BULLS SEEK LONGEST WIN STREAK SINCE 2018; MAINTAIN AAC LEAD

Having posted back-to-back 40-plus point scoring games for the first time since September of 2017, the team's first 2-0 start in conference play since 2018, and back-to-back wins for the first time since 2019, USF will look to win back-to-back wins for the first time since 2019, USF will look to win back-to-back wins for the first time since 2019. back road games for the first time since wins at UMass and Tulsa in 2018 and back-to-back AAC road victories since consecutive wins at ECU, Tulane and UConn in 2017 when USF returns to UAB for the first time since a 45-20 win between then Conference USA foes in 2004. For the second straight week, the game will pit first-time head coaches. I win would provide the first three-game winning streak for USF since 2018 when the Bulls started 7-0 and the first in

AAC games since the 2017 season when USF won four straight and finished 6-2 in the conference.

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU: Quarterback Byrum Brown turned 19 last Friday and the following day delivered USF's first road win since 2019 and first-ever win in Annapolis with a 338-yard, three touchdown day at Navy. The redshirt freshman leads the AAC in total offense (309.4 ypg) and points responsible for per game (17.2). Honored by the AAC for the third straight week on Monday (2nd Honor Roll, POW last week), after two AAC games Brown ranks in the conference only statistics: No. 1 in completions (48), yards (773), yards per game (386.5), touchdown passes (5), interceptions (0) and total offense (414 ypg); No. 2 in pass efficiency (205.4), No. 3 in completion percentage going 48-of-63 (76.19%). His 21 TDs responsib for in seven starts (2 in 2022) are the most-ever for a USF QB through seven starts.

■ DEFENSIVE PRESSURE: USF's new defense under coordinator Todd Orlando has dialed up the pressure as USF ranks No. 9 nationally in TFL (8.2 tpg) and No. 29 in sacks. The Bulls have posted three games with 4 or more sacks, their 14 on the year equal the team's total in 2022 and are the most for a USF team since 2019. The Bulls gained their second AAC Defensive Player of the Week on the season with Tramel Logan earning the honor this week (joining Daguan Evans in Week 3), after USF did not have a defensive player earn the honor since 2017.

THE PROGRAM

In its 27th season and 24th at the FBS level, USF Football has made 10 bowl appearances, including a string of four straight (2015-18) and every season between 2005-10 (6 straight). USF has won six bowl games and produced 15 All-America selections, 30 NFL Draft picks and reached the No. 2 ranking in the Associated Press Poll in 2007.

LAST TIME OUT

BULLS EXCERCISE ROAD DEMONS WITH FIRST-EVER WIN AT NAVY

USF ended a four-year, 19-game road losing skid with a resilient 44-30 victory at Navy that saw the Bulls commit early miscues that had them trailing 14-0 just six minutes into the game, but rebound with 21-straight points to lead at half time and another 21-straight point run in the second half (44-9 overall) to seize command and post the program's first-ever win at Navy, 44-20, in three tries. The Bulls outgained Navy 435-330 and controlled the ball for 10:53 in the fourth quarter as they iced the win despite losing three fumbles on the day.

- QB Byrum Brown posted 383 yards passing, finishing 26-34 (76%) with three touchdowns while completing passes to eight different receivers and leading five touchdown drives of 67 yards or more.
- WR Sean Atkins led USF with four catches for a career-best 116 yards and two touchdowns, including an 88-yard scoring strike that stands as the fourth-longest in program history.
- The USF defense limited Navy to just three drives of 46 yards or longer, one of those coming on their final drive of the game down three touchdowns. Navy went 3-of-14 on third down and 1-of-2 on fourth while collecting just 11 first downs.
- USF returned a bad snap on a Navy PAT for two points and Tramel Logan returned a fumble 70-yards for a touchdown.

STORY LINES

■ On-Campus Stadium & Operations Center Coming: On Sept. 8, 2021, USF Board of Trustees Chair Will Weatherford told a gathered audience of nearly 300, "Bulls Nation deserves to have a stadium on this campus. I'm here to tell you we're going to do it." Stadium and operations center planning has moved forward quickly with a site identified on the east end of campus in the current Athletics District and on the site of first Bulls team's practice fields. In September 2022, the design/build team of Barton Malow and Populous was selected for the project and the state Board of Governors on Sept. 7, 2023 approved \$340 million for construction of a 35,000-seat stadium and operations centers for football and lacrosse that are targeted for completion for the start of the 2026 season.

☐ Notably, UAB's Protective Stadium was designed by the same firm - Populous - that is designing USF's stadium. The Bulls play in the stadium, which was built at a cost of \$175 million and opened in 2021, in Week 6 of the 2023 season.

- \$25 Million Gift: On Sept. 7, 2023, USF Athletics received the largest gift in its history as Tampa General Hospital gave \$25 million to name the Center for Athletic Excellence, a football and lacrosse operations facility that will be included as part of USF's new on-campus stadium project and will feature dedicated clinical space for TGH where TGH will provide behavioral health services. TGH will also name the university's athletics district.
- \$366 Million In New Football Facilities: The Bulls have spent more on football facilities in the last two years than in the previous 25. With the approval of \$340 million for an on-campus stadium slated for 2026, the total investment in football facilities has reached \$366 million in the last two years, including a \$22 million Indoor Performance Facility, \$3 million locker room and office renovation and nearly \$1 million in new equipment and enhancements to the weight room.
- Bulls Open Indoor Facilty: On Sept. 8, 2021 USF officially broke ground on a \$22 million Indoor Performance Facility on the site of the Bulls current turf practice field. The facility, which followed on the heels of a \$3 million locker room renovation that opened prior to the start of the 2021 season, was completed in late fall of 2022 and the Bulls began practicing in it on Jan. 9.
- Charge Up The Offense: In the last three years as a playcaller, including his year at UCF, Alex Golesh's offense is averaging a nation's-best 3.06 plays per minute and 1.53 points per minute, which ranks third in FBS during that span. Each of his years as an offensive coordinator have seen Golesh's offenses finish in the FBS top 10 in scoring and total offense.

- New Look Bulls: USF will hit the field with 56 new players, 38 of those scholarship players. Among the positions Alex Golesh and his staff brought in the most new scholarship players are on the offensive line (8), wide receiver (7), defensive tackle (5) and secondary (5). The Bulls have 24 of those players appearing in the depth chart, including 13 on offense, nine on defense and two
- 5-10 Weapons: Bulls 5-10 wide receivers Sean Atkins (28 catches, 3311 yds, 3 TD) and Naiem Simmons (20 catches, 380 yards, 2 TD) lead the Bulls receivers and rank among the top receiving targets in the AAC. Atkins is a former walk-on, Simmons is an FCS transfer who had no scholarship offers coming out of high school. Simmons posted a USF and state of Florida FBS player record 272 vards on 8 catches vs. Rice and is 5th in the AAC in receiving yards, while Atkins is 3rd in the AAC (38th nationally) with 5.6 receptions per game, having posted four or more in all five games on the year.
- Transfer Destination: USF has 39 players on the roster that previously played at another NCAA Division I program, 31 that played at a current Autonomy 5 programs. Among those, the Bulls have three players from Minnesota and two each from Baylor, Florida, Florida State, Kansas State, Maryland, Oklahoma and Texas.
- Golesh Takes Charge: Named the program's sixth head coach in December, Alex Golesh is the third firsttime head coach in program history. The 2022 Broyles Award finalist is the son of Russian immigrants that brought he and his brother to Brooklyn, N.Y. in 1991 as pre-teens where they lived above a bodega before eventually moving to Columbus, Ohio. He was born in Moscow, but his parents, Vladimir and Bella, left Russia for America in 1991 as conservative hardline communists were in the midst of staging an unsuccessful coup to try to overthrow then Soviet Union president Mikhail Gorbachev.
- "My parents left everything and sacrificed everything because they wanted to give me and my older brother a better life," Golesh said. "They worked really, really hard to give us the life we now have."
- Close But No Cigar: USF played four Top 25 ranked programs in 2022 and nearly pulled off the upset vs. three - falling by a touchdown or less and in the final minutes in all three. After a 50-21 season-opening loss to No. 25 BYU, USF fell 31-28 at No. 18 Florida, 28-24 at No. 24 Cincinnati and 46-39 vs. No. 25 UCF. At Florida, USF drove to the Florida 19 with 44 seconds to play and had a chance to win the game before a fumble on a shotgun snap on 2nd and 6 forced a 49-yard, game-tying field goal attempt that missed after a bad snap and hold with 22 seconds to play. At Cincinnati, USF trailed 28-24 before driving to the UC 25 and failing on a 4th and 1 attempt with 5:12 remaining. Against UCF, the Bulls led 39-28 when UCF took possession with 2:49 to play and drove 82 yards for the game winning touchdown with 20 seconds to play.



