which he trademarked and brought it with him to Rice to set the standard for the program. Bloomgren on the meaning of the branding: "It is our brand: a physical, smart way to play football. We're going to give them different plays at the line of scrimmage and have them do some things mentally, because if we didn't, we wouldn't be using the resources that we have. These guys are brilliant and you better take advantage of that first. We are going to be smart and we are going to be the physical team that nobody wants to play. I want our guys to walk around knowing they're incredibly smart and that we are going to take advantage of that."

- Reached double figures for the first time in his career in 2022 with a personal-best 11 stops at Houston and added 10 at LA Tech, including his first career sack (loss of nine yards).