THERE'S A STORY THERE

✓ **S Daquan Evans** grew up in Orlando' Parramore District "projects" as he calls it. His mother passed away on the

day of his high school graduation, and he still attended - "that is what whe would have wanted. He wears No. 0 because "when I'm on that field, I've got nothing on my mind ... nothing except complete focus and staying locked in." Evans was 15, a sophomore at Orlando Jones High School, when he became a father and his son, 6-year-old Da'Mani, is a regular at USF games.

- ✓ RB Nay'Quan Wright was was shot in the chest from a ricocheted bullet during a drive-by shooting while practicing with his youth football team in Miami Gardens when he was 11. His family got a call that he had passed away, but he recovered. Wright also broke his ankle as a high school junior, which derailed his recruiting process after he helped lead Carol City to a state title win in 2016.
- ✓ **S Logan Berryhill** lost his older brother, Braxton Sullivan (14), in a car accident when Logan was 12, his mother is in a convalescent home due to the effects of brain cancer, including blindness and seizures, and he was raised by a great aunt and grandfather.
- ✓ LB DJ Gordon is a native of Plant City, 40 minutes east of campus, where his family has lived for generations and he enjoyed the country life riding horses (quarter-horses and a Mustang Appaloosa), hunting, fishing and enjoying occasional meals of possum, squirrel and raccoon. He also hunted and ate gators. His name is James Edward Gordon IV, but he got the nickname "DJ" because his father was known as "Dank" and he is "Dank Jr." or "DJ."
- ✓ WR Khafre Brown Brown was named for the Egyptian king Khafre, who built the second largest pyramid of Giza during his 66-year reign, concluding somewhere around 2570 B.C. Brown's mother was intrigued after seeing a picture of Khafre's statue in a book. Brown does paintings for a hobby. He specializes in sunsets, usually in a beach or skyline setting. He picked up the hobby from his mother, who is an artist.
- ✓ P Andrew Stokes is 29 years old and the Bulls second straight punter to come out of Prokick in Australia. He had never played in a football game when he arrived at USF. Stokes spent seven years playing Australian rules football with the Railways in the Great Northern Football League, then Freemantle of the West Australia Football League.
- ✓ DL Doug Blue-Eli, a TCU transfer, and Wagner transfer WR Naiem Simmons were freshmen at the same NJ

high school. Simmons arrived at USF in January and told Blue-Eli about Alex Golesh and the university. Blue-Eli transferred in May and they are together again.

- ✓ **QB Gerry Bohanon** Academics shaped the life of Bohanon. His principal at Earle (Arkansas) High School was his mother, Juanita. He often did homework on the bus rides to road games. He finished his undergraduate degree in 2 1/2 years at Baylor University.
- **DT Immanuel Hickman and OC Joel Gordon** are both sons of preachers. Gordon's father, Robert, is 90 and is still a Presbyterian minister in Virginia. Hickman is the son of pastor Derwin Hickman, Sr. and co-pastor Franswalla Hickman of Divine World Changers International Ministries in Richmond, Va.
- ✓ **USF Football** is one of five football programs in the American Athletic Conference founded after 1991: Charlotte 2013; UTSA 2011; FAU 2001; USF 1997; UAB 1991.
- ✓ WR Coach L'Damian Washington has 27 siblings. His father was murdered when he was five. When he was 15, his best friend was murdered and his mother had a stroke while cheering at his high school basketball game and died.
- ✓ HC Alex Golesh is the fourth USF head coach (of 6) to take the reins in their 30's joining Jim Leavitt (39, all-time winningest USF coach), Willie Taggart (37, 3 bowls and two 10 win seasons in 5 years) and Jeff Scott (39).
- ✓ D-Line Coach Kevin Patrick is on his third stint with USF and was on head coach Jim Leavitt's first-ever USF staff. In fact, he led the team out of the tunnel in the program's first-ever game in 1997 in old Tampa Stadium. Patrick was a 1993 AP First-team All-American and Bigast Defensive Player of the Year at Miami, part two Hurricanes national championships and a roommate of Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson. They remain friends.
- ✓ Safeties Coach James Rowe was a left-handed pitcher on Bulls baseball teams from 2005-07. A meeting with then USF defensive coordinator Wally Burnham helped reignite his interest in football and he went on to coach five seasons in the NFL (most recently with the Chicago Bears) before returning to USF.
- ✓ Offensive Line Coach Tyler Hudanick is 26 years old, three years younger than Bulls punter Andrew Stokes who is 29. Hudanick, who played at UCF, actually played in the same game with Bulls senior tackle Donovan Jennings in the War on I-4 (USF vs. UCF) battle in 2018.

UAB, Charlotte, FAU, North Texas, Rice & UTSA officially joined the AAC on July 1, 2023.

FIRST YEAR HEAD COACHES: Alex Golesh begins his first season at USF in 2023 and his first-ever as a head coach. He is among seven first-year head coaches at their respective programs in The American in 2023, including Trent Dilfer (UAB), Tom Herman (FAU), Eric Morris (North Texas), Brian Newberry (Navy), Biff Poggi (Charlotte) and Kevin Wilson (Tulsa). USF will face four of those coaches in 2023: Dilfer, Herman, Newberry and Poggi.

GOLESH TAKES THE REINS

First-year Head Coach Alex Golesh (39) was named the 2022 247Sports Offensive Coordinator of the Year after leading the Tennessee offense to nation's leading marks in scoring (46.1 ppg) and total offense (525.5 ypg). Tennessee wide receiver Jalin Hyatt won the Biletnikoff Award catching 67 passes for 1,267 yards and 15 touchdowns, while quarterback Hendon Hooker (3,135 yards and 27 TD passing; 430 yards and 5 TD rushing) was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and was a strong Heisman candidate before a late season injury ended his campaign. Golesh helped Tennessee go 11-2 and win the Orange Bowl. He previously helped lead turnarounds at four programs serving as a tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator or offensive coordinator at Toledo, Illinois, Iowa State and Tennessee.

■ He is the third first-time head coach in program history following Jim Leavitt (1996-2009), who came to USF from being co-defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at Kansas State, and Jeff Scott (2020-22), who came to USF after being co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach at Clemson. Leavitt is the winningest coach in program history, posting a 95-57 record, a 3-2 mark in bowl games and leading USF to a No. 2 AP ranking in 2007.

BROWN MAKING CASE FOR AMERICAN'S TOP QB AAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK, DAVEY O'BRIAN & MANNING AWARD RECOGNITIONS

Redshirt fresham QB Byrum Brown has quickly established himself as one of the standout quarterbacks in the nation with superalitive performances in his first seven starts under center - five in 2023.

- Brown <u>leads the AAC in</u> total offense (309.4 ypg) and points responsible for (17.3 ppg) overall and in conference games leads in completions, passing yards, TD passes, interceptions and total offense while standing second in pass efficiency (205.4) and third in completion percentage (76%).
- In his first two conference games, Brown has completed 76% of his passes for 773 yards, five TD and no interceptions.
- He led USF to its first road win in four seasons passing for 338 yards, 3 TD, a 76% completion percentage and no interceptions at Navy (9.30) while leading five touchdown drives of 67 yards or longer and a 13-play, 56-yard, 7:28 drive to put the game on ice late in the fourth quarter. After falling down 14-0, Brown led USF to 21-straight points on TD drives of 70, 67 and 88 yards in the first half.
- He made his final start as an 18-year old one for the ages as he posted a <u>career-best with 435 yards passing going 22-of-29 (75%)</u> with two touchdowns and no interceptions in a 42-29 victory over Rice (9/23), which rank as the second-best total in program history behind 503 yards posted by Quinton Flowers at UCF in 2017.
- He was named the <u>AAC Offensive Player of the Week</u>, USF's first since Jordan Cronkrite in 2019, and honored by the Davey O'Brien "Great 8" and Manning "Stars of the Week" Quarterback Awards.
- Brown's <u>career-best 517 total yards</u> (435 passing, team-high 82 rushing and 1 TD) rank as the second-best total in program history and he joined Quinton Flowers as the only two players in program history to post 500+ yards in total offense. Flowers owns the record with 605 at UCF in 2017.
- Browns 517 total yards vs. Rice are the most posted by any player in the nation through Week 5. His 435 passing yards vs. Rice rank as the 8th through Week 5.
- Brown ranks No. 8 among FBS quarterbacks with 324 rushing yards on the year (64.8 ypg). He led the nation through Week 4 but four sacks at Navy dropped his ranking. He stands 18th nationally with 17.2 points responsible for per game.

26 SEASONS OF USF FOOTBALL

USF celebrated its 25th season of football in 2021 after the program hit the field in 1997 after an initial season of only practices and scrimmages in 1996. The University was founded in 1956 but didn't field a football team for another 41 years. The Bulls debuted as a Division I-AA (Football Championship Subdivision) program on Sept. 6, 1997 with an 80-3 victory against NCAA Division II Kentucky Wesleyan at the old Tampa Stadium.

- When USF football debuted, the university's enrollment was 36,649 (it's now nearly 50,000).
- USF's overall operating budget has advanced from \$500-million to \$1.857-billion during the 25-year football era, while USF's economic impact on the Tampa Bay region has gone from \$1.1-billion to \$4.4-billion.

- In 2007, USF became the fastest program in the modern AP Poll Era to go from inception to a Top 10 national ranking as the Bulls were ranked No. 6 in the Week 5 AP Poll in just the program's 11th season. The Bulls would climb all the way to the No. 2 ranking two weeks later in Week 7 to become the fastest to reach a Top 5 ranking.
- The Bull have reached a Top 25 ranking in seven seasons, including three straight (2016-18), and been ranked a total of 48 weeks, including 12 in the top 15.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- USF opened the 2023 season at Western Kentucky, one of seven bowl teams from the 2022 season on the schedule and a preseason favorite to win Conference USA after going 9-5 last year and winning the New Orleans Bowl. The Hilltoppers had 15 players named to Athlon Sports 2023 preseason All-CUSA team.
- USF will face five of those bowl teams in road games.
- USF will face three teams that won more than nine games in 2022, including perennial national championship contender Alabama (11-2, Sugar Bowl victory), which comes to Raymond James Stadium on Sept. 16.
- Other 2022 bowl teams on the schedule include Rice and road dates at UAB, UConn (non-conference), Memphis and UTSA, which went 11-2 last season and joins The American this year after winning back-to-back titles in C-USA.
- The Bulls round out the non-conference slate facing Florida A&M (Sept. 9). USF opens conference play with a home contest vs. Rice (Sept. 23), one of six new conference members.
- The Bulls will face five of the new AAC teams, including home dates vs. FAU (Oct. 14) and Charlotte (Nov. 25).
- USF will be playing three teams it has never played before, including Charlotte, Rice and UTSA, while USF's trip to San Antonio will be the program's lone first-time destination on the year. It will also be USF's lone midweek game, set for a 9 p.m. (ET) kick on Friday, Nov. 17.

14-TEAM AAC

The 2023 campaign will mark The American's first with 14 teams, as the league welcomes UAB, Charlotte, Florida Atlantic, North Texas, Rice and UTSA to its ranks. They will join continuing members East Carolina, Memphis, Navy, SMU,



Temple, Tulane, Tulsa and USF to comprise a conference that will continue to compete for perennial New Year's Six bowls and College Football Playoff appearances. The conference will have at least 20 games on either ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU. The American continued to make history in 2022 as Tulane capped a 12-2 season with a Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic victory against USC and a final national ranking of No. 9. It marked the seventh time in nine seasons of the College Football Playoff era that The American was represented in the New Year's Six, the fourth win by an American team in the league's 10-year history and the sixth top-10 finish by an American Athletic Conference team. Seven teams from The American were selected for bowl games, while league teams went 4-3 in postseason play.

#COMETOTHEBAY #STAYINTHEBAY FOCUSED ON CULTIVATING HOMEGROWN TALENT

USF has focused recruiting on the state of Florida and particularly the Bay area and its seven surrounding counties.



Within a 100-mile radius of Tampa there are 121 high schools. There are close to 100 Division I players recruited nationally from the area annually.

- The Bulls build on the benefit of players being able to have their family involved in the program, see them play regularly, go home regularly and play for their city as well as the benefit of building their brand in a thriving metropolitan economic area of over 4 million people and numerous large businesses and professional opportunities.
- The 2023 Bulls' roster <u>features 27 players from the Bay area</u>, including <u>11 on the depth chart</u> to start the 2023 season
- 68 of the players on USF's roster hail from the state of Florida. That represents 58 percent of the roster with Georgia (12), Texas (8), California (4) and New Jersey (4) being the next closest states in producing current Bulls.
- Among the Bay area standouts on the Bulls' 2023 roster are: left tackle Donovan Jennings, guards Mike Lofton, Andrew Kilfoyl and Zach Perkins, tight end Weston Wolff, cornerback Aamaris Brown, safeties Will Jones and Timarcus Simpson, linebacker DJ Gordon and defensive end Lloyd Summerall.

STAFF INVESTMENT

When USF Vice President of Athletics Michael Kelly hired Alex Golesh to lead the USF program he also made a commitment to enhancing USF's football staff in both enhanced salaries for primary coaching staff and investment in recruiting and player personnel.

- USF increased the football staff salary pool by nearly \$1 million entering the 2023 season.
- USF recruiting/player personnel department went from five full-time members in 2022 to 10 in 2023 with eight members in recruiting and two new player development positions
- Director of Player Development Jeff Jones coached head coach Alex Golesh at Dublin High School and lived on his block, often taking him to practices. He served as principal at four high schools in Ohio and associate principal at one during 14 years as an administrator and 29 in education.

NOTING THE OPPONENT: UAB

Led by first-year head coach Trent Dilfer, a Tampa Bay icon, UAB enters Saturday at 1-4 and 0-1 in the AAC, but took defending champion Tulane to the brink in New Orleans last Saturday before falling 35-23. The Blazers led 20-14 at the half and with UAB trailing by five with less than a minute remaining in the contest, Tulane quarterback Michael Pratt found Lawrence Keys III on 4th-and-9 for a 32-yard touchdown to ice the game. Trailing by eight early in the fourth, UAB drove all the way to the Tulane 1-yard line, but quarterback Jacob Zeno fumbled on an attempted quarterback sneak which the Green Wave recovered in the end zone.

- Zeno was 27-of-35 for 236 yards, and his top target was freshman Amare Thomas who finished with eight catches for 99 yards. Running back Isaiah Jacobs had career highs in carries (18), yards (95) and touchdowns (2), while Matt Quinn accounted for the rest of the scoring as he was 3-for-3 on field goals from 31, 48 and 36 yards.
- The Blazers gained 434 yards of total offense, including a season-high 170 rushing yards, but Tulane had 448 yards, including 264 on the ground.
- Zeno trails only Byrum Brown in the AAC in total offense, posting 308.80 yards per game, while Jermaine Brown stands fifth in all-purpose yards with 91.20 per game. Safety Keondre Swoopes is third in the AAC posting 7.75 tackles per game and Michael Fairbanks leads the AAC with 3 forced fumbles.
- The Blazers, who play almost as fast at USF, stand fourth in total offense (420.2) and 13th in total defense (433.6).

- LAST TIME VS UAB: The teams last met in Birmingham during the 2004 season, the second of two meetings as fellow members of Conference USA. In Game 7 of the 2004 season, USF went to UAB with a 2-4 record and claimed a 45-20 victory. USF would finish 4-7 on the year. Andre Hall rand for a then USF record 275 yards and two touchdowns as the Bulls racked up 323 rushing yards and 504 total yards to out-gain UAB (342) by over 162 yards. USF trailed 20-17 entering the fourth quarter buth out-scored the Blazers 28-0 in the final frame, including a 77-yard touchdown pass from Pat Julmiste to Johnny Peyton, a 39-yard interception return for a TD by Bruce Gipson and touchdown runs of 35 and 63 yards from Hall.
- BULLS FACE BAY AREA ICON: UAB head coach Trent Dilfer is a Tampa Bay area icon who was a 1994 first round NFL Draft pick of the Buccaneers, became their first quarterback to reach the Pro Bowl (1997), started in six seasons and became the then franchise leader in wins (38) before signing with the Baltimore Ravens in 2000 and leading that franchise to its first Super Bowl title, winning XXXV over the Giants in Raymond James Stadium on January 28, 2001.

USF posted 42 points vs. Rice and 44 points at Navy in conference opening wins, totaling 1,032 combined yards.

- The Bulls are averaging 516 yards and 43 points per game in conference play.
- USF posted back-to-back 40-plus point games for the first time since posting three straight in September of 2017. The program record in five-straight posted in 2001. The Bulls have posted three-straight in five seasons: 2001, 2007, 2015, 2016, 2017.
- USF posted 4 40-plus point games in the last three seasons: two in 2022 and one each in 2021 and 2020.

MAY DAE. MAY DAE: BULL INCOMING

Graduate safety Daquan Evans (who goes by Dae Dae) garnered honors for his outstanding effort in a 17-3 loss to No. 10 Alabama (9.16). He was <u>named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Week</u>, becoming the first Bull to earn a Defensive Player of the Week honor since all-time leading tackler Auggie Sanchez in 201, and the <u>Bednarik National Defensive Player of the Week</u>.

- Evans tormented Alabama quarterbacks all day in the Bulls' battle vs. a top 10-ranked foe that saw USF lead f7or most of the first half and go into the final minute in a one-score game. The 5-11, 190-pound veteran posted career-bests with eight tackles, four tackles for loss and three sacks and added a pass break-up and quarterback hurry.
- Evans performance vaulted him into the national lead in tackles for loss on the season
- Entering Week 6, Evans stands No. 8 in the nation in tackles for loss (1.8 per game) and ranks 7th in the AAC in sacks with three (0.60).

GORDON LEADS ASSAULT ON RICE'S JT DANIELS

Senior LB DJ Gordon led USF with 6 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks as the Bulls held Rice to 1 yard rushing on the day, the lowest total for an opponent since 2017 and the sixth-lowest in program history.

- USF tallied 11 tackles for loss on the day, marking their second double-digit TFL total on the year as USF now ranks No. 5 nationally posting 9.0 per game.
- The Bulls posted 31 tackles for loss over a three game stretch in September and logged 4.0 or more sacks in three straight games. Last year, USF posted double-digit TFL just once (vs. Howard) and 4.0 or more sacks just once (4 vs. Tulane).

EXPLOSIVE BULLS

USF posted a season-best 12 explosive plays (15+ yards) in their 42-29 victory over Rice (9.23), including three plays of 50+ yards and quarterback Byrum Brown connecting with wide receiver Naiem Simmons on four plays of 42-yards or more, including gains of 53, 51, 49 and 42 yards. Brown also connected on a 59-yard pass play to Khafre Brown. Just one of those was a scoring play, with Brown hitting Simmons on a 49-yard TD pass.

- USF is averaging 8.2 explosive plays per game through Week 5, including pass plays of 88 yards (vs. Navy) and 84 yards (at WKU) that rank No. 4 and No. 7 on the USF all-time chart.
- Despite playing two of the slowest playing teams in the country in back-to-back games in Rice and Navy, <u>USF stands third</u> in the nation averaging 83.5 plays per game through Week 5. UAB is the next closest AAC team at No. 13 (76.8).

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

QB Byrum Brown (Raleigh, N.C.) showed his talent and moxy in two strong starts in the final two games of 2022 and earned the starting job to begin 2023.

- Led USF to first road victory in 19 games (four seasons) passing for 338 yards, three TD and 76% percent at Navy (9.30) while completing passes to eight different receivers.
- Completed 75 percent of his passes vs. Rice (9.23) and totaled the second-most passing yards (435) and third-most total offense (517) in program history while accounting for 3 TD and a two-point conversion catch
- Brown accounted for five totals TD (three passing, two rushing) in the home opener against FAMU, becoming the first USF player to do so since the 2020 season, (Jordon McCloud vs. UCF 1.2.2020).
- Starting the 2023 season opener, Brown ran for 160 yards on 25 carries to lead the USF offense to 540 total yards and 374 rushing yards at WKU (9.2.23). His 160 yards marked the fourth-best mark by a USF quarterback and the Bulls 374 rushing yards were the eighth-best in program history.
- Brown had a <u>stellar debut</u> in his first career start, a 48-42 loss at Tulsa (11.18.22). He led USF to a season-best 499 yards of offense and equaled a season high with 42 points in a loss that came down to the final seconds

☐ He completed his first 21 passes before his first incompletion came late in the 4th quarter, becoming the first FBS player to start a game with 21 consecutive completions since MTSU's Brent Stockwell completed 22 straight vs. Alabama A&M in 2016. He finished the game 21-of-25, his 84 percent completion percentage breaking the USF program game record of 82.8 percent (24-29) set by Quinton Flowers at Memphis in 2016.

☐ He totaled 316 yards and four TD (three passing, one rushing) while not committing a turnover and posting a pass efficiency rating of 204.2. He led scoring drives of 68, 90, 47, 65, 79, 35 and 51 yards in a game with a 30 degree temperature at kickoff and without the team's leading receiver.

Simmons eight catches on eight targets tied his career mark previously set in FCS competition at Wagner. He had five of 42-plus yards on the game.

- Simmons receiving yards rank as the most-ever by a player from a state of Florida FBS program, breaking the 55-year-old record of 268 set by Florida State's Ron Sellers vs. Wake Forest in 1968.

ATKINS MAKING 38 GREAT

A former walk-on wide receiver that entered the 2022 season with 11 career catches for 99 yards and no touchdowns, 5 ft. 10 in. Sean Atkins has stepped up for the Bulls in a big way.

- When he and other players earned the right to switch numbers Atkins said "It is the number they assigned me, I'm going to make it my own" and stayed with 38.
- Threw his first career pass attempt and completion on a hookand-ladder that went for 39-yards and got the Bulls into the redzone against FAMU (9.9). Atkins had attempted one prior pass, (at UF 9.17.22) but it was on a two-point conversion attempt, thus not counted towards official passing stats. The pass was completed from Atkins to WR Xavier Weaver for a successful two-point conversion). The former QB completed another two-point conversion to Byrum Brown vs. Rice (9.23).
- Atkins has caught at least 5 passes in every game this year and ranks fifth in the AAC with 6.0 catches per game, 24 total.
- Atkins posted career highs of nine catches for 115 yards with an 18-yard TD catch from Byrum Brown at Tulsa (11.18.22). His nine receptions tied for ninth on USF's game receptions chart and were the most by a USF player since Bryce Miller posted 11 vs. UCF in 2020.
- Atkins caught passes in seven games in 2022, including the last four straight, and totaled career-bests of 19 receptions for 238 yards and three touchdowns on the year, to rank third on the team in all three categories in 2022.

DEFFENSIVE NOTES DEFENSE REBOOT

New Defensive Coordinator Todd Orlando and Defensive Line Coach Kevin Patrick (a member of USF's first coaching staff now in his third stint at USF) will help lead a group looking to turnaround a USF defense <u>ranked 130th nationally</u> in scoring and 131st (last) in total defense <u>last year giving up 41.17 ppg and 516 ypg.</u> Orlando has 18 years of experience as a defensive coordinator and recently led successful defenses at Texas and Houston. Patrick was an All-American defensive lineman at Miami and led the Bulls out of the tunnel in the program's very first game, played at the old Tampa Stadium in 1997.

■ USF has not ranked above 71st in total defense or 75th in scoring defense since the 2017 season when the Bulls went 10-2 and ranked 37th in total (359.8 ypg) and 41st in scoring (23.5). The Bulls' average rank in the proceeding five years has been 104th in total defense and 107th in scoring defense.

■ BULLS VS. TIDE: USF's new defense turned in one of the top defensive performances in years in a 17-3 loss to No. 10 Alabama. For the second straight game, USF posted four or more sacks, logging five, the most since 2019, and Bama's 17 points were its fewest in a win since 2016 and fewest in a regular season non-conference game since 2007. The Tide had three at the half, the fewest since a 2021 game at Auburn. The Tide's 82.56 pass efficiency rating was its lowest since 2009 and USF forced UA to go 5-of-15 on third down and punt eight times. Alabama was 42-0 vs. regular season non-autonomy league opponents entering the game with an average margin of victory of 40 points and just two games decided by fewer than 24 points. The Tide scored at least 31 in all but one of the previous games. USF held the Tide to 310 yards, its lowest offensive production since posting 300 yards vs. Mississippi State on Oct. 22 of last year.

DEFENSE RISING

USF's new defense under coordinator Todd Orlando featured six new starters and six transfers in its debut at WKU.

- It forced six three-and-outs on 14 WKU possessions, including three in a row late in the second half as USF rallied.

USF ATHLETICS EXTENDS PROGRAM RECORD TO 17 STRAIGHT SEMESTERS WITH A DEPARTMENT TERM GPA OVER 3.0

University of South Florida student-athletes extended USF Athletics' record streak of department grade-point averages over 3.0 to 17 consecutive semesters and more than eight years (since the spring of 2015) after the recently completed 2023 spring term.

- 2023 Spring Academic Success USF saw 263 student-athletes earn Athletics Honor Roll recognition following the spring semester and 15 of 17 programs post a semester GPA over 3.0, as USF Athletics' overall GPA for nearly 500 student-athletes for the spring term checked in at 3.13.
- USF also saw 15 of 17 programs maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better and the cumulative GPA for Athletics held firm at 3.18.
- Over 67 percent of USF student-athletes earned a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher following the 2023 spring term, while 148 had over a 3.5 and 11 maintained a 4.0.

The Bay area has staked a claim as the epicenter of championshsip sports teams in recent years. Home to four professional sports organizations, including the MLB Rays, NHL Lightning, NFL Buccanneers and USL Rowdies. All have had outstanding championship seasons in the last three years, making celebratory boat parades on the Hillsborough River in downtown Tampa a common occurrence...

- Since 2020, the Bay Area has claimed a Super Bowl Champion, two Stanley Cups, an American League Pennant and a USL Conference Championship.
- The Tampa Bay Lightning repeated as Stanley Cup champions in 2021, downing the Montreal Canadiens (4-1) in the Stanley Cup Finals. The Lightning also won the Cup in 2020 and back in 2004. They reached the Stanley Cup finals in three straight years: 2020, 2021 and 2022.
- The Tampa Bay Buccaneers acquired sure Hall of Fame players Tom Brady and Rob Gronkowski prior to the 2020 season and went on to down the Kansas City Chiefs (31-9) to win Super Bowl 55 in Raymond James Stadium. The Buccaneers became the first team in NFL history to play in and win a Super Bowl that was held at its home stadium. The Bucs also won a Super Bowl in 2002.
- The Tampa Bay Rays posted 100 wins and had the best record in the American League. They won pennant and reached the 2020 World Series, falling to the Los Angeles Dodgers in six games. The Rays also reached the 2008 World Series. The Rays established ace is former USF pitcher Shane McClanahan.
- The Tampa Bay Rowdies soccer team won its conference and reached the USL Championship final in 2020 and again in 2021.

KELLY UNVEILS VISION FOR ATHLETIC DISTRICT EXPANSION

Vice President of Athletics Michael Kelly announced the university's vision and commitment to continuing to provide an unparalleled student-athlete and unique fan experiences outlined in a Facilities Master Plan that includes additions and enhancements of facilities for all varsity athletic sports programs.

The vision for the future development of the USF Athletics district includes facility investments that have already been achieved in the last year, conceptual plans for many facilities currently in development, and highlights future initiatives in the beginning planning stages that will continue to evolve.

- Many facility enhancements that are part of the plan have already been achieved in the last year or are nearing completion within the next year. These include a \$22-million Indoor Performance Facility opened in spring of 2023; a \$3-million football locker room and office renovation completed in summer 2022, a \$2-million television broadcast facility completed in 2020, a \$1-million resurfacing of the running surface at the USF Track & Field Stadium, installation of new hydrotherapy pools in the Lee Roy Selmon Center, and \$1.2-million in enhancements to The Corral for USF volleyball that include a new Taraflex floor, bleachers, nutrition bar, videoboard and roof, new field turf installed at the USF Baseball Stadium and overhaul of the USF golf practice facility.
- New facility additions included in the plan include the addition of a \$340-million, 35,000-seat on-campus football and lacrosse stadium by the 2026 season, a baseball and softball clubhouse, a new tennis facility, and USF Track & Field Stadium additions of a new press box and video board. Plans for the recently announced Beach Volleyball program include building a new facility adjacent to the Yuengling Center and providing renovated coaches' offices and a locker room. Women's lacrosse will utilize a new locker room and coaches' offices in the Lee Roy Senon Center and will begin play in Corbett Stadium before moving into the on-campus stadium. All athletics facilities are also undergoing a repainting to update the USF brand, with track and soccer facilities completed as of September 2023.
- Current facilities also slated for enhancement include the Lee Roy Selmon Athletics Center which will include a complete renovation of the entrance lobby and Corbett Soccer Stadium.

USF FOOTBALL FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS

LOCKER ROOM & STAFF OFFICES

Entering the 2021 season, USF completed a <u>\$3.3 million</u> upgrade to its current football facilities, including:

- A completely renovated locker room featuring: 120 lockers, state of the art digital lighting and surround sound system, a team lounge with two 86" big screen TVs, video game console, pool table, ping-pong table and furnishings, a nutrition fueling station, new LED graphics and 55" monitors throughout.
- New entry ways, graphics and carpeting throughout the operations area.
- New team room graphics and chairs.
- Renovated coaches offices and staff rooms with new furniture, graphics and carpeting.

INDOOR PERFORMANCE FACILITY

USF completed an 88,000-square foot indoor facility at a cost of approximately \$22 million in 2022. It features a 100-yard turf field, climate control, sound system, branded lobby and observation deck. The Bulls began practicing in the facility on Nov. 9, 2022.

ON CAMPUS STADIUM/FOOTBALL CENTER

The USF Board of Trustees has approved \$340 million to build on on-campus stadium – which will also house a football operations and women's lacrosse operations center – that will serve as a new home for USF football with coaches offices, meeting spaces, weight room, locker room, training and equipment areas and player lounge among the amenities. The stadium, which is slated for a capacity of 35,000, is targeted for completion in 2026.

WHIRLPOOL COLD TUBS

USF renovated its whirlpool and cold tub room with three new high tech pools for rehabilition and a rebrand of the room in the spring of 2023.

WEIGHT ROOM

In ths summer of 2023, USF unveiled a complete overhaul of the weight room in the Lee Roy Selmon Center at a cost of just under <u>\$1 million</u>. The project included all new Sorenex weight racks and equipment, branded weights and lift pads, LED lights and a large screen TV and a complete rebrand of the weight room and nutrition bar.

CA'S FASTEST RISING U

In June, the University of South Florida accepted an invitation to join the Association of American Universities (AAU) becoming the first public university in Florida to be invited to join the AAU in nearly 40 years and is now one of only two institutions from the State University System of Florida to serve as an AAU member (joining Florida and fellow 2023 invitee Miami). USF is one of the youngest institutions to be welcomed into the AAU. Of the association's now 71 members (which include the likes of Harvard, Yale, MIT, Stanford, Princeton, Florida, UCLA, Ohio State and Michigan), USF is the fifth youngest and one of only six AAU universities to be founded after 1950.

- USF is currently ranked in its highest position ever by U.S. News & World Report at No. 42 among all public universities. Over the past decade USF has jumped 52 spots and continues to have its sights set on becoming a top 25 public university in America.

TALKING ATTENDANCE

- 65,138 SEE BULLS PLAY BAMA IN RAY JAY: The Raymond James Stadium attendance of 65,138 (which included more than 10,000 students) on Sept. 16 to see USF take on No. 10 Alabama ranks as the fifth-largest in USF history and the largest since a record crowd of 69,383 watched USF take on No. 4 Florida State in 2012.
- It was the 15th home game over 50K and 22nd over 45K.
- USF currently ranks 40th in the nation in average home attendance at 50,817.
- LAST 5 YEARS: According to a study by College Football News, USF ranks 65th over the last five seasons (2018-22) in home attendance averaging 27,729 fans per game despite going 15-43 over that span. 
USF PLAYERS HAIL FROM 16 STATES & 2 COUNTRIES

While USF has focused recruiting the state of Florida and particularly the Bay area and its seven surrounding counties, Head Coach Alex Golesh has expanded USF's recruiting reach to 16 states and two countries.

■ 68 of the players on USF's roster hail from the state of Florida. That represents 58 percent of the roster with Georgia (12), Texas (8), California (4) and New Jersey (4) being the next closest states in producing current Bulls.

USF VS. ALABAMA DRAWS 5 MILLION VIEWERS ON ABC

USF's battle with No. 10 Alabama drew more than five million viewers on ABC, making it one of the most watched games in USF history alongside the 5.36 million viewers that tuned in to see an epic War on I-4 battle at UCF in 2017.

■ The USF-Alabama game drew a 2.0 rating, making it the highest rated game in the noon or afternoon windows nationally in Week 3, out-performing other notable games as Pitt-West Virginia (1.3) and Florida State-Boston College (1.8). The game rated as the fourth-most watched on the day, just barely getting eclipsed by the primetime Florida-Tennessee (2.3) game and behind other evening broadcasts of Georgia-South Carolina (3.1) and Colorado-Colorado State (4.1). The Bulls-Bama game audience was a 186-percent increase over the Ole Miss-Georgia Tech game played in the same time slot in Week 3 last year.

■ Not including the stand-alone Army-Navy Game in December, the American Athletic Conference has had six regular season games draw 5 million-plus viewers in its 11 seasons,

NOTABLES

TEAM:

- Head Coach Alex Golesh recorded his first career victory and became the fifth USF head coach to win their home debut.
- USF ended a 19-game road losing streak, 13 in AAC play, marking its first road win since a 45-20 victory at ECU on Oct. 26, 2019 with a 44-30 win at Navy (9.30). The Bulls trailed 14-0 in the game after six minutes but outscored Navy 44-9, with a pair of 21-point runs, over the next 44 minutes.
- USF improved to 2-0 in AAC play for the first time since starting 3-0, part of a 7-0 start overall. in 2018.
- Alex Golesh became the fourth USF head coach to start their career 2-0 in conference play, joining Charlie Strong (4-0, 2017, AAC), Willie Taggart (2-0, 2013, AAC) and Jim Leavitt (2-0, 2003, C-USA).
- USF won its conference opener for the first time in five years dating to a Sept. 22, 2018 victory over ECU to open the 2018 conference season.
- USF won its first game over and FBS opponent since defeating Temple (34-14) on Oct. 23, 2021 in Raymond James Stadium, ending a string of 18 straight losses vs. FBS foes.
- USF snapped a 10-game FAMU winning streak and ended an 11-game losing skid for the Bulls dating to last September.
- First starts for USF in Game 1: 13 total first time USF starters 8 first-year transfers, 13 transfers overall started Game 1
- **OFF (6):** 6 WR Naiem Simmons, 18 TE Weston Wolff, 70 RT RJ Perry, 51 RG Zane Herring, 75 LG Andrew Kilfoyl,

OFFENSE:

- In the first game of the Alex Golesh Era at USF, the Bulls took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards in 3:24 for a touchdown, capped by a QB Byrum Brown 4-yard run.
- vs FAMU QB Byrum Brown accounted for five total touchdowns on the night, running for two and passing for three. Through his first four career starts, Brown has accounted for 15 total touchdowns, eight passing and seven rushing.
- vs FAMU WR Naiem Simmons 31-yard TD catch from Byrum Brown in the fourth quarter was his first touchdown as a Bull. He finished with three catches for 59 yards.
- vs FAMU WR Sean Atkins 39-yard pass to RB Michel Dukes on a double-pass trick play was his first career completion. Atkins led the Bulls with five receptions for 57 yards on the night.
- at WKU, USF gained 374 yards rushing, the eighth-best total in program history, and had two 100-yard rushers as USF tallied 540 total yards to outgain WKU (465). The offensive output marked USF's first 500-yard game since 2021 and best since posting 526 yards and 421 rushing yards vs. Temple on Oct. 23, 2021.
- USF ran 95 offensive plays and 100 total at WKU, by far its most since running 94 vs. Temple in 2021. <u>USF leads the nation in plays per game</u>, ahead of California (95), Washington State (90) and Tennessee (86).
- QB Byrum Brown's 84-yard TD pass to Khafre Brown at WKU tied for the sixth-longest pass play in program history. It is the longest since Gerry Bohanon hit Jimmy Horn Jr. for a 91-yard TD vs. ECU in 2022.
- USF's 597 yards of total offense vs. Rice rank tied for 11th all-time in program history and are the most since posting 646 yards in a 58-46 loss to UCF in Tampa in 2020.
- USF posted a season-best 12 explosive plays vs. Rice, including five plays of 42 yards or better between quarterback Byrum Brown and wide receiver Naiem Simmons.

■ WR Sean Atkins 88-yard touchdown catch at Navy marked the fourth longest in program history and the longest since Quinton Flowers hit current Kansas City Chief Marquez Valdes-Scantling for a 95-yard touchdown at UConn in 2017. The play put Atkins over 100-yards for the second time on his career early in the second quarter.

DEFENSE

- USF held Rice to one rushing yard for the game, the sixth-lowest total for a USF opponent in program history and the lowest since holding Temple to -4 yards rushing in 2017.
- ws Alabama the USF defense recorded four or more sacks for the second straight game. The Bulls five on the night were their most since posting 6 vs. BYU Oct. 12, 2019. USF now has 9 quarterback sacks on the year. The Bulls totaled 14 in 12 games last season.
- Alabama crossed the 50 for the first time with 4:19 to play in the second quarter, when Byrum Brown was sacked by Dallas Turner and fumbled. James Smith recovered for the Tide at the USE 25
- vs FAMU USF forced five FAMU turnovers and did not commit a turnover a week after losing the turnover battle 0-3 at WKU. It marked USF's most turnovers forced in a game since getting 8 vs. SC State on 9/14/19
- vs FAMU The Bulls three interceptions in the game were their most since getting three vs. Cincinnati on 10/3/20
- vs FAMU USF logged three sacks and 12.0 tackles for loss while allowing FAMU just 19 yards rushing. It was the Bulls most sacks since posting 4 vs. Tulane in 2022 and most tackles for loss since posting 13.0 vs. BYU on 10/12/2019.
- vs FAMU S Logan Berryhill recorded his first career interception in the first quarter on a deep throw over the middle, one play after being called for pass interference. Then with 2:08 left to play in the fourth quarter, he made his second career interception, sealing the win for IISE
- Berryhill's two interception game was the first for a USF player since Deatrick Nichols grabbed two vs. Temple on 9/12/17
- The defense forced six three-and-outs and a turnover on downs against a WKU offense that ranked No. 7 in the nation last year. The Bulls forced a punt or turnover on downs in four plays our less on four of WKU's first five possessions.

VS. NO. 10 ALABAMA NOTABLES: Sept. 16, 2023 • Tampa, Fla. • Alabama Won. 17-3

- The game marked the first for Alabama since 2007 in which it failed to score 20 points against a non-Autonomy Five opponent. It's average margin of victory in those games was 40 points.
- Alabama crossed the 50 for the first time with 4:19 to play in the second quarter, when Byrum Brown was sacked by Dallas Turner and fumbled. James Smith recovered for the Tide at the USF 25.
- In the first half, the USF defense held Alabama to 3 points and forced five punts while allowing just 113 yards in the first half. It was the first time Alabama had been held to 3 points or less since a 24-22 (trailed 0-7 at the half), four overtime win at Auburn on Nov. 27, 2021.

PRESEASON All-AAC: Athlon sports named five Bulls to its preseason All-AAC teams.

- Offensive tackle **Donovan Jennings** earned second-team offense recognition for the second-straight year as he returns from an injury that ended his 2022 campaign after four games. The sixth-year senior earned Athlon All-Conference honors in 2021 and has blocked for two 1,000-yard rushers while starting 35 games on his career to date.
- Linebacker **DJ Gordon** was named to the third-team defense after starting nine games in 2022 and finishing second on the team with 67 tackles and third with 6.5 tackles for loss. He had a season-best 11 tackles and a tackle for loss vs. ECU last season.
- Florida transfer running back **Nay¹Quan Wright** was named to the fourth-team offense. He comes to USF after earning his degree at Florida and running for 753 yards and five touchdowns while catching 35 passes for 415 yards and a touchdown for the Gators.
- Returning defensive end **Jason Vaughn** and defensive back **Aamaris Brown** earned fourth-team defense recognition. Vaughn is coming off a break-out year in which he led the team with 8.5 tackles for loss and five sacks while posting 35 tackles (second among defensive linemen). Brown made a big impact in his first season with the Bulls in 2022, earning All-AAC fourth-team honors from Phil Steele after starting 11 games and leading the team with two interceptions and five pass break-ups while posting 27 tackles.

HEAD COACH ALEX GOLESH

1st Season at USF/1st Season Overall

Ohio State, 2006

The son of Russian immigrant parents who worked his way through the collegiate coaching ranks with a blue-collar work ethic that helped to generate major turnarounds at four programs, Alex Golesh was named the sixth head coach in USF football history on Dec. 4, 2022.

- ▶ In 20 seasons of collegiate coaching, Golesh worked his way up through the collegiate ranks while serving on the staffs of eight FBS programs and was a key recruiter at several of those stops, helping to lead program turnarounds at Tennessee, lowa State, Illinois and Toledo
- ▶ In each of his three seasons as an offensive coordinator prior to arriving at USF, Golesh's offenses finished in the top 10 in scoring offense and total offense in FBS football each year.

NOTABLES

TENNESSEE OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

- ▶ 2022 Broyles Award finalist and 247 Sports Offensive Coordinator of the Year
- ▶ Came to USF as a nationally recognized recruiter and play-caller for the nation's highestscoring and most-explosive offense, having served two seasons as offensive coordinator/ tight ends coach at the University of Tennessee (2021 & 2022).
- ▶ He helped propel the Vols from three wins (3-7) the season before his arrival to 10 wins and a No. 6 College Football Playoff ranking in 2022. Golesh implemented a tempo-based offense at UT that led to dramatic improvement, shattered Vols' records and saw UT rank No. 1 in the nation in scoring (47.33), yards per game (538.1), points per possession (3.24) and yards per play (7.35) in 2022.
- ▶ Took Tennessee offense from No. 108 before his arrival to No. 7 (2021) to No. 1 (2022)
- ▶ His first Tennessee offense shattered eight team single-season records, including points (511), total offensive yards (6,174), touchdowns (67) and passing efficiency (167.10), and has surpassed all those marks again in 2022 with games remaining.
- ▶ Tennessee was the only team to average over 300 yards passing and 200 yards rushing on the 2022 season, and had scored 40-plus points in 15 of its 25 games since his arrival.
- ▶ Quarterback Hendon Hooker shattered Tennessee single-season records for completion percentage (68.0) and passing efficiency (181.41) in 2021 and surpassed the completion percentage mark in 2022 (69.6) while becoming a Maxwell Award finalist as the top player in college football. He threw for 3,135 yards and 27 touchdowns and ran for 430 yards and five touchdowns to close within 224 yards of Peyton Manning's school season total offense record (3,789) before suffering an injury in the Vols' 11th game that ended his 2022 season.
- ▶ Tennessee's Jalin Hyatt became the first Tennessee player ever to win the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's top receiver in 2022 as he is tied for the lead in FBS football in receiving touchdowns (15) and ranked third with 1,267 yards (18.91 ypc) on 67 catches in 2022.

IOWA STATE

- ▶ Served as tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator for head coach Matt Campbell's first four seasons at lowa State (2016-19) where he helped secure and develop the talent that led the Cyclones to a turnaround from a 3-9 season before their arrival to a run of five-straight bowl games (of which he was part of three) and an eventual 9-3, Fiesta Bowl season the year after his departure.
- ▶ Golesh helped secure the four highest-ranked recruiting classes in program history, with all four ranking in the top 50 and two in the top 40.

ILLINOIS

▶ While serving as a position coach (tight ends/running backs) and recruiting coordinator for four seasons at Illinois (2012-15), he helped the program go from two wins in his first season to back-to-back bowl games in his last two, and as tight ends coach/recruiting coordinator

TOLEDO

- ▶ At Toledo (2009-11) he helped lead the Rockets from a 3-9 mark before his arrival to 8-5 and 9-4 campaigns in his last two years. Golesh aided the Toledo program in securing the No. 1 recruiting class in the Mid-American Conference in consecutive years (2010 & 2011) according to Rivals.com.
- ▶ Golesh also has coaching experience in the state of Florida, serving for one season as co-offensive coordinator/tight ends coach at UCF (2020) with Josh Heupel, where the Knights ranked second in FBS football in total offense (568.1), fourth in passing offense (357.4), seventh in total passing yards (3,574) and eighth in scoring offense (42.2).

BOWLING GREEN, KY. – The Bulls opened the 2023 USF Football Season presented by Tampa General Hospital, the first under first-time head coach Alex Golesh, with a hard-fought 41-24 loss at Conference USA preseason favorite Western Kentucky Saturday in Bowling Green, Ky.

The Bulls led 14-7 after the first quarter and tied the game at 24 with 10:11 to play in the third, but saw three turnovers derail an opportunity for the first season-opening win since 2020

Western Kentucky, a team that won nine games last year and sported the top returning passer and receiver by yards in the FBS from 2022, used a 51-yard touchdown pass, a 42-yard field goal and a scoop and score off a quarterback sack to score the last 17 points and secure the home victory.


USF's fast-tempo offense racked up 540 yards, including 374 and two 100-yard rushers on the ground, but couldn't overcome costly turnovers, including an interception in the end-zone after driving to the WKU 4 early in the fourth quarter. Sophomore quarterback Byrum Brown ran for 160 yards and two touchdowns and Florida transfer Nay'Quan Wright added a career-best 111 yards on 17 carries. Brown went 15-of-34 for 166 yards and a touchdown through the air, but also tossed two interceptions. Khafre Brown caught an 84-yard touchdown pass and totaled 95 yards on three catches while Sean Atkins had a team-high five catches for 43 yards.

The USF defense showed improvement over last year, forcing six three-and-outs and a turnover on downs against a potent WKU offense that ranked No. 7 nationally last year. Defensive backs Daquan Evans and Jaelen Stokes and linebacker DJ Gordon led the Bulls with five tackles each.

USF opened the Golesh era in impressive fashion, taking the opening kickoff and using three minutes and 24 seconds to drive 75 yards for a touchdown on Brown's four-yard run.

- 540-465, USF outgained WKU on the day
- 3-0, USF had three turnovers, including one after driving to the WKU 4 and one returned for a touchdown, while WKU did not turn the ball over.
- 374, USF gained 374 yards rushing, the eighth-best total in program history, and had two 100-yard rushers.
- QB Byrum Brown ran 25 times for 160 yards, the fourth-best total by a quarterback in program history. The top three totals are all owned by Quinton Flowers.

Tampa, Fla. - USF posted its first win under first-year head coach Alex Golesh in Raymond James Stadium as the Bulls downed Florida A&M, 38-24, in front of 36,495 fans. The Bulls won their home-opener for the first time since 2020 and Golesh became the fifth USF head coach to win their home debut. In doing so, USF snapped a 10-game winning streak for FAMU, which has posted back-to-back nine-win seasons. After losing the turnover and sack battle in the season-opener at Western Kentucky, South Florida turned the tables forcing three turnovers in the first quarter alone and harassing FAMU quarterback Jeremy Moussa with a variety of blitz packages all night. The Bulls ended the game having forced five turnovers forced and recording four sacks while committing no turnovers themselves. In the first quarter, safeties Logan Berryhill and Jaelen Stokes both recorded their first career interceptions and linebacker Jamie Pettway forced a fumble on a kickoff that was recovered by Mac Harris. Berryhill got another interception in the second half and D.J. Harris recovered a fumble forced by Jhalyn Shuler. Quarterback Byrum Brown recorded his first victory as a starter, scoring five touchdowns on the night - two rushing and three passing. Brown completed 20-of-34 passes for 197 yards and added 23 yards rushing. Sean Atkins lead the Bulls with five catches for 57 yards, while Naiem Simmons made three catches for 59 yards, including a 31-yard touchdown. Linebacker DJ Gordon led the Bulls with seven tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss as USF held FAMU to 19 yards rushing and recorded 12 tackles for loss. FAMU closed a 10-point Bulls halftime lead to 7 with a field goal on their first possession of the second half, but Brown extended the Bulls lead to 31-17 three possessions later when he capped a 53-yard drive with a 13-yard touchdown run, his second of the night. After forcing a punt on the Bulls' next possession, FAMU struck back early in the fourth quarter when Jeremy Moussa hit Kelvin Dean with 45-yard touchdown pass on a third-and-11 play to get back within a touchdown and trail 31-24 with 10:04 to play. The Bulls responded quickly when Brown hit Naiem Simmons streaking up the left sideline for a 31-yard touchdown with 7:39 to play to make it 38-24.

- USF forced five FAMU turnovers while not committing a turnover on the night.
- The Bulls recorded four sacks and 12 tackles for loss while holding FAMU to 19 yards
- The teams combined for 26 penalties in the three hour and 42-minute game.
- S Logan Berryhill got two interceptions on the night, marking the first for his career after moving from safety to wide receiver.

GAME 3: #10 ALABAMA 17, USF 3

TAMPA, FLA. - USF (1-2) gave No. 10 Alabama (2-1) all it wanted in a one-score game in the final minutes before falling, 17-3, in front of a national television audience on ABC and 65,138 fans in Raymond James Stadium. The Bulls defense played its strongest game in years recording five sacks, its most since 2019, forcing eight punts and holding the Crimson Tide to 310 yards, their fewest since playing Mississippi State last season. Safety Daquan Evans had a career day with totals of eight tackles, four tackles for loss and three sacks to lead an aggressive Bulls effort that also saw linebacker Jhalyn Shuler (11), safety Jaelen Stokes (8) and safety Logan Berryhill (7) post career-best totals in tackles. Quarterback Byrum Brown nearly posted his third career 100-yard rushing game before finishing with 92 yards on 23 carries to lead USF. Running back Nay'Quan Wright added 62 yards on the ground and a crushing run that flattened an Alabama defender early and set the tone for the Bulls. USF led 3-0 for most of the first half before Alabama tied it with 2:10 to play in the second quarter. The Bulls were down a touchdown with 8:47 to play and drove to the Alabama 41 when Brown hit Sean Atkins with a 15-yard pass. But, on the next play, Brown's deep ball was intercepted in the endzone by Malachi Moore. Alabama took over on its 20 and marched 80 yards in 11 plays, all runs, to seal the win with a 1-yard run by quarterback Ty Simpson with 33 seconds to play. With the game tied at three going into the second half, the Bulls took the kickoff, drove to midfield and went for it on fourth down. They came up short, but the defense rose again, stuffing Alabama and forcing a punt when Stokes sacked Simpson on third down. The USF offense still was unable to sustain a scoring drive against a huge Tide defense and Alabama took the lead, 10-3, with an 84-yard, six play drive highlighted by a 45-yard completion deep over the middle to tight end CJ Dippre. USF responded on its next possession as a 31-yard Brown run got the Bulls to the Alabama 29. On 4th-and-two at the 21, USF went for it again and came up short on a Brown keeper. The aggressive Bulls, looking for their first top 10 upset since 2007, ended the night 2-of-6 on fourth down attempts. In the first half, The Bulls capitalized on Alabama fumbling an end-over-end Andrew Stokes punt that was pounced on and recovered by D.J. Harris on the Alabama 30. USF moved four yards before John Cannon knocked through a career-long 44-yard field goal to give the Bulls a 3-0 lead with 7:08 to play in the first quarter.

■ For the second straight game, the USF defense recorded four or more sacks. The Bulls five on the night were their most since posting 6 vs. BYU Oct. 12, 2019. USF now has 8 quarterback sacks on the year.

■ Attendance of 65,138 ranked as the fifth-largest in USF history.

TAMPA, FLA. - USF (2-2; 1-0 AAC) used an explosive offense and aggressive defense to open its 11th season of American Athletic Conference play with a 42-29 victory over Rice (2-2; 0-1 AAC) Saturday at Raymond James Stadium. USF recorded its first conference opening win in five seasons behind huge offensive performances by quarterback Byrum Brown and wide receiver Naiem Simmons. Defensively, 10 players recorded a tackle for loss, as the Bulls posted their second game of the year with double-digit tackles for loss and held Rice to 1 yard rushing, the lowest total for a USF opponent since 2017. Brown posted a career-high 435 yards passing, finishing 22-of-29 with two touchdowns and added 82 yards rushing and a touchdown to post the second-highest passing and total offense (517) marks in program history. Simmons posted a career-best eight catches and 272 receiving yards breaking the school record set by Tyre McCants with 227 yards at UCF in 2017. DJ Gordon led the Bulls' defensive effort with six tackles, 1.5 sacks and 2.0 tackles for loss. The teams went to half time with Rice leading 14-13 after a late score, but the Bulls pulled away late in the third quarter posting touchdown drives on three straight possessions. and the Bulls offense continued their momentum with a 59-yard bomb from Brown to wideout Khafre Brown, who made a one-handed snag and raced to the RU7. On 1st-and-two at the two-yard line, Nay'Quan Wright made an extra effort to score but fumbled the ball in the end zone. Rice recovered and averted a deeper deficit. The Owls took advantage of the touchback when Daniels threw an 80-yard touchdown pass to take back the lead 21-20 with 7:53 left in the third quarter. Refusing to hang their heads, Brown took the USF offense back on the field and found Simmons for a wide open 43-yard pass taking the Bulls on the RU39. But the Owls held up from there and forced USF to punt with 5:48 left in the third quarter. After the Bulls defense forced Rice to punt, Simmons walked in the end zone with a 49-yard dime from Brown to give USF a 27-21 lead. To start the fourth quarter, the Brown to Simmons connection remained unstoppable with another 52-yard-deep pass. On the next play, Brown found Atkins for an 8-yard touchdown to extend the lead to 34-21.

- USF held Rice to one rushing yard for the game, the sixth-lowest total for a USF opponent in program history and the lowest since holding Temple to -4 yards rushing in 2017.
- USF's 597 yards of total offense rank tied for 11th all-time in program history and are the most since posting 646 yards in a 58-46 loss to UCF in Tampa in 2020.

ANNAPOLIS, MD. - USF (3-2; 2-0 AAC) headed to Navy (1-3; 0-2 AAC) carrying a 19-game road losing streak and an 0-2 mark all-time in Annapolis, that changed with a 44-30 victory at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. USF improved to 2-0 in AAC play for the first time since starting 3-0 in 2018. The Bulls showed resilience and confidence, as early miscues saw Navy jump to a 14-0 lead, but the USF used 21-straight points to take a 23-20 lead to halftime and a 44-9 scoring run overall to put the game away. The Bulls out-gained Navy 435-330 on the day and forced the Midshipmen to go a combined 4-of-16 on third and fourth downs. The Midshipmen capitalized on turnovers, but the Bulls defense held them to just three drive over 40 yards, with one of those coming on Navy's final drive with the game well in hand. Quarterback Byrum Brown passed for 338 yards and three touchdowns, while Sean Atkins recorded his second career 100-yard game, getting there in the second quarter, posting four catches for 116 yards and two touchdowns, one of those an 88-yarder. Jaelen Stoke and Andrew Mata'Afa paced the Bulls defense with 10 tackles each, while defensive end Tramel Logan posted a touchdown on a scoop-and-score. Navy tied the game at 23 with a 44-yard field goal on its opening possession of the second half. The Bulls responded with an eight-play, 67-yard drive highlighted by a 35-yard Brown screen pass to Jaden Alexis and his beautiful 15-yard touchdown strike to Michael Brown-Stephens that gave the Bulls a 30-23 lead. The defense forced another Navy punt and the Bulls looked to close the door, but Weston Wolff fumbled after a Brown completion and Navy was back in business. The Middies drove to the USF17 before the Bulls defense rose up with three straight tackles for loss and forced a 44-yard field goal attempt that went wide right. On Navy's ensuing possession they drove to the USF28 and had a 3rd-and-1, but the snap was fumbled and Tramel Logan scooped it up and ran 70 yards for a touchdown that gave the Bulls a 37-23 lead with 14:50 to play. USF increased its lead to three touchdowns by using its fast-paced offense to go 74 yards in nine plays and taking a 44-23 lead on Michel Dukes 11-yard run. On the game's opening possession, the Bulls defense forced a three-and-out, but wind affected the Navy punt and Atkins was unable to corral it. Navy recovered near its own sideline at the USF18 and four plays later had a quick 7-0 lead. On the Bulls first offensive possession, they went for it on 4th-and-1 at their own 30 and Brown came up short. Again, four run plays later Navy punched in a touchdown to take a 14-0 lead just over six minutes into the game. ■ USF committed three turnovers in the game that resulted in 14 Navy points and kept the game closer than it may otherwise have been.

USF held Navy to 3-of-14 on third down.
